## Bright Hopes Notes

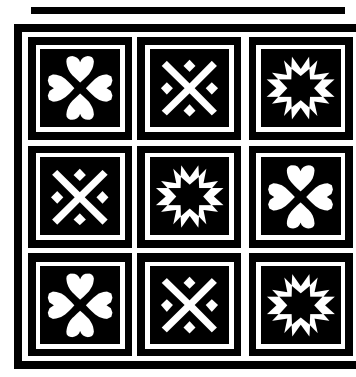
I'm gearing up for the April work day. My goal is to create at least 100 quilt kits - more if possible since we're going through a lot of kits each month and it's a long time till the next work day.

### New Quilter's Class

## The Eleanor Wright Memorial Program and Workshop Guidelines

### Funds

1. Funds received from Eleanor Wright Estate will be used to purchase a one year CD. The CD will be labeled as the Wright Memorial CD.
2. A separate line for the fund will be maintained within the Guild Budget.
3. Annually \$1,000.00 will be withdrawn to defray expenses of a quilting teacher identified as the Wright Memorial speaker. A new one year CD will be purchased.
4. The cost of the workshops will be covered by the \$1,000.00. Any funds remaining will be used to defray the travel expenses or speaker's fee.
5. Any funds left in the account at the fifteenth year will be combined with the \$1,000.00 withdrawn for that year. The CD will not be renewed.

### Program and Workshops

1. The program chair will select a nationally known teacher at least a year in advance, preferable two years in advance. The teacher's name will be presented to the Board for approval.
2. The teacher will present two workshops, one all day and one half day in addition to a 45-60 minute program at the Guild business meeting.
3. During the third and fourth months before the free workshops Guild members can submit their names to attend the desired workshop to the program chair. At the Board meeting the second month before the workshops names will be drawn. In addition two alternates will be drawn for each class. No Guild member will be eligible to attend both workshops.
4. All class fees will be paid with the Wright Memorial Funds. The number of Guild members attending each workshop will be based on the the teacher's requirement. Any class supply fees charged by the teacher will be the responsibility of the attendee.

These Guidelines will be reviewed every three years and changes as needed.

## For Sale

## Pieces of the Past: Scissors

The earliest shears, two blades connected by a curved strip of bronze, appeared in Mesopotamia 4,000 years ago. Cross-bladed scissors were invented by the Romans around 100 AD. Robert Hinchliffe produced the first pair of modern day scissors in 1761 in London. By the way, each blade is a 'scissor' which is why we call them a 'pair of scissors.' The Fiskars trademark is not new, but from 1830 in Finland at an ironworks factory. Most scissors are right handed, even if marketed as ambidextrous, because the blade orientation blocks the view of the cutting line for a southpaw.

Sewing *Chatelaine* (French for mistress of the castle/home) scissors date to the Middle Ages. Worn pinned at the waist or clasped to a waist chain, small scissors were one of many items such as keys, a mini-notebook and pen, or watch, kept within the mistress' reach.



Ever wonder why those little sewing scissors are shaped like a stork? Storks have long been associated with prosperity and children in many cultures. Linking the stork directly to childbirth was vogue in Victorian times when it was taboo to discuss "where did I come

from." Originally, midwives used a stork shaped umbilical cord clamp. The blades were dull and rounded. A swaddled newborn was hidden in the handle, or stork's wing... hence the saying "waiting in the wings." It was thought that midwives often did needlework while waiting and kept all their tools handy in sewing baskets. Over time, the clamp developed into scissors.

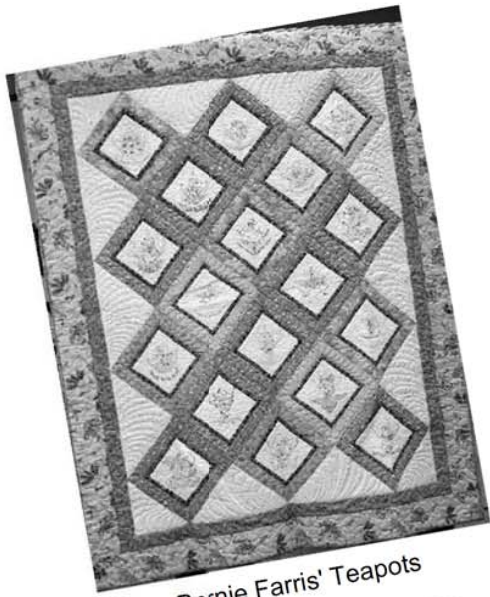

A pair of scissors nailed in the open position over the door keeps evil out. 3. You will cut off fortune if you use scissors on New Year's Day.

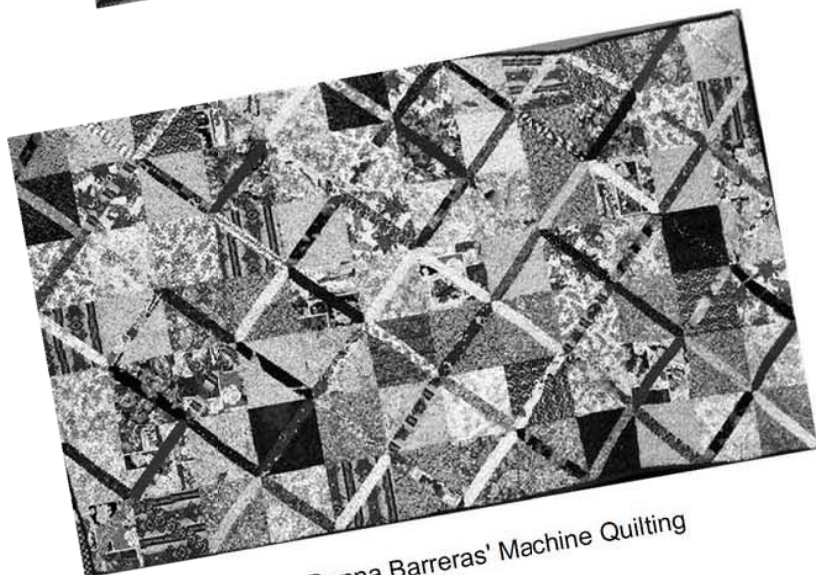

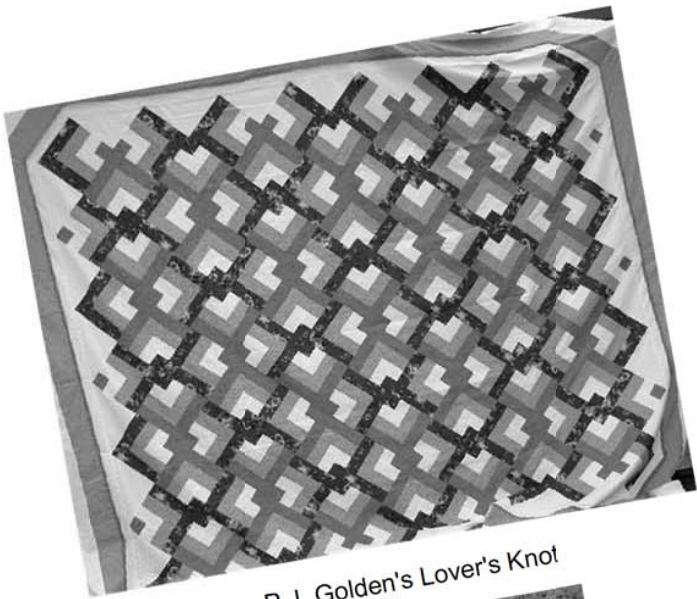


Donna Barreras' Machine Quilting

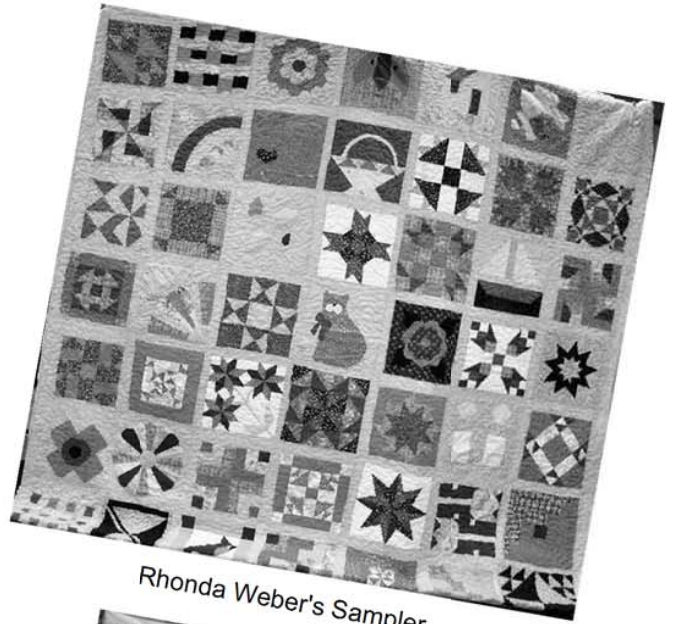

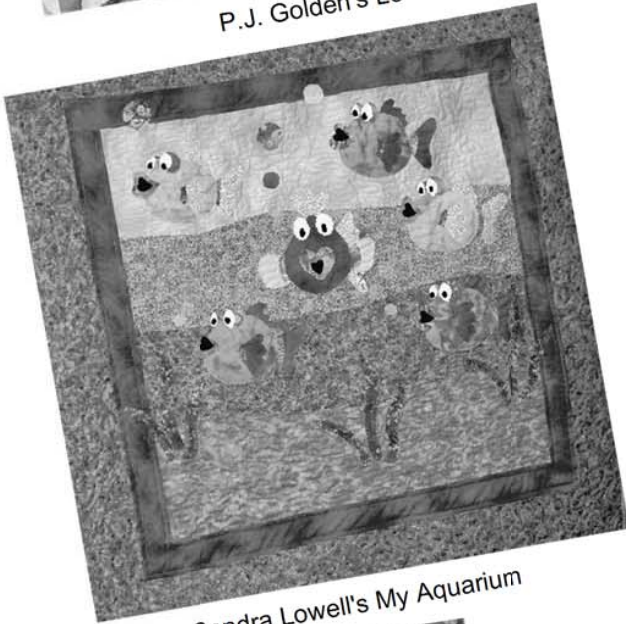

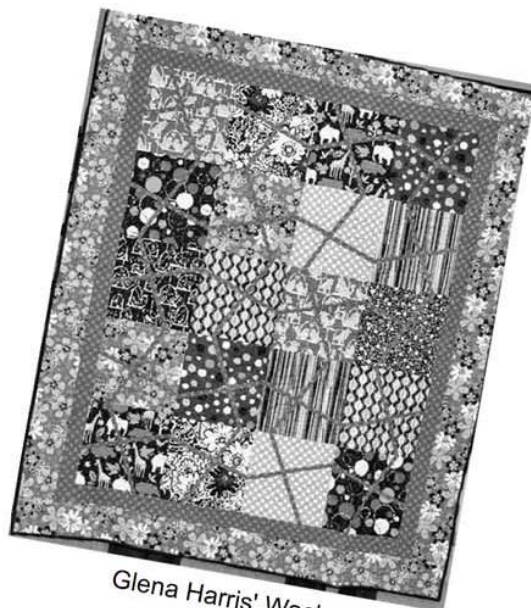

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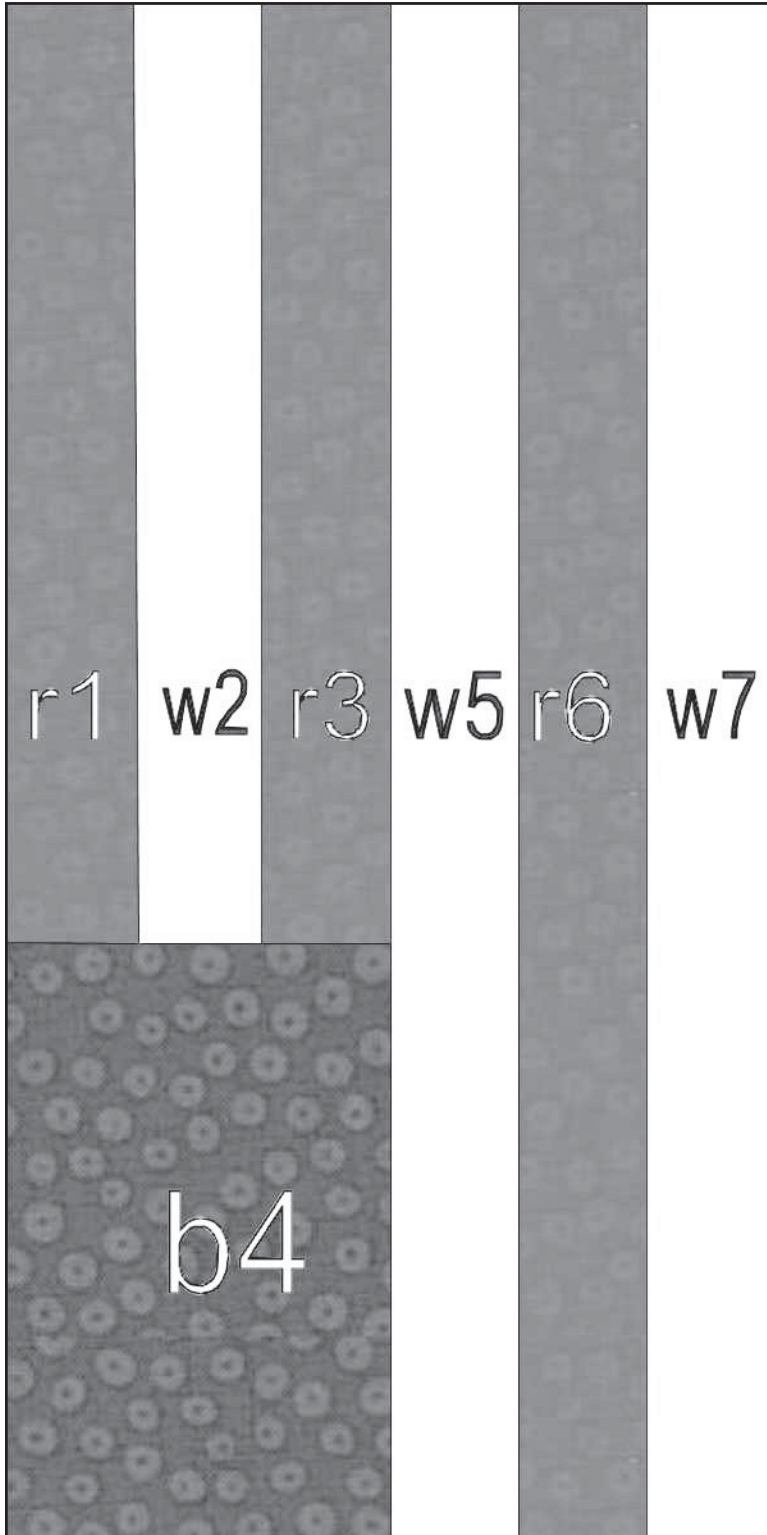
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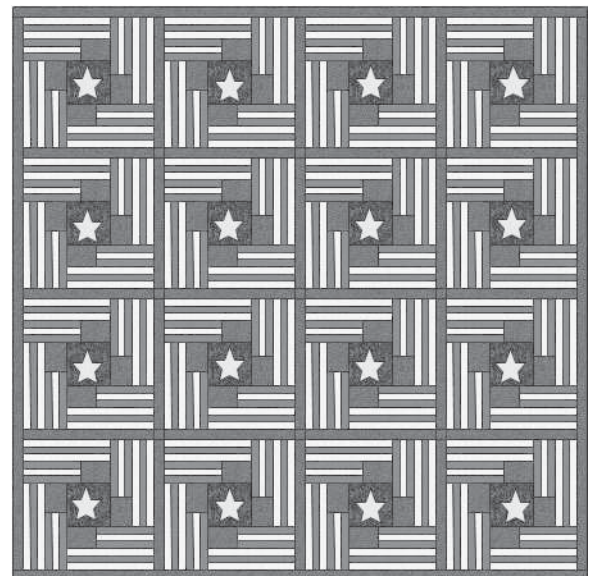
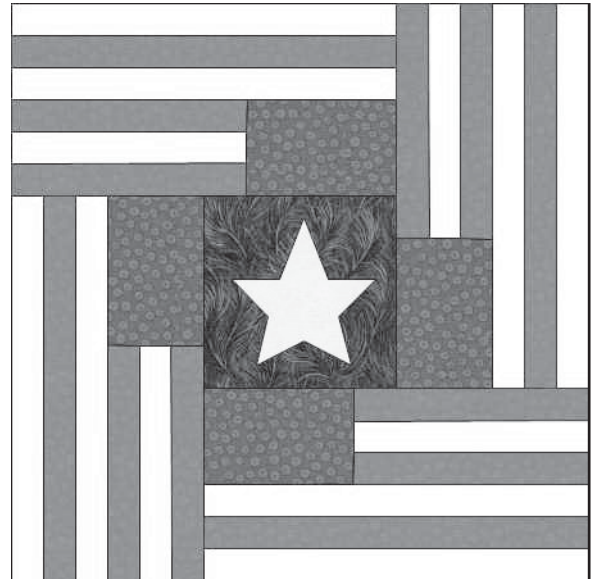


# July 2010 Block Party
