How Many Pieces?

Hopefully by now you have decided on a design for the garment(s) you plan to enter into our style show. But just how do you begin the construction? Basically there are two methods of construction.

One method is to sew all pieces together making fabric then cutting the pattern pieces from this. Method one works well for uniform blocks such as squares, 9 patches, star blocks or similar patterns. Construct a piece of fabric for each pattern piece: a large one for the back and two smaller ones for the fronts. Cut out the pieces then put together according to the pattern directions.

The second method is to cut a muslin foundation piece for each pattern piece then begin mounting the blocks or patches to this foundation. Use the sew and flip method to hide the raw edges or cover the edges with braid, ribbon or bias tape. When using this method keep in mind where the seams will join so that your patches do not look chopped off.

Whichever method you use, have a good time and enjoy your creative side.

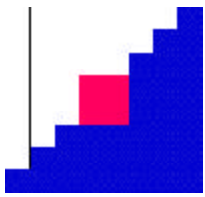
I am Helen Johnson and I have accepted the position of chairperson for the Auction Boutique.

March Program: Valerie Arcement and Diary Quilts

Thanks to Valerie Arcement for a lively and interesting program on creating a journal of your life (or just a bite-sized chunk of it) in a quilt. Valerie brought two of her diary quilts with her to demonstrate the endless possibilities of depicting events that touch us, both directly and indirectly. Some things she highlighted you could pick out on examining the quilt, the dog and bone for the passing of a beloved pet, for example. Others were not so obvious, but clearly had meaning for her, as with the lightning bolt which captured a heated argument. Then there was the rose for Princess Diana's death ... all marked a moment in time that will stir memories for years to come.



What will make "Postcards to Me" and "Postcards from Y2K" stand the test of generations, however, is the written journal that she kept as she made the quilt. Just a sentence or two describe each block: what it means and the date. She has used her larger quilt to pinpoint when her husband had an illness (both his and her memories had been off by several months). In several of her blocks, she'd included plants from her father's garden – all the more meaningful since he passed away. Years from now, her family will not have to guess what went through her mind when she put four different candles into the quilt – they'll be able to read her words. What a treasure to create, and how simple to do!

Valerie filled her talk with hints, recommendations and things to avoid, but perhaps the best advice was not to obsess over planning the quilt – simply to do it. Have a basic block, not too complicated, then start! It clearly worked for her, and years from now, when they ask her in the nursing home what she did during her life, she can say, "Just read my quilts."

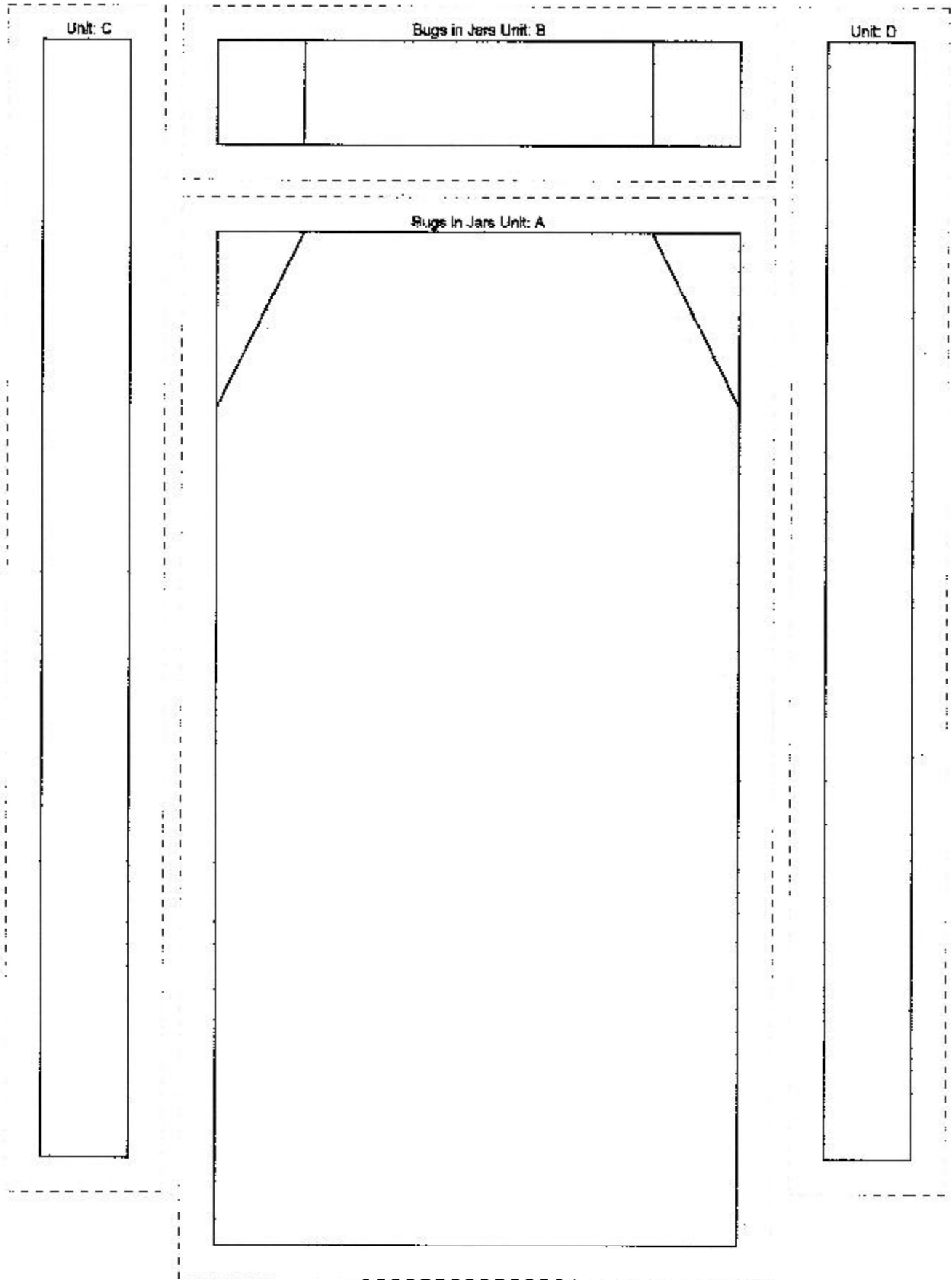
