# Common Threads Quilt Show Boutique

The quilt show boutique is a consignment booth set up during our quilt show for guild members to sell quilt related items. The seller gets 80% and the guild gets 20% of the sold item. The guild collects the sale tax.

The items for the boutique must be finished items. They can be any thing from small baby quilts to bed quilts, wall hangings, table runners, place mats, pincushions, embroidered pillows and pillowcases. The exception to finished items have been hand dyed fabrics, fat quarter packs or fabric folded and/or packaged nicely. There have also been garments such as jackets, vests, knitted or crocheted scarves and hats.

There is no dollar limit placed on the items for sale. We do ask that the price be in 25-cent increments.

The services were held in her hometown of Iowa, LA.


Pieces of the Past: Irons

The need to shape and smooth fabric was the source of many inventions. The Chinese used hot metal for ironing well over a thousand years ago, as did the Koreans - though Koreans often used ironing sticks, too, beating the cloth rhythmically on stone. Archeologists discovered 'linen smoothers' made of round, dark glass in many Viking women's graves. Other European cultures used stone, glass, bones, and wood for smoothing long before forged metal irons were created. A screw-press was introduced to Europe

by the Romans. As the design developed, the press was a practical piece of furniture for storage.

The Scandinavians and Dutch carved elaborate mangle boards to smooth items larger than clothing, such as linens, on a wooden roller. A special mangle was often made by a groom for his bride. The oldest known mangle dates to 1566. Their design spread as far east as Russia.



The first simple flat irons were forged by blacksmiths in the late Middle Ages. Two irons were required, one to be used while the other heated on a fire or stove. Other names for irons were *sadirons* from an old word meaning *solid*, and *goose* from the shape of the curved handle. Some irons were made of earthenware, terracotta, or soapstone. The hot handles had to be covered with pads or rags and after awhile removable wooden handles were created. Spitting on the iron was common to test for the desired temperature. It was a chore to keep the irons clean, rust free, and smooth to prevent damage to fabrics.

An improvement on the flat iron was the *ox-tongue*, *box* or *slug* iron. A chunk of metal was heated and then inserted into the iron body. Some of these slug irons could rotate on the handle and had a variety of surfaces, such as fluting and embossing for special tailoring. Charcoal could be inserted to hold heat longer if there were air holes in the iron. In India, burning coconut shells were used instead, and can still be found in use in areas where

power outages are common. \_

Gas irons were next on the scene. Fuels consisted of kerosene, ethanol, whale oil, natural gas, carbide gas and gasoline. Coleman's gas iron was made in popular colors - blue, turquoise, red, green, and tan. Fuel irons sold well after World War II in areas that had not received electricity, and into the 1960s in parts of Canada and to the Amish.

Henry Seely of New York patented the electric iron in 1882. Steam irons came in the 1950s.

Interesting: The world's largest collection of irons is housed in Gochsheim Castle near Karlsruhe, Germany. There is an international Pressing Iron and Trivet Collectors of America club that has an annual convention and a quarterly newsletter; Info@PressingIronAndTrivet-Collectors.org.

Two detailed books about irons are *Show and Tell* by Ton van der Tonnekreek and *Even More Irons By Irons* by David Irons.





# MISSION

The Greater San Antonio Quilt Guild has established a grant program in honor of a loved and esteemed founding member, Ethel Y. Howey, whose accomplishments and influence extended into the international quilt world. The grant is to encourage the pursuit of education in the study of quilt making and to recognize the importance of quilting in today's society as an art form, as an instrument of healing, as part of our legacy, and as a common thread which binds all in friendship.

# **PURPOSE**

The purpose of the grant program is to fund projects that will have long term impact on preserving the heritage and further the art of quilt making. The grant may be used to cover expenses such as fees (including conferences, workshops, etc.), travel, lodging, meals, materials and books. The grant(s) will be awarded annually, not to exceed \$1000.

# **ELIGIBILITY**

- Applicant must be an active GSAQG member in good standing for the previous two
   (2) years immediately preceding the grant deadline.
- ☐ An applicant must show evidence of an interest in continuing to improve and innovate in the field of quilt design, construction, history or technique.
- ☐ Financial need will not be a criterion for selection.
- Recipients must be willing and able to share with GSAQG the new skills, techniques, or information gained. This may be in the form of a presentation, a workshop or other process that disseminates the information to the members.
- Recipient must submit in writing a final report of the project and expenses by March1 of the following year.
- ☐ If recipient fails to fulfill requirements any advanced funds must be returned.
- ☐ Grant recipients are ineligible to reapply for grants for three years. Grant committee members are ineligible for grants while serving on the committee.

# PROCEDURES AND DEADLINES

Applications must be submitted on or before August 1 (current year), and the grant will be awarded at the following January guild meeting. The grant recipient's final report is due by March 1 of the year after the grant is awarded.
