TUCSON QUILT SHOPS

The first of January, Y2K, found me in Tucson, AZ, and what was I to do but check out the local quilt shops, get a pattern or two, buy a new gadget or fresh and interesting fabric? My New Year resolution is to get the bugs out of my creative corners!

There are actually three quilt shops in Tucson, but I only had time to visit two: The Quilt Basket and Precious Hands Needleworks. Next year, the third!

The Quilt Basket is a quilter's dream with 3,000 bolts of fabric in wondrous display. The walls of this spacious shop are lined with some familiar and many new patterns for quilts and quilted garments. They also have lots of books to entice you. The shop has a somewhat irregular shape with interesting nooks and crannies to wander into, including a large classroom with lovely finished items on display. The staff is friendly and helpful and were delighted to take my San Antonio money for several patterns and a booklet!

Precious Hands Needleworks has been selling my Texas Cutwork patterns for several years so I was anxious to visit them for the first time. They have a good selection of southwest patterns available (as does The Quilt Basket) and samples available to whet your appetite. Their fabric selection is smaller but adequate and they have a busy long-arm quilting machine at work in the shop. I came away with some interesting fat quarters for making up a foundation pieced Road Runner that I found at The Quilt Basket!

QUILTING TIPS

To avoid those fraying ends when you are trying to thread a needle (hand or machine), wet your thread and then cut so that both cut ends are wet.

If you have a difficult time removing the blue markings made by water erasable marking pens, your water may be too acidic. Add a couple of tablespoons of baking soda to your cold water spritzer. The marks will come out every time, and they won't reappear. This also works on some marks that have reappeared on quilts because of the acidity of the water.

JANUARY 8, 2000 MINUTES GUILD MEETING

The meeting was called to order at 10:00 a.m. by President Cathy Baisley. Minutes of the previous meeting were approved as printed. Treasurer Garnette Hanson reported balances as of December 31, 1999 as: Frost Bank, \$4,835.22; Jefferson State, \$35,410.26. Cathy recognized Linda Carlson, Calico Rose recipient.

The meeting was suspended at 10:10, and there was a demo of proposed sound system. Larry then gave a short demonstration on Y2K Quilting-- "What You Can Do on a Computer." and there was a demonstration on Electric Quilt IV. The business meeting was resumed at 11:14. First Vice President Marilyn Bellows requested volunteers for a chair and committee for the Pro Show to be held March 30-April 1. Janet Miller announced the Winter Retreat on January 14 - 16. Lois Reeh reported sign-up deposits were being taken for Summer Retreat to be held July 9 - 14 at Camp Lone Star. Trina Horvath will be the co-chair. Fashion Show Carol Bryant announced the show will be held Saturday, September 23 at the Adams Mark Hotel. Volunteers for committees were solicited.

Bernie Farris called for donations of quilts and finished blocks for the June Quilt Auction. Treasurer Garnette Hanson reported on her review of the books and assured members that the Guild's money is being judiciously spent. Jean Powell described the program available for youth at the Youth Opportunities Center. Program Director Larry Beauchamp announced sign-ups for two workshops by Jenny Raymond on February 11 and 12. Ruth Felty referred to Bylaw 7.20, requesting a final report on the 1999 Quilt Show. Garnette stated that no final report had been received by the board but she would be happy to answer any financial questions. Larry Beauchamp moved an expenditure not to exceed \$1,200 to purchase the sound system in use, consisting of two speakers, microphone and wireless microphone. Linda Kirk seconded the motion, which passed. Cathy presented the budget as printed in the newsletter, and Valerie Arcement moved approval of the budget. The motion was seconded by Kathy Kelly. After

brief discussion the budget was approved. The meeting was adjourned at 11:50 a.m. Kay Allison, Acting Secretary.

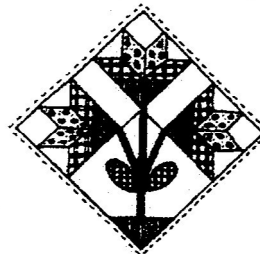

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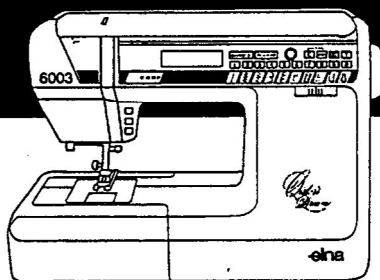
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PUZZLE THAT TESTS "MENTAL FLEXIBILITY"

COMMUNICATIONS

It has come to my attention that ex-members of the board are upset with the fact they were not furnished with the expenses/income figures of the quilt show. Those figures were given to the Guild Treasurer soon after the show. However, NO ONE EVER ASKED FOR MY COPIES (which are in the Quilt Show Book now in the hands of the next chairman.) Instead, it was brought up at the guild meeting, and caused me embarrassment by indicating I was trying to hide something from this guild. I have 2 phone numbers, an EMAIL address, and a working mailing address. No one has ever contacted me in any way to get these figures. The 2 1/2 years spent working on this show on the guild's behalf, and no common courtesy is extended to me?

The Treasurer files monthly reports to the board, and, having reported the numbers to her, she in turn would have reported them to the board. Rumors that spread during the planning stages that we had no vendors when in fact we had over 30 already paid for was an indication as to how the board treats its volunteers. All it took was a simple phone call to either the chair, co-chair or the volunteer in charge of vendors. No one was called until the rumor had spread, then the correct information was dispensed to members.

Guesses, supposition, innuendoes doesn't make for great communication between members--JUST ASK if you don't know--don't guess. The snide, underhanded way members are treated, it's no wonder the guild can't get volunteers. Hopefully, the incoming board members are a bit more considerate of who they're trying to represent and why.

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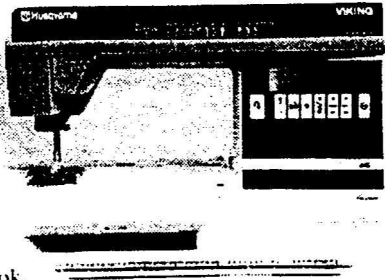

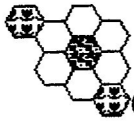
