Common Threads

Pieces of the Past: Sewing Machines

Isaac M. Singer did not invent the sewing machine! The earliest prototype was invented in 1790 by Thomas Saint in Britain to sew leather and canvas forming a chain stitch using an awl instead of a needle. In 1830 Frenchman B. Thimonnier patented the first practical sewing machine. Eleven years later his factory was destroyed by a mob of tailors who thought the machines were a threat to their livelihood.

In 1834 the Yankee genius Walter Hunt invented the double thread machine. He abandoned the project thinking it would rob poor seamstresses of their source of an income. Hunt invented many other things, including the safety pin. \S

In 1846 Elias Howe put all the known great features together and introduced his machine, though it was not received well in the US. He moved to England and helped develop machines to sew corsets. When he returned to the US, he discovered that a multitude of manufacturers had stolen his patents and were successful selling lots of machines. A sewing machine battle began, specifically with Singer, and Howe won the patent rights requiring other companies to pay him royalties for many years.

Singer's first impression of a sewing machine was not positive: "What a devilish machine! You want to do away with the only thing that keeps women quiet, their sewing!" In 1851 he patented the rigid arm machine with a presser bar and foot, extended flat bed, and a foot treadle which eliminated the need to hand crank. By 1860 Singer was the largest manufacturer of sewing machines with branches or factories around the world in France, Germany, Scotland, England, and Brazil. His methods were unique in the business world: he used extensive marketing techniques, he offered a payment plan, and he provided repair service. On the personal side, Singer was a cad. Using pseudonyms, he had many wives and mistresses, many at the same time, and fathered at least 18 children. His last wife, a Frenchwoman Isabella Eugenie Boyer, is thought to have been the model for the Statue of Liberty!

Interesting...it took a woman to invent the zigzag machine. Helen Augusta Blanchard (1840-1922) held 28 patents, 22 of them related to sewing machines. The model of her 1873 overseaming machine is on display at the Smithsonian's Museum of American History.

MISSION

The Greater San Antonio Quilt Guild has established a grant program in honor of a loved and esteemed founding member, Ethel Y. Howey, whose accomplishments and influence extended into the international quilt world. The grant is to encourage the pursuit of education in the study of quilt making and to recognize the importance of quilting in today's society as an art form, as an instrument of healing, as part of our legacy, and as a common thread which binds all in friendship.

PURPOSE

The purpose of the grant program is to fund projects that will have long term impact on preserving the heritage and further the art of quilt making. The grant may be used to cover expenses such as fees (including conferences, workshops, etc.), travel, lodging, meals, materials and books. The grant(s) will be awarded annually, not to exceed \$1000.

ELIGIBILITY

- · Applicant must be an active GSAQG member in good standing for the previous two
- · (2) years immediately preceding the grant deadline.
- An applicant must show evidence of an interest in continuing to improve and innovate in the field of quilt design, construction, history or technique.
- · Financial need will not be a criterion for selection.
- Recipients must be willing and able to share with GSAQG the new skills, techniques, or information gained. This may be in the form of a presentation, a workshop or other process that disseminates the information to the members.
- Recipient must submit in writing a final report of the project and expenses by March 1 of the following year.
- If recipient fails to fulfill requirements any advanced funds must be returned.
- Grant recipients are ineligible to reapply for grants for three years. Grant committee members are ineligible for grants while serving on the committee.

PROCEDURES AND DEADLINES

Applications must be submitted on or before November 1 (current year), and the grant will be awarded at the following January guild meeting. The grant recipient's final report is due by March 1 of the year **after** the grant is awarded.


























































Common Threads 2010 GSAQG STYLE SHOW A HOLIDAY EXTRAVANAZA





July 2010 Block Party
