October Program - Art Works to Quilt Works Surface design techniques applied to fabrics

Barbara Sumlin, the 2011 Ethel Howey Grant recipient, will share the results of her study of surface techniques to transfer art works to quiltwork in October.

If you are interested in fabric painting, using piping as a design concept, appliqué/seams, machine quilting, and/or thread painting, be sure to participate. The classes will focus on small samples of techniques to build the quilter's toolbox.

Sign-up and samples will be available soon. The classes are free, but limited to 15 students.

- 4. The piece must be a finished quilt no larger than 200 inches all four sides.



Quilt Project Committee (commonly known as QPC)

QPC provides members an opportunity to try new techniques, or practice/improve the ones they already know. We provide kits with instructions, and fabric for blocks utilizing various techniques, both hand and machine work. Stop by my table and I will be happy to help you pick something out! Golden Carrot Note: be sure to sign your name on the blank side of each ticket you receive! I'd hate to draw a blank ticket or one that I can't read the name. If they are stapled together, remove the staple.

Our plans for the September work day include:

- 1. Piecing: continuing work on projects from the April work day, such as setting together the Shop Hop Bluebonnet blocks and Asterisk blocks which we prepared sashing for. Strips have been sewn together and will need to be pressed and cut for a border for the Asterisk quilt.
- 2. Other projects ready to assemble: embroidered blocks, Christmas blocks,,
- 3 Machine applique -- Dresden plates. I'll bring a machine all set up for free motion applique.
- 4. Hand work: applique the basket quilt (since we are adding baskets and flowers to a top already set together, only one person can work on this at a time).
- 5. ???who knows what else I'll find????

If you have any of the Kaleidoscope blocks, I need to know what colors you have. I failed to keep a list of the colors and I know we need 5 more blocks which I want to be different. Please callI me at 699-9363 or e-mail me at carolquiltscats@yahoo.com.

At the Aug meeting I was asked how many more Christmas Pineapple blocks we need. If we go with a smaller size, we only need 17 of the border blocks (the light pieces on 2 sides are gold instead of white). If anyone has some of those, please let me know.

It is so much fun to watch these quilt grow! Thanks to all of you who try the projects -- and keep coming back for more.

Bright Hopes Quilts and Totes for Charity

We have a work day in September, meaning we get to work on personal or committee projects after the meeting. Bright Hopes is going to make tote kits and off-the-floor blocks. Mike Mitchell has volunteered (perhaps railroaded is a better word, he'd probably appreciate helpers) to coordinate the totes/ tote kits and I'm going to teach the off-the-floor class. Please bring your own sewing machine, scissors, thread, extension cords, rotary cutters, mats, etc. for either project. Bright Hopes will provide foundation and scraps for off-the-floor blocks for Bright Hopes, if you want to make your own blocks of your own scraps please bring your scraps and pre-cut 9" squares of muslin or other light fabric (so it doesn't show thru the scraps) that you want to bury inside a quilt. Off-the-floor scraps are by definition small bits of this and that, mine usually result from any fabric too small to cut out a 4" square. Hope to see you there!




Marty Kraatz did this beautiful 58"x65" breast cancer awareness pink and green quilt for her sister-in-law. Go to the web to get a better look at the colors.


