The Auction is the big money maker to help with Guild expenses and a profitable Auction is greatly influenced by getting the general public to participate and spend their money. For now I would like to make a few simple points. The general public will buy a variety of quality, finished items. Of course we also want to sell quilt tops and such to each other but the general public wants quality, finished quilt items. The Bee's do and should play a very important role in helping insure this. Everyone should feel empowered to invite friends, family and acquaintances to come and see the beautiful work that we do and encourage them to buy items. Anyone who wishes to help get the general public to the Auction should contact either Jean or Renée. I believe the ideal situation is to have the general public waiting in anticipation for the annual Auction. Long term having it every year at the same time and place goes a long way toward that goal. You can be sure you'll hear more from me of this topic

AUCTION BOUTIQUE

Items are starting to come in – Remember, you can use this to make “pin” money for yourself. Inventory sheets will be available starting at the next meeting.

QUILTER’S CORNER – We will have an area set up for quilters to add to their collections – so far people have suggested fat quarters, yo-yos, and I have seen (and used) scrap barrels and crazy quilt bags. So at MARCH and APRIL meetings, we will collect fat quarters – if each member would bring at least one cotton fat quarter – the one you don’t know why you bought — we could make a \$100 profit by selling them at \$1.

LET’S MAKE IT —

March meeting – after the meeting, we will make 3 different types of small pin cushions – stay as long as you like !!!! Bring sewing machine, several 6X6 pieces of fabric, scissors and basic sewing supplies.

Friday, March 23 11AM to 8PM — again stay as long as you like (call Kitty for location).

Diaper changing tote – (for 2) bring 1 yard of outer fabric to quilt (or a 22X27 inch piece of quilted fabric plus fabric for handles and pocket) ¾ yard of flannel, 2 20inch separating zipper and 2 large buttons. You will also need a sewing machine with a zipper foot, mat and rotary, and scissors. I will have batting.

UFO – does anyone need more??? At our last meeting, a member donated a box of them – mostly things to be stuffed with fill – toys, etc. They will be at the back table by Bright Hopes, if anyone gets the urge to finish. Those not picked up will be donated to Youth Alternatives.

SCRAP BATTING — Many of you discard the batting you cut off when finishing your quilts. If you can stand to have it around for a while, bring it to meetings and we will use it to stuff pillows, toys, etc.

February 5, 2001

Board Members present: Lois and Larry Beauchamp, Marilyn Bellows, Ida Tyson Blankenship, Renee Bradley, Rebecca Cook, Roberta Haby, Sylvia Jolet, and Betty Opiela.

President Betty Opiela called the meeting to order at 7:00pm. Minutes of the December board meeting were approved as written. Minutes of the January Board Meeting were corrected as follows: delete San Antonio Live Stock show and insert Southside Rodeo Event at South Park Mall. Minutes were approved as corrected.

Treasurer's report, presented by Betty Opiela, is as follows: Savings \$24,401.31; operating fund \$7,555.52; Total \$31,956.83.

Rebecca Cook was approved by the board to serve as Service Chairperson.

The Board discussed the following topics:

- 1) GSAQG will not participate in the Expo Exhibit this year due to a communication mix up. However, the guild will participate in 2002.
- 2) Doris Patterson is willing to copy the pattern library on compact disk. Board will ask Doris to research whether or not there are any legal implication in doing this procedure.
- 3) National Quilting Day is March 17th. Ruth Felty will set up a special display at the Hancock Store at Bandera and Huebner that day. Members will be encouraged to put up displays in other area fabric and quilting shops that day to celebrate the joy of quilting.
- 4) Letters to shop owners requesting donations for special events will be the responsibility of the chairperson in charge of the special event.
- 5) Marilyn Bellows will discuss with guild members their interest in the guild sponsoring a bus tour to the Houston Quilt Show in the fall. If there is sufficient interest the guild will consider sponsoring a bus tour. Past chairperson of this event, Janet Rutherford, has resigned.
- 6) Chairpersons are encouraged to get quarterly reports in to Board members.
- 7) Late arrival of the newsletter is due to the fact that the printer was two days late in getting the newsletter to the printer/mailler.
- 8) February program is a lecture entitled "Prescription for a Quilter" by Dr. Susan Delaney.
- 9) GSAQG and Alamo Heritage Quilt Guild will try to collaborate in the future to provide programs of interest to both groups.

Betty Opiela reported there have been no nominations for the Calico Rose award. She will encourage members to nominate deserving members.

There being no new business the meeting adjourned at 8:30 PM.


Betty Opiela, President, called the meeting to order.




Another reminder for you about dues policy! All dues paid prior to May 2000 are due as of January 2001.

DID YOU KNOW?

When making pieced blocks and quilts plan your pressing of seams as you go. We usually press toward the darker fabric. On some blocks you press so that two meeting seams will butt up against each other insuring beautiful corners. Be especially careful that you do not sew in twisted seams when joining rows of blocks. Never clip seams so they will press flat. This still leaves a twisted seam to mar your quilting and also adds a weak spot in your quilt. Whether it is your quilt or a QPC project you owe it to yourself to do good work. Practice only the best techniques.







APRIL PROGRAM


