GSAQG Board Meeting Minutes

November 3, 2014

The meeting was called to order by Ida Blankenship, President, at 3:00pm. The October 2014 board minutes were approved as published. Board members in attendance were DeaJae Shore, Judith Miller, Gail Dickman, Cindy Shutt, Carol Bryant, Rebecca Cook, Linda Ethridge and Sylvia Jolet.

A Calico Rose was approved for Carol Rouse for her leadership on the QPC and providing so many quilts for auction; for Lissetta Ennis (last minute sub) and Sandra Lowell for the Houston International Show bus. A Calico Rosebud was approved for Janet Miller and Mary McCarthy for all their work for the successful mini-retreat in October. A motion was made, seconded and passed to move the monthly Guild Board meeting from the church to the conference room at the storage facility located at 6075 DeZavala Road beginning January 2015. There is no charge for the meeting room at the facility thus eliminating a cost to the guild.

There were no mail-in ballots received by the deadline for the upcoming election of officers. Cindy Shutt will order required name tags and new date bars for all incoming officers. Pieces from a large donation to the guild from a past guild member, Lark Coggins, will be offered for sale to current members at upcoming guild meetings with proceeds to be designated for the Technology Fund. There were 9 calls to the guild telephone during the month. The current balance of guild funds is \$67,197.98. The September 2014 financials have been reviewed and approved.

Carol stated that Bernie Farris, Quilt Show chair, will need a table each month at guild meeting until the 2015 show to facilitate ticket sales for raffle quilt. The quilt will be entered in the Dallas show next March 14 & 15. A meeting will be held with all who participated in auction this year to solicit a chair for the 2016 Auction. DeaJae Shore will continue to research web options for guild promotion. She will be working on updates to current website.

Rebecca Cook reported that Karel Donley, Ethel Howey Grant recipient, will be November's program. A registration process for Bonnie Hunter February 2016 program was discussed to ensure full occupancy in both classes. Judith Miller will assist with registration at meeting. Janet Miller and Janice Frankenberger will chair another guild mini-retreat on March 27 & 28, 2015.

The slate of officers were President, Ida Blankenship; 2nd VP, DeaJae Shore; 4th VP, Jeana Kubik; 5th VP, Sherry Durringer; and Secretary, Karen Lambdin was announced. A motion was made, seconded and passed by the membership present to elect the candidates by acclamation. The proposed 2015 budget was accepted as published in newsletter.

Lyn Komada will be turning over the magazines to Ellen Hernandez and she will be helping Rebecca Cook with program support. The pattern is called Primavera and 25 members helped work on all the applique and blocks.

Linda Kirk, Story Book chair, showed 3 new quilts with the accompanying book that were turned today. Mary McCarthy reported that today's interviews for SOS will be with Linda Harris and Barbara Wofford.

Pieces From The Past by Ellen Hernandez

Pieces of the Past: *Aunt Jane of Kentucky* by Ellen Hernandez



Eliza "Lida" Caroline Calvert Obenchain, 1856-1935, was well known in the early 20th century for short stories about a fictionalized Kentucky quilter, Aunt Jane. Using the pen name Eliza Calvert Hall, Lida advocated for women's rights and her articles and poems appeared in the *New York Times*, *Cosmopolitan*, *Women's Journal*, *Ladies' Home Journal* and international magazines and newspapers. President Teddy Roosevelt even recommended her 1907 book, *Aunt Jane of Kentucky*, to all men who tended to be "selfish or thoughtless or overbearing" regarding the rights of women. Her other books included *The Land of Long Ago*, *To Love and To Cherish*, *Clover and Blue Grass*, *The Unspoken Word*, and *A Book of Hand-Woven Coverlets*.

Bankruptcy did not allow Lida to complete college at the Western Female Seminary in Oxford, OH. At age 18 she began teaching and even established her own private school. She married a former Confederate officer 20 years her senior and money was scarce. Lida's short stories were based on local Bowling Green, KY history and their sale helped provide for her family of four children. Written in narrative with a Southern homespun appeal, *Aunt Jane of Kentucky* was originally turned down by eight publishers. When finally published, popularity required over 33 editions, including Braille. The latest reprint was in 1995.



Lida used quilting as a metaphor for the lives of turn of the century women. As creators and artists, handcrafts made by women were generally seen as role-related trivialities. "I've heard folks say that piecing quilts was nothing but a waste of time, but that ain't always so." "It was as needful for folks to know how to sew as it was for them to know how to eat."

Mortality was also woven into the quilt comments of Aunt Jane. "Ain't it strange that a piece of calico will outlast you and me?" "No one will remember the floors she swept, the tables she scrubbed, or the clothes she mended, but when her descendants look at her quilts they will think of her."

Lida also philosophized with quilts. "While you're living your life, it looks pretty much like a jumble of quilt pieces before they're put together; but when you get through with it...you'll see the use and the purpose of everything in it. Everything will be in its right place just like the squares in this four-patch and one piece may be pretty and another one ugly, but it all looks right when you see it finished and joined together."

"I looked again at the heap of quilts. An hour ago they had been patchwork, and nothing more. But now! The old woman's words had wrought a transformation in the homely mass of calico and silk and worsted. Patchwork? Ah, no! It was memory, imagination, history, biography, joy, sorrow, philosophy, religion, romance, realism, life, love, and death; and over all, like a halo, the love of the artist for his work and the soul's longing for earthly immortality."

Lida's book on hand-woven coverlets was compiled after exploring several cottage arts and crafts industries. She also did hands on research collecting stories and photographs from anyone who had a coverlet, such as tobacco farmers selling their goods at auction.

Lida lived her last days in Texas where she cared for her ailing daughter and grandchildren. In 1918, after laboring almost 40 years for women's rights, Lida and 386,000 other Texas women were able to register to vote in the Democratic primary.

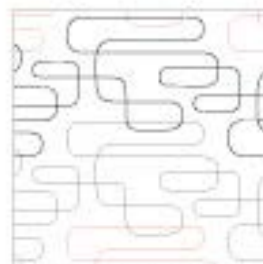
