




MISSION

The Greater San Antonio Quilt Guild (GSAQG) has established a grant program in honor of a loved and esteemed founding member, Ethel Y. Howey, whose accomplishments and influence extended into the international quilt world. The grant is to encourage the pursuit of education in the study of quilt making and to recognize the importance of quilting in today's society as an art form, as an instrument of healing, as part of our legacy, and as a common thread which binds all in friendship.

PURPOSE

The purpose of the grant program is to fund projects that will have long term impact on preserving the heritage and further the art of quilt making. The grant may be used to cover expenses such as fees (including conferences, workshops, etc.), travel, lodging, meals, materials and books. The grant(s) will be awarded annually, not to exceed \$1000. The Grant Committee may divide the monies between more than one recipient. The GSAQG is not obligated to award the entire \$1,000 or any part thereof, if the quality of the proposals does not merit it.

ELIGIBILITY

- Applicant must be an active GSAQG member in good standing for the previous two (2) years immediately
 preceding the grant deadline.
- An applicant must show evidence of an interest in continuing to improve and innovate in the field of quilt design, construction, history or technique.
- · Financial need will NOT be a criteria for selection.
- Grant recipients are ineligible to reapply for grants for three years. Grant committee members are ineligible for grants while serving on the committee.

PROCEDURES AND DEADLINES

- Applications must be submitted on or before August 1 (current year), and the grant will be awarded at the following January Guild meeting.
- If the recipient fails to fulfill the requirements or is unable to attend the proposed project or program, the grant money must be returned within **three** (3) **months** of the cancellation, or on a time-line agreed to by the committee and the applicant. If an alternate applicant is available, the money may be transferred to the alternate with approval of the committee.
- Recipients must be willing and able to share with GSAQG the new skills, techniques, or information gained.
 This may be in the form of a presentation, a workshop or other process that disseminates the information to
 the members in the year following receipt of the grant. Scheduling must be coordinated with the 1st Vice
 President for Programs.
- If a workshop or program is being presented, at a minimum of (3) three months before the scheduled Guild workshop or program, a lesson plan and class sample will be presented to the Ethel Howey Chairperson, the 1st Vice President for Programs and one Guild member-at-large.
- Recipient must submit, in writing, a final report of the project and expenses by March 1 of the year following receipt of the grant.

GSAQG ETHEL Y. HOWEY GRANT PROGRAM APPLICATION PROCESS

Following the stated time line, submit a typed or hand written application, not to exceed two (2) pages. Include the date, your name, address, phone numbers, e-mail, number of years a GSAQG member, and explain:

- 1. Why you would like to receive this grant
- 2. How you will use the grant funds, including a specific budget
- 3. How you will share your new skills, techniques, and information with the membership.

2 cups sifted flour
1 tsp. Baking soda
1 ¼ cups sugar
¾ tsp. Salt
¾ cup brown sugar, packed
1 tsp. ground cinnamon
½ cup butter
1 cup buttermilk
½ cup chopped walnuts
1 tsp. vanilla
½ cup flaked coconut
Confections' Sugar Icing

1 egg

(recipe follows)

Combine flour, sugar, and brown sugar in bowl. Cut in margarine until mixture forms coarse crumbs, using pastry blender. Combine 2 cups of the crumb mixture with walnuts and coconut. Press nut mixture into greased 13x9x2" baking pan.

Combine egg, baking soda, salt, cinnamon, buttermilk, and vanilla into another bowl. Beat until smooth, using electric mixer at medium speed. Stir egg mixture into remaining crumb mixture, mixing just until moistened. Spread over crumb-nut layer.

Bake in 350 oven 35 minutes, or until golden brown. Cool in pan on rack 10 minutes. Prepare Confectioners' Sugar Icing. Frost slightly warm bars with icing. Cool completely. Cut into bars. Makes about 32 bars.

Confectioners' Sugar Icing:

Combine ¾ cup shifted confectioners' sugar, ½ tsp. vanilla, and 4 tsp. milk in bowl; beat until smooth using a spoon. From Farm Journal's Best-Ever Cookies.







Pieces of the Past: Mennonite Quilts in Holland

In the 1940s, An Keuning-Tichelaar, a Dutch Mennonite nurse and pastor's wife, was a Resistance worker. She sheltered hungry children, Jewish families, and other Resistance workers from the Nazis. After the war, she gave refuge to Mennonites fleeing the Ukraine, Soviet Union. Most of this faction stayed in Holland for two years before sailing for Paraguay.

In 1945 after Liberation, food and supplies were limited. An contacted the Mennonite Central Committee (MCC) asking for mattresses for her steady stream of refugees. A van full of "quilts" arrived, something unfamiliar to the Dutch. Somewhat disappointed at not receiving mattresses, An stuffed the thin quilts together to make mattresses, using extra quilts for covers.

The quilts had been stitched by Mennonite women in Canada and the United States to be distributed to families



and communities in war-torn Europe. Relief efforts started in 1939 when the Canadian Mennonites sent funds, clothing, and linens to England. Later, a large American distribution center was set up in Ephrata, Pennsylvania. No one knows the total amount of supplies, or number of handmade quilts, that were distributed. The US records that 20 tons of supplies were sent in November, 1945.

After much use, some of An's quilts were worn out, some were sold for fund raising, and the rest were kept by An as a memory of the War years. Lynn Kaplanian-Buller, an American living in Holland, discovered An's quilts and their story. An gave Lynn ten quilts which were developed into an exhibition displayed across the country. The quilts stand as silent witnesses to the horrors of war and to people with compassion.



In April 2011, US Ambassador John Tefft opened the exhibit of quilts, "Passing on the Comfort" in Kyiv, Ukraine. The exhibit reminds viewers that the need for the comfort of a blanket is an ongoing concern. In the past decade, MCC has shipped 670,895 blankets and comforters to disaster or war zones worldwide.

Rather than purchase ready-made blankets, the MCC believes a soft, colorful hand-made comforter brings special hope to those who receive them. For more information, see the book, *Passing on the Comfort*, by An and Lynn.
