**Treasurer** – Cindy Shutt reported a cash and checking balance of \$57,580.49. The April financials have been checked and approved.

**1<sup>st</sup> VP for Special Events** – Elaine Staller reported on the status of the quilt auction and the board discussed advertising ideas.

The summer retreat is nearly here and the board responded to a request for new irons with the decision to purchase 6 .

The raffle quilt is nearing completion.

**2<sup>nd</sup> Vice President for Information** – next month's board meeting will be on Tues. July 5<sup>th</sup>, same place and time.

**3<sup>rd</sup> Vice President for Programs** – Janet Miller discussed this week's workshop and lecture with Karen Kay Buckley.

**4<sup>th</sup> Vice President for Services** – Jeana Kubik. The book sale last month made \$222.50. The workday was a success and many quilts were readied for the auction.

**5<sup>th</sup> VP for Community Outreach** – Sherry Durringer emailed a report. The ITC finished quilting a sampler for the auction. The Community Quilt Angels donated a quilt to the KLRN auction which will air on June 8-18. They will do work for the auction during the summer. They also delivered quilts to Fisher House and VA.

## GSAQG Guild Meeting Minutes

June, 2016

President, Ida Blankenship opened the meeting at 10:05 am by welcoming visitors.

There were no corrections to the May minutes, so they stand approved.

Two Calico Roses were awarded. The first was to Virginia Oehlke for coordinating the Spring mini-retreat. The second Calico Rose was for Jeanette Jay who supported the library for 9 years. Jeanette also received a Certificate of Appreciation for her dedication to the library.

Ida expressed sadness at the loss of a longtime member, Kay Allison. Kathy Wallace volunteered to make a memorial block in her honor.

Three groups were selling raffle tickets at the meeting; the Buda Bee, New Braunfels Area Quilt Guild, and the Vereins Quilt Guild of Fredericksburg.

**Treasurer** – Cindy Shutt reported cash and savings balance of \$57,580.49.

**1<sup>st</sup> VP for Special Events** – Elaine Staller. Nancy Beasley gave some information about the summer retreat.

Mary McCarthy has 89 auction quilts ready for the September Auction. After the July meeting, there will be a label sewing session, and in August the quilts will get sorted. The tickets for admission to the auction are ready for members to sell : \$5 presale and \$7 at the door. Members quilting a top for the auction are asked to return them before the August meeting.

Ida asked members to look for advertising spots, such as neighborhood newsletters. A motion to limit guild reimbursement for these ads to \$25 was seconded, and after a vote the motion carried. If the amount is more than \$25, members need approval from the Auction Committee (Mary) for reimbursement from the guild. Mary will go to guild board for approval if needed.

Carol Bryant discussed having demonstrations on stage at the 2017 Quilt Show. She is also considering classes. The first quilt show meeting will be at Carol's house next Saturday. The raffle quilt will debut at the September guild meeting.

Sign ups for Winter Retreat begin next month.

**3<sup>rd</sup> VP for Programs** – Janet Miller announced 2 openings in today's workshop.

### Ethel Howey Grant

The Ethel Howey Grant was created by the Greater San Antonio Quilt Guild in 2006 to honor founding Guild member, Ethel Howey. The Grant is a monetary award that allows a Guild member to further their quilting skills and share these quilting skills with the Guild.

The deadline for the Ethel Howey Grant is August 1 and is open to any Guild members meeting the guidelines.

If you are applying for the Grant take the time to talk with Guild members, VP for Programs and previous winners to learn what skills/techniques are needed or wanted. Review national teachers the Guild has had in the past year so you don't repeat their teaching.

Please consider applying and giving back to the Guild.

**MISSION**

The Greater San Antonio Quilt Guild (GSAQG) has established a grant program in honor of a loved and esteemed founding member, Ethel Y. Howey, whose accomplishments and influence extended into the international quilt world. The grant is to encourage the pursuit of education in the study of quilt making and to recognize the importance of quilting in today's society as an art form, as an instrument of healing, as part of our legacy, and as a common thread which binds all in friendship.

**PURPOSE**

The purpose of the grant program is to fund projects that will have long term impact on preserving the heritage and further the art of quilt making. The grant may be used to cover expenses such as fees (including conferences, workshops, etc.), travel, lodging, meals, materials and books. The grant(s) will be awarded annually, not to exceed \$1000. The Grant Committee may divide the monies between more than one recipient. The GSAQG is not obligated to award the entire \$1,000 or any part thereof, if the quality of the proposals does not merit it.

**ELIGIBILITY**

- Applicant must be an active GSAQG member in good standing for the previous **two (2) years** immediately preceding the grant deadline.
- An applicant must show evidence of an interest in continuing to improve and innovate in the field of quilt design, construction, history or technique.
- Financial need will NOT be a criteria for selection.
- Grant recipients are ineligible to reapply for grants for three years. Grant committee members are ineligible for grants while serving on the committee.

**PROCEDURES AND DEADLINES**

- Applications must be submitted **on or before August 1** (current year), and the grant will be awarded at the following January Guild meeting.
- If the recipient fails to fulfill the requirements or is unable to attend the proposed project or program, the grant money must be returned within **three (3) months** of the cancellation, or on a time-line agreed to by the committee and the applicant. If an alternate applicant is available, the money may be transferred to the alternate with approval of the committee.
- Recipients must be willing and able to share with GSAQG the new skills, techniques, or information gained. This may be in the form of a presentation, a workshop or other process that disseminates the information to the members in **the year following receipt of the grant**. Scheduling must be coordinated with the 1st Vice President for Programs.
- If a workshop or program is being presented, **at a minimum of (3) three months before** the scheduled Guild workshop or program, a lesson plan and class sample will be presented to the Ethel Howey Chairperson, the 1st Vice President for Programs and one Guild member-at-large.
- Recipient must submit, in writing, a final report of the project and expenses **by March 1** of the year following receipt of the grant.

**GSAQG ETHEL Y. HOWEY GRANT PROGRAM APPLICATION PROCESS**

Following the stated time line, submit a typed or hand written application, not to exceed two (2) pages. Include the date, your name, address, phone numbers, email, number of years a GSAQG member, and explain:

1. Why you would like to receive this grant
2. How you will use the grant funds, including a specific budget
3. How you will share your new skills, techniques and information with the membership.

Feel free to provide any additional information that will help the selection committee.

### 7.16 Pieces of the Past, 75: *Princess Charlotte* by Ellen Hernandez



Princess Charlotte Augusta of Wales, 1796-1817, daughter of the unpopular King George IV of England, married German Prince Leopold in 1816. The wedding could be compared to that of Princess Diana and Prince Charles. According to Charlotte's own words found in the 1822 book, *Royal Correspondence, or, Letters between her late Royal Highness the Princess Charlotte and her Royal Mother, Queen Caroline of England during the Exile of the Latter*: "the whole population of London appeared to be waiting to catch a glimpse of me and my heart's best treasure, and when we made our appearance the shouts of the multitude rent the air...the important ceremony was performed with all the grandeur that can possibly be imagined...public rejoicings took place on the occasion all over the kingdom."



A commemorative textile panel was woven with an inscription documenting the event. Some of these original uncut medallion fabric pieces are in the Victoria and Albert Museum in London. Two period medallion coverlets feature the panel in the center. The one on the left was sold at Christie's in 2008 for \$3,660. The one on the right is in the New England Quilt Museum in Lowell, MA. Penney Tucker (American Quilt Study Group) was able to take a photo of the panel while at a lecture in England and had it reproduced on fabric by the company [www.spoonflower.com](http://www.spoonflower.com).



Princess Charlotte died one year after her marriage at age 21 when giving birth to a stillborn son. Had she lived she could have been the next queen of the United Kingdom. All of England mourned her death for a declared six months. Many memorial items were sold including jewelry and handkerchiefs.



Catherine Tebay added this memorial to Charlotte on her 1817 hexagon quilt: "This piece of Patchwork was finished two days previous to the Death of H.R.H. the Princess Charlotte." The quilt is in the New England Quilt Museum.



Ruth Finley named a block '*Queen Charlotte's Crown*' in 1929. This could have honored Princess Charlotte, or her grandmother, Queen Charlotte, wife of (mad) King George III. Queen Charlotte reigned during the Revolutionary War and many places in Canada and the US are named for her. The quilt block pattern was later called *Indian Meadow* according to a 1933 article by Nancy Cabot in the *Chicago Tribune*.
