A very special thanks to Ellen Hernandez for her presentation, Quilt History: Past, Present and Future. Makes me want to get all my quilts documented especially Grandma McCloskey's. Ellen's presentation was a wonderful example of the fruits of the Ethel Howey Grant.

Listening to the Community Outreach committees presentation made me much more aware of the Guild's community presence. Bright Hopes with 40 plus quilts given to children per month, wrapping them in warmth and love. Each year 8-10,000 children in our local schools have a quilt related book read to them and have an opportunity to see the quilt. The Story Book Quilt program was started by Ruth Felty in 1995 with 10 books and now its grown to 47 books and quilts with more added all the time.

Yes, we are a very busy group but more is being asked of you. Doris Patterson has been responsible for the Memorial Quilt for the past 2 years and is now ready to pass the quilt and responsibilities on to a willing Guild member.

The Memorial Quilt was conceptualized in 2005 by Amy Cottrell and Lani Nunely. The plan was for a friend of the deceased Guild member to make an 8 in. block commemorating their life. There has not always been a Guild friend to step forward so Doris and Valerie Arcement have made several of the blocks. There was a lot of interest in the displayed Memorial Quilt at the February Guild meeting. Please, someone, a Bee, or group of friends step forward to help continue the tradition of the Memorial Quilt.



A Calico Rose was awarded to Kris Thomson for her 10 years of service as the Winter Retreat Chairperson.

A Rose Bud was awarded to Glenda Harris for creating 8 totes for Story Book Quilts.

A request was made for a volunteer to take over the responsibility of the Memorial Quilt. Doris Patterson is retiring from this post.

A request was made for guild members to respect other people's privacy regarding email usage. The guild directory information is for members use only and is not meant to be shared over the internet without permission from the individuals.

President Pro Tem: Larry Beauchamp - No report.

Secretary: Donna Brown - No report.

Treasurer: Karen Nanos read the Monthly Fund Balance Report into the meeting minutes. (See Board Meeting Minutes for figures.)

1st V.P. for Special Events: Gail Daniel announced that tickets for the 2009 GSAQG Quilt Show are available to check out & sell. Pins are available for \$5.00. Lori Branson announce that she is still taking deposits for the Summer Retreat in June 2009.

2nd V.P for Newsletter - Dea Jae Shore

stated that 2009 GSAQG Member Directory should be completed by the end of this month.

Barbara Wofford mentioned that the Quilter's Point Newsletter Ad is good until the end of February 2009.

3rd V.P. for Programs - Nechia Dawson announced upcoming speakers and workshops. See Program Notes in the Newsletter for listings.

4th V.P. for Services: (Linda Etheridge) Carol Rouse, QPC chairperson, reminded members to vote for their favorite block in the Cat Fabric Challenge and prizes would be awarded at the end of the meeting. She asked for volunteers to notify her if you are bringing your sewing machine to the April Workshop. She expressed thanks for all who have taken home project for the QPC.

5th V.P for Community Outreach: Barbara Sumlin introduced her committee chairpersons. Mary Ruth Flores is the Chairperson for the annual Fall at the Alamo event and told of how most people dress in period costumes. Anyone with an interest in this event can contact her. Nechia Dawson reported that from 8,000 to 10,000 students have enjoyed the Storybook Quilts. Story book quilts are checked out to local schools two times each year for education and enjoyment. Sharon Ross reported that she had 43 quilts donated this month. Sharon has kits available to take home and asked for more volunteers to join the April Workshop. Kitty Janiga, along with the Great Northwest Library Bee, is teaching people how to quilt. Meetings are held at the Great Northwest Library on the 3rd Saturday of the month from 9:30 am to 12:30 pm. Carol Rouse told about the Community Education Committee and how they visit schools with a trunk show to educate children about quilting. Kay Allison hosts a group of hand quilters at the Institute of Texan Culture, Tuesday - Friday from 9 am to 12 noon. This group is open to experienced hand quilters who know how to quilt on a frame and anyone interested in the Texan Culture.

Charlene Carroll is the Chairperson for Youth Alternatives and takes our donations to the shelter where they are distributed to needy children. Barbara Gilstad is the Chairperson for

Community Response, see the guild website for more information.

Winter Retreat had a fun surprise - Sandi Price decided to slash her stash and brought a big stack of flannel squares. The retreaters pitched in and turned those squares into 23 quilt tops - just in time for the April work day.

Our plan for the April work day is to create quilt kits, sew labels on quilts that need them and create totes and/or tote kits if we have time. We could use tote handle materials (webbing, braiding, etc.) if you happen to have spares. If you plan to help Bright Hopes at the work day please bring your rotary cutter and large ruler, if you want to sew totes you'll need to bring your serger or sewing machine and accessories. MISSION

The Greater San Antonio Quilt Guild has established a grant program in honor of one of our esteemed founding members, Sherry Allred.

PURPOSE

The purpose of this grant program is to allow a current guild member to attend the current year's GSAQG Summer Retreat at no charge to the member for enrollment. The grant must be used for the cost of Summer Retreat only. The grant will be awarded annually, not to exceed the cost of Summer Retreat. If the grant recipient has made any payments toward the Retreat costs such payments shall be refunded to the recipient.

ELIGIBILITY

1. Applicant must be an active GSAQG member in good standing for the previous two (2) years immediately preceding the grant deadline.
2. Financial need **will not** be a criterion for selection.
3. Grant recipients are ineligible to reapply for grants for three years.
4. Board members are ineligible for grants while serving on a GSAQG board term.
5. Current board members will vote at the April Board meeting. The president will retain all personal information for each application; a blind vote will be based on the written paragraph only submitted by each applicant.

Applications must be submitted on or before March guild Meeting (current year), the grant will be awarded at the following April guild meeting.

The dates for retreat are: 5pm June 14th thru 2pm June 19th.


