The minutes were approved as presented in the June newsletter.

A nomination for Nancy Beasley to be awarded the Calico Rose was approved.

President Pro Tem – Virginia Oehlke will be evaluating the storage units and their contents in the next month.

Secretary – Karen Lambdin will be receiving a new guild phone in a few weeks, but meanwhile, the current phone is not being supported by the company and will be out of commission.

1st VP for Special Events – Elaine Staller. The quilt show challenge fabric will be sold at the meeting and the show logo has been designed. The next meeting will be after the August guild meeting.

Posters and bookmarks for the auction are ready to be printed from the website. There will be a label sewing session after the meeting.

Linda Kirk will begin sign-ups for Winter Retreat this month.

The Houston bus trip sign-up will begin in August.

Summer retreat went well and the venue will be used again next summer.

2nd VP for Information – Dea Jae Shore will present a short program, written by Ellen Hernandez, about Elias Howe, the inventor of the sewing machine in honor of his birthday.

3rd VP for Programs – Janet Miller reviewed the upcoming programs: July is the UFO program with 13 guild members presenting their UFOs, August is the auction program, in September Kathy Brown will be speaker with 2 workshops, and in October there will be three mini Christmas project workshops and a dyeing workshop. She outlined some of the programs for 2017 also.

Ethel Howey Grant

The Ethel Howey Grant was created by the Greater San Antonio Quilt Guild in 2006 to honor founding Guild member, Ethel Howey. The Grant is a monetary award that allows a Guild member to further their quilting skills and share these quilting skills with the Guild.

The deadline for the Ethel Howey Grant is August 1 and is open to any Guild members meeting the guidelines.

If you are applying for the Grant take the time to talk with Guild members, VP for Programs and previous winners to learn what skills/techniques are needed or wanted. Review national teachers the Guild has had in the past year so you don't repeat their teaching.

Please consider applying and giving back to the Guild.

**GREATER SAN ANTONIO QUILT GUILD, INC.
ETHEL Y. HOWEY GRANT PROGRAM**

MISSION

The Greater San Antonio Quilt Guild (GSAQG) has established a grant program in honor of a loved and esteemed founding member, Ethel Y. Howey, whose accomplishments and influence extended into the international quilt world. The grant is to encourage the pursuit of education in the study of quilt making and to recognize the importance of quilting in today's society as an art form, as an instrument of healing, as part of our legacy, and as a common thread which binds all in friendship.

PURPOSE

The purpose of the grant program is to fund projects that will have long term impact on preserving the heritage and further the art of quilt making. The grant may be used to cover expenses such as fees (including conferences, workshops, etc.), travel, lodging, meals, materials and books. The grant(s) will be awarded annually, not to exceed \$1000. The Grant Committee may divide the monies between more than one recipient. The GSAQG is not obligated to award the entire \$1,000 or any part thereof, if the quality of the proposals does not merit it.

ELIGIBILITY

- Applicant must be an active GSAQG member in good standing for the previous **two (2) years** immediately preceding the grant deadline.
- An applicant must show evidence of an interest in continuing to improve and innovate in the field of quilt design, construction, history or technique.
- Financial need will NOT be a criteria for selection.
- Grant recipients are ineligible to reapply for grants for three years. Grant committee members are ineligible for grants while serving on the committee.

PROCEDURES AND DEADLINES

- Applications must be submitted **on or before August 1** (current year), and the grant will be awarded at the following January Guild meeting.
- If the recipient fails to fulfill the requirements or is unable to attend the proposed project or program, the grant money must be returned within **three (3) months** of the cancellation, or on a time-line agreed to by the committee and the applicant. If an alternate applicant is available, the money may be transferred to the alternate with approval of the committee.
- Recipients must be willing and able to share with GSAQG the new skills, techniques, or information gained. This may be in the form of a presentation, a workshop or other process that disseminates the information to the members in **the year following receipt of the grant**. Scheduling must be coordinated with the 1st Vice President for Programs.
- If a workshop or program is being presented, **at a minimum of (3) three months before** the scheduled Guild workshop or program, a lesson plan and class sample will be presented to the Ethel Howey Chairperson, the 1st Vice President for Programs and one Guild member-at-large.
- Recipient must submit, in writing, a final report of the project and expenses **by March 1** of the year following receipt of the grant.

GSAQG ETHEL Y. HOWEY GRANT PROGRAM APPLICATION PROCESS

Following the stated time line, submit a typed or hand written application, not to exceed two (2) pages. Include the date, your name, address, phone numbers, email, number of years a GSAQG member, and explain:

1. Why you would like to receive this grant
2. How you will use the grant funds, including a specific budget
3. How you will share your new skills, techniques and information with the membership.

8. 16 Pieces of the Past, 76: Thread Winders, by Ellen Hernandez



Thread was once sold in skeins like today’s embroidery floss. Seamstresses found it helpful to wind the thread onto a flat shape where it could be secured and easily transported and referred to while working. The invention of thread winders made them quite popular in the 18th and 19th centuries. Many were of simple design and material. Some were elaborately carved and cleverly created. Smaller winders were used for silk and thin threads, and larger ones held heavier weight threads. Often they were part of sewing kit stored in decorated boxes.



Winders were made of silver, bone, mother of pearl, porcelain, cardstock, tortoise shell, abalone, glass, marble, jade, ivory, and wood. (See an example of each type below.) Today these winders are quite collectible.



The French company, Sajou, sold their linen thread already wound onto beautiful thread cards. The company is still in business and sells a line of vintage-styled cards online. Some use the cards as bobbins to hold a variety of colored yarns for intarsia knitting.

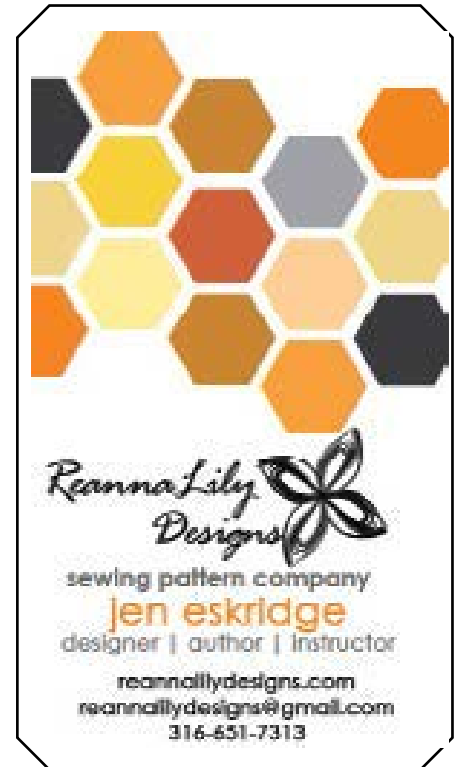
