

The Welcoming Committee will be giving guests brightly colored name tags. If you see a guest, please take time to introduce yourself and make them feel welcome. We want the guest



Pieces of the Past: Lone Star Ellen Hernandez



Many quilts from the early 1800s were made in the medallion style, a central striking design with many 'borders.' The pieced six or eight pointed star shape was a favorite which required more precise cutting and sewing in order for the star to lay flat. Every tiny diamond had bias edges, and the dreaded Y seams were required to set the corner blocks. In England, this pieced star pattern was called Mathematical Star. Other names included Star of Bethlehem, Star of the East, Morning Star, and Lone Star. Variations include Blazing Stars, Touching Stars, and Broken Star.

Mary Betsy Toten's *Rising Star* quilt, now in the Smithsonian, is dated 1835. It was used for the first RJR collection of reproduction fabrics from the museum in the early 1990s. Mary's

quilt is an exquisite example of carefully sewn diamonds, 648 to be exact. Eleven roller-printed cottons were systematically arranged for color placement. Intricate appliquéd flowers and birds cut from chintz lie between the star points, and the stems and bows are only 3/32" wide.

The star pattern was long a favorite of Native Americans. Over time, their beaded, carved and painted stars were integrated as quilted stars. The earliest photo of a Native American star quilt is in Chief Red Cloud's home from 1890 in South Dakota. Today, these Morning Star quilts seem to have replaced the honored buffalo blanket and are often presented to others on special occasions.

There is a Texas Lone Star quilt story of note from 1870 in Williamson County. Acker Lindsey's star diamonds are only 1.5" long and 3/4" wide. Additionally, she added over 120 LeMoyne square blocks, each *finished at 2-3/4*", alternating with solid blocks to complete the layout. Can you imagine hand piecing that many 16 piece, **tiny** LeMoyne squares, much less the bias edged tiny diamonds? You can see a picture of the masterpiece in *Texas Quilts and Quilters: A Lone Star Legacy.*



About six weeks ago I received a phone call from Quilt, Inc. (thought it was going to be about a class I'd signed up for at the Houston Quilt Show), the lady wanted to talk to Dale Flashberg about her quilt, A San Antonio Fiesta. Gave her Dale's numbers, dying with curiosity, waited to hear from Dale.

Dale, a Guild member, had won the 2007 Quilt Show raffle quilt, A San Antonio Fiesta. Two years ago Houston had asked for traditional Texas Guild award winning quilts, Dale sent photos and entry form. A San Antonio Fiesta did not meet their criteria for traditional but they keep the photo and entry form.

The phone call informed Dale, A San Antonio Fiesta was a finalist in consideration for a book. She sent the guilt and a list of all Guild members who had worked on the guilt to Houston.

On September 13th Dale was informed that A San Antonio Fiesta was selected as one of 200 Texas guilts for inclusion in the book, Lone Stars III: Texas Quilts Today, 1986-2011. The book will be published by UT Press in Fall 2011. A special exhibit at the 2011 International Quilt Show will include A San Antonio Fiesta.

To every Guild member with their name on the label, thank you, thank you, thank you, we made a great quilt.


