## Notes from Mary McCarthy 3rd VP for Programs

Here is a bio of Cynthia England, our teacher in May. I now have a sample of the "Texas" quilt to show which is the Friday 11 May class.

Cynthia's stunning quilts have been winning 1st place ribbons at local and national quilting events since 1991 and have graced the pages of many quilting publications. Her most recognized quilt, Piece and Quiet, was chosen as one of the "The Twentieth Century's Best American Quilts" in 2000. In addition to this award, Cynthia has won Best of Show twice in the IQA show at the International Quilt Festival in Houston for her guilts Piece and Quiet. in 1993, and Open Season, in 2000. Cynthia began quilting at the age of 13, her interest in quilting was piqued again in 1976 after seeing a display of the Texas Sesquicentennial quilts in a nearby mall. Essentially a self-taught quilter, she has made about 24 bed-sized guilts and over 70 wall guilts. Although she started with and occasionally still makes traditional style quilts, Cynthia's hallmark is realistically detailed pictorial guilts. Using skills she developed as a commercial graphic artist, she creates guilts depicting some of her favorite subjects: flowers, nature, antiques and architecture. After using applique to get the realistic effect in her early quilts, Cynthia gradually devised a machine piecing technique she calls Picture Piecing. This technique breaks the design down into pieces that can all be sewn using straight seams and allows her to include intricate details and shading without a single set-in seam. Her first quilt made entirely from that technique, Piece and Quiet, was so successful she was inspired to continue designing with the Picture Piecing method. After numerous requests to teach her technique to other quilters, Cynthia launched a line of Picture Piecing patterns and thus her business, England Design, was born.

I will begin taking names for the Drawing for the FREE Eleanor Wright Memorial Workshops (in June) with Karen Kay Buckley at the March meeting. The Friday 15 June class is "Kansas Rose" and the Saturday 16 June class is "Borders By Design". www.karenkaybuckley.com

# Common Threads GREATER SAN ANTONIO QUILT GUILD, INC. ETHEL Y. HOWEY GRANT PROGRAM

#### **MISSION**

The Greater San Antonio Quilt Guild (GSAQG) has established a grant program in honor of a loved and esteemed founding member, Ethel Y. Howey, whose accomplishments and influence extended into the international quilt world. The grant is to encourage the pursuit of education in the study of quilt making and to recognize the importance of quilting in today's society as an art form, as an instrument of healing, as part of our legacy, and as a common thread which binds all in friendship.

#### **PURPOSE**

The purpose of the grant program is to fund projects that will have long term impact on preserving the heritage and further the art of quilt making. The grant may be used to cover expenses such as fees (including conferences, workshops, etc.), travel, lodging, meals, materials and books. The grant(s) will be awarded annually, not to exceed \$1000. The Grant Committee may divide the monies between more than one recipient. The GSAQG is not obligated to award the entire \$1,000 or any part thereof, if the quality of the proposals does not merit it.

#### **ELIGIBILITY**

- Applicant must be an active GSAQG member in good standing for the previous two (2) years immediately
  preceding the grant deadline.
- An applicant must show evidence of an interest in continuing to improve and innovate in the field of quilt design, construction, history or technique.
- Financial need will NOT be a criteria for selection.
- Grant recipients are ineligible to reapply for grants for three years. Grant committee members are ineligible for grants while sen/ing on the committee.

#### PROCEDURES AND DEADLINES

- Applications must be submitted **on or before August 1** (current year), and the grant will be awarded at the following January Guild meeting.
- If the recipient fails to fulfill the requirements or is unable to attend the proposed project or program, the grant money must be returned within **three** (3) **months** of the cancellation, or on a time-line agreed to by the committee and the applicant. If an alternate applicant is available, the money may be transferred to the alternate with approval of the committee.
- Recipients must be willing and able to share with GSAQG the new skills, techniques, or information gained.
  This may be in the form of a presentation, a workshop or other process that disseminates the information to
  the members in the year following receipt of the grant. Scheduling must be coordinated with the 1st Vice
  President for Programs.
- If a workshop or program is being presented, at a minimum of (3) three months before the scheduled Guild workshop or program, a lesson plan and class sample will be presented to the Ethel Howey Chairperson, the 1st Vice President for Programs and one Guild member-at-large.
- Recipient must submit, in writing, a final report of the project and expenses by March 1 of the year following receipt of the grant.

#### **GSAQG ETHEL Y. HOWEY GRANT PROGRAM APPLICATION PROCESS**

Following the stated time line, submit a typed or hand written application, not to exceed two (2) pages. Include the date, your name, address, phone numbers, e-mail, number of years a GSAQG member, and explain:

- 1. Why you would like to receive this grant
- 2. How you will use the grant funds, including a specific budget
- 3. How you will share your new skills, techniques, and information with the membership.

Feel free to provide any additional information that will help the selection committee.




Sandra Lowell put these antique flower garden blocks together and quilted this queen size Rainbow Garden quilt using her new long arm machine!

Pieces of the Past: Hair Receivers



While sorting through the family keepsakes or wandering about an antique store you notice a delicate, beautifully painted china bowl. It has a removable top with a hole in the middle. What could it be?

Flash back to the Victorian era. ALL women had long hair, and it was not often washed. Instead, they added oils and perfumes to their hair and spent time before retiring in the evening brushing at least 100 strokes. They may have sat at a special dressing table with perhaps a silver brush and mirror set. Also on their table was a china bowl as described, called a Hair Receiver. After brushing, the hairs were removed from the brush and put into the bowl, saved for a future "project."

Common uses for collected hair included hairpieces, called rats, jewelry, and art. In 1850 hairwork was considered a worthy virtue as described in Godey's Lady's Book - "hair is at once the most delicate of our materials and survives us like love." This magazine, and others, included instructions to make brooches, cuff links, watch chains and bracelets. Often items were made during mourning the loss of a loved one, perhaps incorporating some of the deceased's hair. The hair was boiled in soda for 15 minutes and carefully sorted. Special wooden molds and bobbins were used to braid the hair design, almost like lace making. Favorite designs were feathers, basket weave and landscapes. Jewelers would fashion gold pieces to mount the hair designs.


Presently, many who embroider or quilt are using hair receivers to collect their thread scraps. The beautiful containers are nice to see while working, and add a vintage feel to modern crafting.


