Marilyn reported the Auction made a net profit of \$7,238.50. The Snappy Scrappers Bee won the Pre-Auction challenge voted on by the membership at the May meeting. They donated the \$100.00 back to the Guild and were given a round of applause.

Larry reported he is temporary Editor of the Newsletter and we are still in need of a permanent Editor.

Nadine presented a quilt that was partially quilted and asked for volunteers to finish it. Thanks to

those who volunteered.

Larry announced the programs for today and the upcoming months.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

Cathy Wallace reported on the OP's Centers Committee findings. She moved to close the present OP's Center and move out, either storing our items or finding a new, less expensive location. It was seconded and discussed. Amy Cottrell moved that this decision be tabled until all the choices could be published in the Newsletter and all the membership vote on it. 



Explore one-of-a-kind quilts made with photographs and other images that have been transferred to fabric in this one-hour slide presentation. Two styles of quilts are presented: scrapbook quilts which can accommodate any number of photo-transfers in just about any size, and quilts made with traditional blocks featuring one photo-transfer per block. Discussions include how to select photographs, copyright considerations, how to make transfers with transfer paper, and construction hints. Quilts featured are from Creating Scrapbook Quilts and Fun Photo-Quilts & Crafts, both by Ami Simms. A demonstration of Photos-To-Fabric<sup>™</sup> transfer paper is included if time and space permits.



## WORKSHOP FRIDAY-NOVEMBER 10 STRING QUILTING - \$35

Experiment with a technique quilters used years ago to make good use of every scrap they had on hand. You won't work quite as hard as they did and you'll come up with a terrific quilt top in a fraction of the time thanks to speed cutting and piecing techniques. Working with traditional block patterns, your quilt top will blend patches made from "stringed" fabric (narrow strips of fabric sewn together to make "new" fabric) with solid patches of either muslin or black. This is a great workshop for fabric you've already got on hand, no matter what color. Muslin and/or black cotton will be available in class. Bring quarter- or third- or half- yard pieces of pre-washed 100% cotton quilting weight fabric from your stash, color coordinated only if you wish. Variety is more important than quantity




