Hugh thanks to Bernie Farris and her elves for a very festive Holiday Party. Even with her arm in a cast Bernie was able to get the job done.

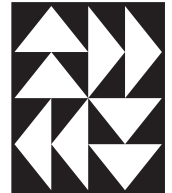
Everyone enjoyed a chance to visit and sample the pot luck! (love those deviled eggs).

The Great Bell Couty Quilt Crawl

January 14th – February 18th, 2012

A diverse group of cultural and tourism partners has formed a partnership to produce the county-wide Great Bell County Quilt Crawl. The project's goals are to promote the rich artistic and historic nature of quilts throughout the county, and to promote tourism in Bell County and Central Texas.

The quilt crawl will be held January 14 through February 18, 2012, at various facilities.

Each facility will host a quilt exhibit for six weeks. Each Saturday during the time period, one of the sites will have a special activity that relates to quilts and quilting.

At each site, visitors can purchase, for \$2, a uniquely shaped magnet. If visitors attend each exhibit and purchase a magnet at each site, they will have a complete 4 x 6 inch quilt magnet in red, white and blue that will look great on the fridge!

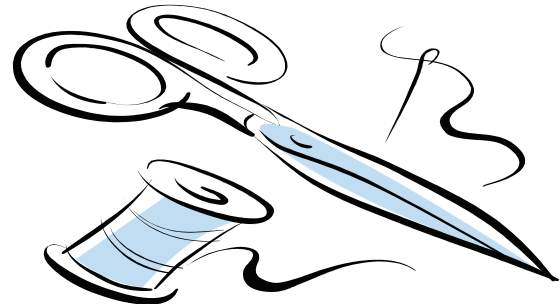

Several new members have requested to know more information about Ethel Howey. She was an outstanding person, a talented quilter, and a good community citizen. Below is an article from our Memorial Book. Read, reflect, and enjoy knowing better, one of our many wonderful and amazing quilting past members.

Ethel Y. Howey
1921-2004



Ethel Y. Howey was born April 19, 1921, in Wahiawa, HI, and died in her home December 22, 2004.

Ethel was an Army wife and raised seven children. She met and married her second husband, Vince Howey, in 1972 and moved to San Antonio in 1973. After retiring from Civil Service at Fort Sam Houston, she continued keeping busy blazing new trails for her creative outlets in many areas. She was trained in clothing pattern making.

Returning to her childhood love of quilting, she became a founding member of the Greater San Antonio Quilt Guild, Inc. She held office as President and chaired numerous committees to encourage the members, and the community at large, to pursue and improve the craft and art of quilting.

She was known nationally and internationally as a Certified Judge and Master Instructor in quilting. Ethel traveled the world lecturing, teaching and displaying her masterfully executed quilts. Her honors and prize winning quilts were numerous.

She represented the guild in an exchange program with the San Antonio Sister City, Kumamoto, Kiusu-Provence, Japan, and headed the committee for the design and execution of a quilt to be hung in the Cultural Exchange Building in Kumamoto. The quilt, "A River Runs Through It" hangs there today.

One of Ethel's most enduring qualities was her humility. She never hesitated to push her own talents and contributions into the background and let another guild member take the spotlight. In 1993, when she saw another guild member and friend had entered a quilt for judging that hung along side Ethel's, she withdrew her quilt from judging so her friend could receive 1st Place (which Ethel would undoubtedly have gotten!).

She was a valued, generous and loved member that will be missed and remembered for many years to come.

SHERRY ALLRED GRANT PROGRAM

MISSION

The Greater San Antonio Quilt Guild has established a grant program in honor of esteemed founding member, Sherry Allred.

PURPOSE

The purpose of this grant program is to allow a current guild member to attend the current year’s GSAQG Summer Retreat at no charge to the member for enrollment. The grant must be used for the cost of Summer Retreat only. The grant will be awarded annually, not to exceed the cost of Summer Retreat. If the grant recipient has made any payments toward the Retreat costs such payments shall be refunded to the recipient.

ELIGIBILITY

1. Applicant must be an active GSAQG member in good standing for the previous two years immediately preceding the grant deadline.
2. Financial need will not be a criterion for selection.
3. Grant recipients are ineligible to reapply for the grant for three years.
4. Board members are ineligible for grants while serving on a GSAQG board term.
5. Current board members will vote at the April Board meeting. The president will retain all personal information for each application; a blind vote will be based on the written paragraph only submitted by each applicant.

PROCEDURES AND DEADLINES

Applications must be submitted on or before March guild Meeting (current year), the grant will be awarded at the following April guild meeting.

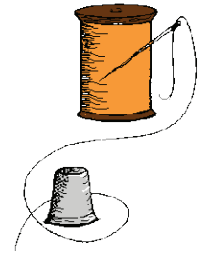

Pieces of the Past: Aunt Martha

In the 1800s there was *Aunt Jemima*. In 1921, *Betty Crocker*. Then in the 1930s, *Aunt Martha*. What do these all have in common? They aren't real people. Advertisers learned early on that warm, human characteristics associated with a product means more success. The pattern business was no exception.



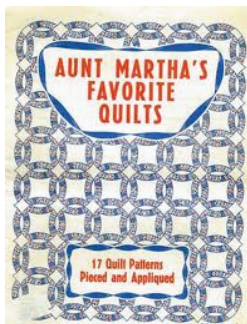
During the Great Depression, Jack Tillotson of Kansas City, MO lost his job. Eager to find a source of income, his wife, Clara, tried to sell her handmade quilts. There wasn't much market because other people were living in tight times as well. Changing tactics, Jack and Clara tried to sell pre-cut quilt blocks under the name *Colonial Readicut Quilt Block Company*. Again, too expensive for the times. Their next idea was to sell paper patterns at 10 cents. The most popular pattern was for the 48 states quilt which included the state flower and bird. The inexpensive patterns quickly became popular and soon they were advertizing in magazines and newspapers. A Chicago editor suggested that a grandmotherly name be used that brought to mind Colonial

history. The nom-de-plume of *Aunt Martha* was a good fit, evoking the image of Martha Washington.



Demand was high for the patterns, and John and Clara searched for ideas in libraries, county fairs and even had contests with work submitted by customers. They hired a designer, Marguerite Weaver to help. They sometimes put several patterns in one packet and called it *Aunt Martha's Workbasket*. In 1935, *The Workbasket* became its own monthly magazine. It included more than quilt blocks with embroidery, crochet, appliqué, recipes and household tips from other fictional contributors - Aunt Ellen, Aunt Matilda, and Betsy Ross. After sending postcards to 5,000 subscribers to join Aunt Ellen's Needlework Club, the magazine grew to serve 2 million readers.

In 1949, the Tillotsons continued to own *Workbasket* and renamed their company Modern Handcraft. They also published *Workbench* and *Flower & Garden*. Modern Handcraft was sold in 1990 to John and Carol Precich who called it KC Pub., Inc. The last *Workbasket* was published in 1996.



The Tillotsons' Aunt Martha section was sold to Clifford and Alma Swenson and was renamed *Aunt Martha's Studios*. Since then, the business was sold to Edward Price in 1974 and renamed *Colonial Patterns, Inc*. They continue to publish today with new designs for quilting, embroidery, and textile painting. Their new line of patterns, *Stitcher's Revolution* are designed for the new generation of needle workers, and are fun and fast.

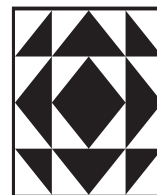
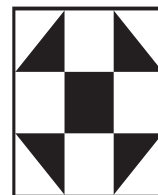

Storybooks and Quilts to Go

The holiday luncheon was so much fun this year – and of course I sampled “just a little bit” of every delicious dish. Oh well, that's what New Year's resolutions are all about. Ann Ashjian added an extra spark of holiday cheer with her astounding story quilt from *Stitching Stars* by Mary E. Lyons. This book is a biography of Harriett Powers, who was born into slavery and known for her folk art applique quilts, many of which are in prominent museums. The quilt is a very welcome addition to the guild's growing collection.

We are in the process of retrieving totes and documenting student numbers during the week before Christmas break. Some of the comments I've heard are heartwarming. 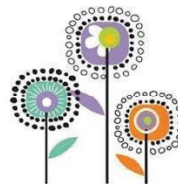

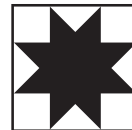
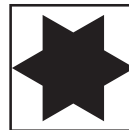
