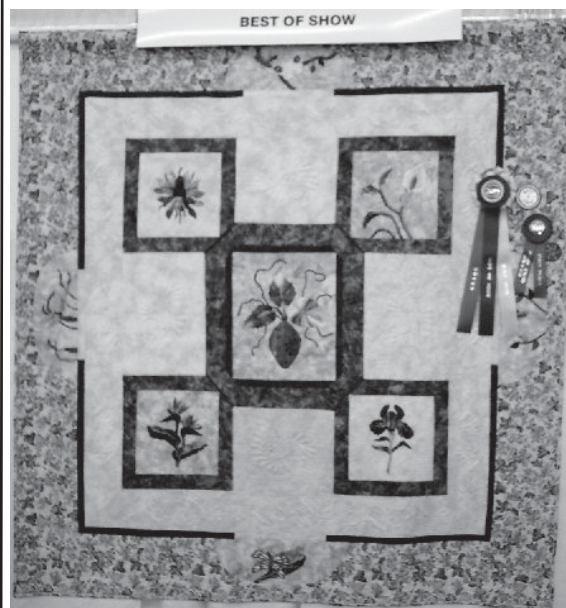

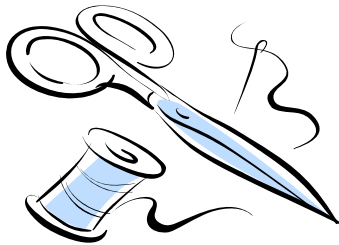

ELEANOR WRIGHT In Memoriam

Eleanor Wright, a decades-long member of the GSAQG, died in July at the age of 92 in her home filled with fabric, quilting patterns, sewing machines and thread. Many a quilter hopes for the same! Eleanor joined the guild in 1980, its inaugural year, and remained active until the turn of the 21st century. A dear friend of Ethel Howey, the two of them were often together at out-of-town quilt shows and workshops. Eleanor was an enthusiastic member of many bees, an inveterate quilt book collector and a lover of every quilt she saw.

No GSAQG quilt or garment show in the '80s and '90s could have taken place without her. She was the first to offer her hospitality to visiting judges and workshop leaders, the first to volunteer for committee work and the most elegant model in garment show history. Every event chair could depend on her quiet and efficient support.

In the last years of her life, despite failing eyesight and mobility, she continued to piece crazy quilt blocks to be sure that each member of her extended family had a piece of her heart.

At her request, her vast collection of fabric and quilting supplies was donated to those in need of warmth and compassion. Some of her quilting estate has been sold with the funds going to a scholarship for a fellow quilter to attend a workshop advancing the art of quilting. She would be pleased.

At the September meeting 27 quilts and 10 totes were turned in. Thank you to everyone, I know that time is particularly precious just before the quilt show. By the time you're reading this they'll already be at the San Antonio Children's Shelter.

I'm hoping to have a speaker from the San Antonio Children's Shelter at the October meeting to give us feedback about the shelter and the impact of Bright Hopes.

After the guild meeting I'm going have a kit party. I need volunteers to help package quilt tops/bags/batts into individual kits to be checked out, completed, and returned by other volunteers. We always include tying thread with the kits, but a great many quilts come back machine quilted - it's a great way to test out a new long arm or practice machine quilting. The focus this party will be on packaging quilts but I will bring some tote fabric as well.

If you plan to join us please bring your own scissors and rotary cutter - I'll provide cutting mats and rulers, an iron and ironing board and a couple of extension cords. Of course, if you plan to sew you'll need to bring your own machine. I'll bring a small tub of thread. We'll need a few sewing machines to finish quilts that were long-armed at the quilt show, these quilts will simply need back to front bindings.

Please join us, it is a a nice way to meet with other supporters for this project and I've a bit of a party planned. Check out the guild's website, Community Outreach has a section about Bright Hopes, it says we're twenty years old this year!

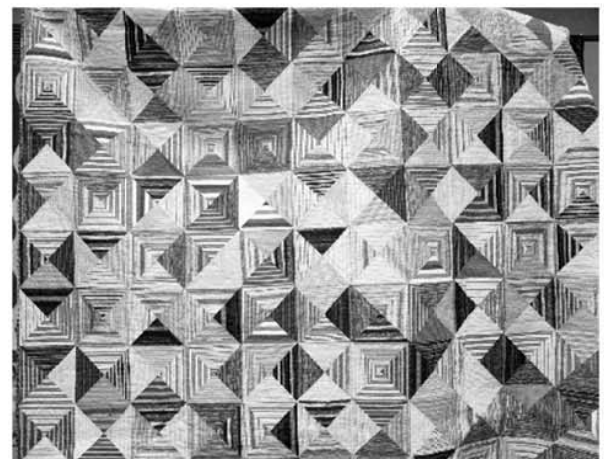

GREATER SAN ANTONIO QUILT GUILD, INC. ETHEL Y. HOWEY GRANT PROGRAM

MISSION

The Greater San Antonio Quilt Guild has established a grant program in honor of a loved and esteemed founding member, Ethel Y. Howey, whose accomplishments and influence extended into the international quilt world. The grant is to encourage the pursuit of education in the study of quilt making and to recognize the importance of quilting in today's society as an art form, as an instrument of healing, as part of our legacy, and as a common thread which binds all in friendship.

PURPOSE

The purpose of the grant program is to fund projects that will have long term impact on preserving the heritage and further the art of quilt making. The grant may be used to cover expenses such as fees (including conferences, workshops, etc.), travel, lodging, meals, materials and books. The grant(s) will be awarded annually, not to exceed \$1000.

ELIGIBILITY

- Applicant must be an active GSAQG member in good standing for the previous two
- (2) years immediately preceding the grant deadline.
- An applicant must show evidence of an interest in continuing to improve and innovate in the field of quilt design, construction, history or technique.
- Financial need will not be a criterion for selection.
- Recipients must be willing and able to share with GSAQG the new skills, techniques, or information gained. This may be in the form of a presentation, a workshop or other process that disseminates the information to the members.
- Recipient must submit in writing a final report of the project and expenses by March 1 of the following year.
- If recipient fails to fulfill requirements any advanced funds must be returned.
- Grant recipients are ineligible to reapply for grants for three years. Grant committee members are ineligible for grants while serving on the committee.

PROCEDURES AND DEADLINES

Applications must be submitted on or before November 1 (current year), and the grant will be awarded at the following January guild meeting. The grant recipient's final report is due by March 1 of the year **after** the grant is awarded.

Duties of Officers



The President Pro Tempore shall:

1. serve as the presiding officer in the absence of the President;
2. in the event of disability or resignation of the President, serve as President for the remainder of the unexpired term;
3. be bonded and be a secondary authorized signatory on all accounts and take care of other financial matters in cooperation with the Treasurer in the absence of the President;
4. perform other duties as directed by the Executive Board, or as may be incident to this office.

The First Vice President for Special Events shall:

1. coordinate special events;
2. obtain the chairman's final report of the all special events sponsored by the Guild, in a timely manner;
3. be authorized to sign contracts pertaining to special events;
4. perform other duties as directed by the Executive Board, or as may be incident to this office.



The Third Vice President for Programs shall:

1. provide programs for each business meeting;
2. schedule and coordinate periodic workshops;
3. be authorized to sign contracts pertaining to programs and workshops;
3. perform other duties as directed by the Executive Board, or as may be incident to this office.



The Treasurer shall:

1. have custody of all Guild funds;
2. be bonded and be the primary authorized signatory on all Guild accounts;
3. deposit in the general fund all monies received from all committee activities;
4. keep an accurate account of all monies received and disbursed;
5. disburse money for approved budgeted items upon receipt of invoice or other documentation from the person responsible for the budget item;
6. present a financial report at each Executive Board and at each business meeting;
7. present a proposed budget to the Executive Board at their October meeting.
8. prepare an annual financial report for the February Executive Board meeting for submission to a certified public accountant for preparation of the annual tax return;
8. perform other duties as directed by the Executive Board, or as may be incident to this office.

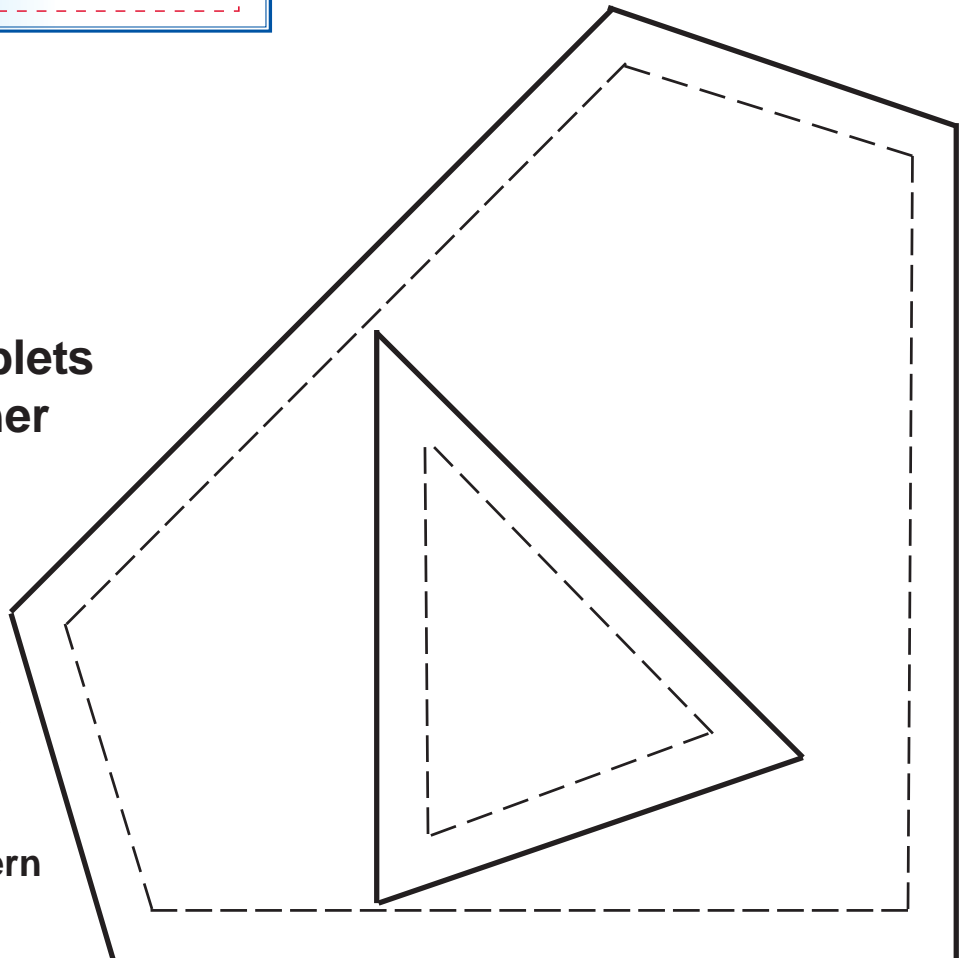

The **Turkey Giblets** block first appeared in Nancy Cabot's syndicated newspaper column in 1938. The design works well when stitched in two contrasting colors. Let's do browns and oranges.
