

Glenda Harris did this 36"x36" table topper for her son who had an oil painting that inspired it! She pieced it at winter retreat.











Teresa Reynolds did both of these quilts and made matching totes for them as well. Both are 36"x42" and are for our Bright Hopes projects. Thanks Teresa!








Ann Ashjian did this 80"x80" Spanish Coloial style "Ave Maria" from a kit and made a few changes to it.









The Alzheimer's Art Quilt Initiative

The Alzheimer's Art Quilt Initiative (www.AlzQuilts.org) is a national, grassroots organization whose mission is to raise awareness and fund research. It auctions and sells donated quilts through the Priority: Alzheimer's Quilt Project and sponsors a nationally touring exhibition of quilts about Alzheimer's called Alzheimer's Illustrated: From Heartbreak to Hope. The AAQI has raised nearly \$500,000 since January 2006.

Pieces of the Past: Wooden Spools Submitted by Ellen Hernandez



The Industrial Revolution in the late 1700s in England led to many changes in the spinning of cotton thread and weaving. Machines run by water wheels sped up production which provided jobs, allowing women, and children, to be independent. Mill towns sprang up and factories grew - to over 2600 cotton mills by the 1860s. Samuel Slater emigrated from England and is credited with building the first cotton mill in America. By 1809, there were 62 spinning mills in New England.



Along with the spinning of thread, it became practical to have wooden spool mills nearby. These mills operated by water wheel as well. Woods commonly used were birch, sycamore, alder and ash. The tree was sliced into cakes and then cut into spools. Men worked 12 hour shifts and were paid by the piece, counting with a tally stick. Two men could make 10,000 spools per day. Many workers developed respiratory problems from the sawdust. There were no safety guards at first. The first bobbins were like this, with two angled ends glued onto a tube. Bobbins were waxed inside a rolling whiskey barrel with beeswax for one hour. More delicate bobbins were waxed by hand.

The men worked in waist high shavings which actually supplied warmth while working in the cold winters. Cotton mills often asked for color coded bobbins, such as black bobbins for white thread. Over 260 shapes and sizes of bobbins were made. Some were for wire, and some large ones were for carpet mills.

Birch had to be seasoned and dried for one year. Nine year old boys were employed to strip the bark off the birch trees to prevent splitting and cracking. Much of the wood was harvested by coppicing, a process of cutting young tree stems at ground level and letting new shoots emerge. This way the tree never dies. It might take 8 - 16 years before it could be cut again.



Water wheel systems were replaced by steam engines in the 1880s. Most mills operated conservatively, using their own shavings and cuts to feed engines for steam. Electric saws were developed by the 1940s and replaced steam.



Two common expressions came from bobbin mills. "Knock off work" came from knocking the belt off the pulley of the circular saw when it was time to shut down. "Happy Hour" came from Friday afternoon bobbin work. Methylated spirits or lacquer was applied to bobbins only the last hour of the work week because the fumes were intoxicating.

Bobbin production and demand decreased during WWII, but the bobbin mills continued to operate, making toggle buttons for navy coats, items for ships, rope ladder rungs, and various handles. Later on, they made yoyos, croquet mallets, and jump rope handles to generate income.

In the 1960s, plastic spool production started and flourished in China and other countries. Soon the old American wood mills closed. There is one

major wood spool mill still open today in Burlington, NJ. Most of their wooden spools are white birch or maple, turned and bored on lathes. They are made for arts and crafts stores, and for industrial purposes.

















Quilt Project Committee (commonly known as QPC)

QPC encourages members to try new techniques or practice ones to improve their work. We provide kits with instructions, and fabric for blocks utilizing various techniques, both hand and machine work.

We have a new block -- only 3 seams! It does involve triangles and 2 of the seams are on bias edges. Also we have a hand applique project going. The background is already pieced so only one person can work on it at a time. We are hand appliqueing baskets of flowers in each corner and have finished one corner. The plan is that you check it out and do whatever you can that month, then bring it back the next month for someone else to check out. Eventually it will be finished.

Looking forward to September, we plan to continue working on the projects we started in April. The sashing was finished for 2 quilts so they are ready to put together. Most of our work needs machines.

FYI --- QPC has sets of blocks that need settings -- No, they are not necessarily scrap blocks. Some examples are Rose of Sharon hand applique, funky chickens from retreat, Celtic applique, embroidered US Presidents (Washington thru Bush 2), cat challenge blocks, embroidered Cupie dolls,, as well as 100 plus Shop Hop Challenge blocks. We've had some quilts from these at the past 2 or 3 auctions already. If you'd like to plan a quilt, contact me. You won't have to do the work -- unless you want to.
