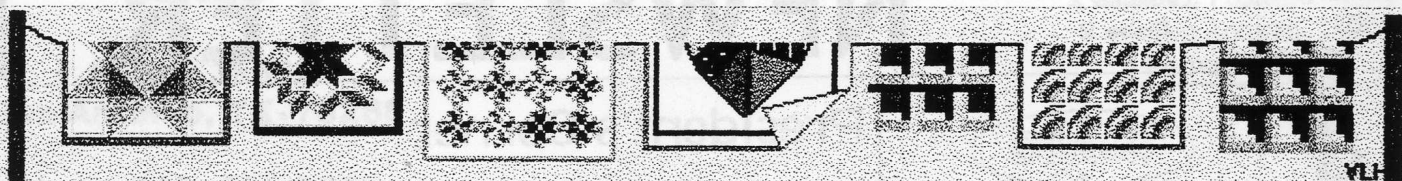

February Program.

Our guest speaker for February will be

M'Liss Rae Hawley

from Whidbey Island, Washington. M'Liss is the author of *Fat Quarter Quilts and More Fat Quarter Quilts*, and has another book being published in the Spring, *Everyday Embellishments, 8 Fun Quilts to Stitch and Embellish*. In addition to her trunk show during our guild meeting, she will be teaching two workshops.

- The first, on Friday February 7th, will be taken from her book *More Fat Quarter Quilts*, and students will select one of two quilts to create, either the Strait of Georgia or the Island Star. The focus of the workshop is to work with those delicious fat quarter packets we all collect from time to time! [All day, Cavender Buick @ I-10 and UTSA Blvd. \$35]

The second workshop, on Saturday after the guild meeting, will be a study in machine embellishment. Students will be working from her Cinco de Mayo quilt, taking a simple block and making a dramatic quilt through the artful use of a variety of embellishments. [Trinity UMC, \$25]

MARCH - BROWN BAG SWAP PROJECT.

We'll try something a little different for May – a way to help you stretch yourself by using someone else's color choices. Here's the plan:

- Bring 3 fat quarters of your favorite fabrics to the *March* guild meeting
- Jot a note with your name and some pattern or size suggestions, then put the fabric and the note in a brown paper bag (hence the name of the project)
- We'll put all the bags in a box, and randomly draw/distribute them again
- All you have to do is make something out of whatever is in your new bag for the person who owns it!
- The final product should be a quilt top, no smaller than 18"x18". (It need not be a finished quilt.)
- Who you draw should be kept secret, and we'll unveil the new quilt tops at the *May* guild meeting.

Minutes of Board Meeting January 6, 2003

Board Members Present: Larry Beauchamp, Ida Tyson Blankenship, Jo Chittenden, Karen Nanos, Janet Miller, Lari Jensen, Holly Nelson, Sharan McCall.

President: Larry Beauchamp called the meeting to order. The minutes were approved as written.

Treasurer: Karen Nanos. The following report was given:

Operating Fund: \$7,310.62 **Reserve Fund:** \$45,463.72 **Total:** \$52,774.34

The guild directory was discussed. The deadline for updating entries in the directory will be the February meeting. Those who are not current with their dues will not be in the next issue.

The position of **Parliamentarian** remains unfilled.

Larry solicited input and recommendations.

President Pro-Tem: Janet Miller. A new authorization card is needed for the storage facility due to the change of officers. Three members will have access: 1) Larry Beauchamp 2) Janet Miller 3) Lari Jensen. It was further suggested that the quilts in storage be examined and refolded.

Newsletter: Ida Tyson Blankenship. Due to late arrival of the Guild Newsletter to our members, we are looking for a way to improve delivery. Ida will research our options and let us know results.

Programs: Holly Nelson. Our program for January (Linda Carlson) has moved and we have not been able to contact her. Ida volunteered to fill the void at the last minute, if needed, with a program about her block-by-block technique of quilting by machine.

9-11 Internet Blocks

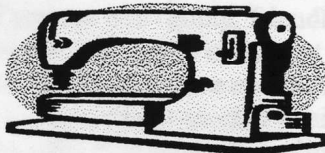
Oh, joy of all joys, the quilt blocks I brought home were made by beginners! Novices! No silk or particularly fancy fabric – just traditional cotton fabric sewn into simple blocks. They used templates to outline the pieces in pencil, then sewed them by hand.

I am reminded of an article in Quilter's Newsletter a couple of months ago. June Calender wrote about how she quilts for her own pleasure. She doesn't remove stitches or fret over whether her quilt would win a ribbon. She quilts because she enjoys it. That's all! That's a philosophy I can live with!

I would like for this small quilt to be presentable. But, with beginner blocks, I can do them justice with ordinary skills. What a pleasant afternoon I've spent sewing these together! How often does one get a chance to sew blocks that strangers sent to say, "I'm on your side", "Peace", "Love"?

I recommend that anyone who hasn't yet picked up a block or set of blocks consider making one of these small quilts. Working on it warms the heart!
