
Also remember December is when we have the Secret Pal Breakfast and Annual Guild Christmas Party.

SEPTEMBER 11 CHALLENGE QUILT

The GSAQG On-line group decided to have a challenge to use as a fund raiser with the profits from the project going to a fund related to our fight for freedom. Since it won't be done any earlier than February, we are leaving it open-ended as far as method of disposition and the charity involved. If everything is peaceful and quiet by then, certainly our local police and firefighters could benefit.

At the October meeting, forty-nine 11" x 12" pieces of patriotic fabric (flags with eagles) were handed out with simple directions: make a 12 1/2" square, no glue if appliqued, no Log Cabins (because of retreat 2002 project), and turn in no later than the January meeting.

I will have more kits available at the November meeting or send a SASE (long kind) to Amy Cottrell 27332 Autumn Glen, Boerne, TX 78006 to receive one,. if you can't make the meeting. For those who don't want to make a square, but want to help we are accepting contributions towards sashing, batting and backing. I donated the 7 yards of fabric we are using for the challenge.

There will be a prize for the "best" and/or "most original." It too will be open-ended depending what I see that's "neat" at the Houston Quilt Show. Thanks to your wonderful response in taking up this challenge.



President Betty Opiela called the meeting to order at approximately 7:05 p.m. Minutes were approved as written. Treasurer's report is as follows: Operating fund \$24,558.25; Reserve Balance \$34,779.89; Total \$59,338.14.

The Board discussed awarding Calico Roses to a number of deserving members during October and November. Motions were made by Ida, Rebecca and Larry to award Calico Roses to deserving members at the October and November Meeting. The motions were seconded by Rebecca, Garnette and Ida. All motions passed. The Board discussed the Guild Telephone. Larry Beauchamp will research further options for the phone line.

Harvest Basket 6 1/2" block

Basket color - Soft brown, rust, gold prints that look like basket.

Background color - light : gold, tan, beige, tone/tone prints- tan.

Pattern shows paper piecing; alternate pattern allows for an applique curved handle—sewn onto the piece before joining to the lower basket section.

In final assembly for a quilt, flowers or fruit could be added to the baskets.

Please pin a small paper with your name to each block—one entry for the drawing. (use labels or rubber stamp !!) Have fun! Let's have lots of blocks!

"Surprise Box" 6 1/2" block


Center square - Christmas print or panel (or applique)


Outer triangles -red / green alternating for A / B plain or tonal prints to project red & green.

Paper piecing is easy but requires A/B sections sewn before stitching to the center. Template piecing might be faster for this block.




ALTERNATE PATTERN (not to scale)
