

As with the efforts to find a meeting place for April, guild members seem to come through when challenged. What we would like to see is less "last minute" activity and more "in advance" activity.

We have three major opportunities for member participation coming up.....and time is growing short for each of them. In June is our annual auction. **April's Program** was **Linda Cantrell**, who billed herself as an artist, teacher and award-winning quilter but somehow neglected to mention "humorist" in her list of accomplishments. Linda's quilts have stunned audiences (and judges) with their intricate appliqué and the detail of her story-telling. In her trunk show, she gave us an opportunity to examine, up close and personal, her sense of whimsy. Who else would have guessed that Elvis was really a bodyguard on the Jerry Springer show... Or that Sunbonnet Sue's "real" life story included a shotgun wedding... Or that so many tiny people on one quilt could be so many individuals?

Linda also taught two workshops, and we all learned a different method of using freezer paper to create different shapes for appliqué. One more tool in the toolbox!

**May Program** – The Brown Bag Swap Project (The Results). It will be interesting to see what our members have done with someone *else* 's fabric, steppin' just a little outside their comfort zones! If you are one of those who took a brown bag in March, please bring your completed project to the May meeting and pin the small form (that came with it) onto the back.

**June Program** – Every year we dedicate one program to one of our local area quilt shops. This year **Donna Gates** from **Las Colchas** will be doing a program on her **Texas Wildflower Quilt**. She'll be discussing the research she did on the various flowers as well as the different applique techniques she used.

**July Program** – July's guest will be **Kathy Kansier**. Born and raised in Wisconsin, Kathy's mother taught her simple embroidery stitches when she was 5. This was the beginning of her lifelong interest in all facets of sewing. She later developed an interest in antiques. This, along with her friendship with the Wisconsin Amish, sparked a love for quilts. As an avid quiltmaker, Kathy enjoys all types of quiltmaking techniques. Her quilts have won many awards and have been displayed nationally. She specializes in hand appliqué, three dimensional appliqué, and crazy quilts.

- Program: "Whatever Was That Judge Thinking?" Have you ever wondered why one quilt wins over another? Kathy shares the process of quilt show judging, what judges look for and why they make the decisions they do. Kathy shares easy tips to help you make award-winning quilts.
- Friday workshop: Grand Finales. Did you ever wonder how wide your quilt's border should be or what border design to use? Kathy covers all the basics to end your quilt project with a grand finale. Border designs, mitering, bindings, prairie points, scallops, labels, hanging sleeves and tabs will all be taught. Students will make a sampler of impressive edge treatments that can be used as a reference guide for their future grand finales.
- Saturday workshop: Victorian Crazy Quilt Stitches. This workshop is designed to teach basic embroidery, silk ribbon and beading stitches that can be included in crazy quilts, pieced and appliqué quilts and wearable art. Your sampler block of Victorian stitches can be later turned into a pillow or wall hanging. Kathy with share the history of crazy quilts during the session.



Suggested designs for the new quilt pin are being received.


It was decided that a Calico Rose will be given to Lucile Eggleston.


Services: Jo sent postcards to members stating that the meeting this month will be held at the University Methodist Church.


Treasurer: Karen reported that the cost for storage at Shurgard has increased to \$300.00 a month. Meeting was adjourned.






























# Greater San Antonio Quilt Guild Judged show

## \* Deep in the Heart" October 3, 4 & 5th, 2003 2003 Judged Show Rules:

- 1. **General Information:** Entry forms and fees will be accepted at guild meeting or by mail to: Diane Leclair, 9319 Laurel Grove, San Antonio, TX. 78250. Any question may be directed to Diane Leclair @ (210) 680-3020 or by email: <a href="mailto:dequilts@sbcglobal.net">dequilts@sbcglobal.net</a>
- 2. Entry Deadline: July 26, 2003
- 3. To ensure safety, a photograph of the entry must accompany the entry form. (Work in progress photos are accepted.) The entrant is responsible to insure their entry. Every effort will be made to assure your entry's safety. Neither the Chairpersons, GSAQG, Inc., nor Live Oak Civic Center management can be held liable for loss or damage to your entry.
  - 4. **Delivery point** Live Oak Civic Center: Tuesday, September 30<sup>th</sup>, from & 7:30am -11:00 am. It is the responsibility of the entrant to ensure their entry arrives by the specified time.
  - 5. All entries must be displayed for the entire show. No quilts will be removed prior to 6:00pm, October 5<sup>th</sup>, 2003.
  - 6.Quilt must be labeled in the bottom right hand corner of the back of the quilt, and must include the name of the quilt and the maker(s). All garments must be labeled.
  - 7. Bed quilt entries must have a 4" sleeve stitched securely to the quilt. Place the bottom edge of the sleeve no more than 90 "from the bottom of the quilt. If the quilt is shorter than 90", place the sleeve at the top of the quilt. (Quilt will not be displayed without a sleeve)
  - 8. Wall hangings will require a 2" sleeve across the top of the quilt. (Quilt will not be displayed without a sleeve)
  - 9. No rigid frames, mounting devices or special lighting may accompany the quilt.
  - 10. A maximum of 5 entries will be accepted per person, three of these may be designated for judging.
  - 11. Judged entries are not limited to guild members.
  - 12. Items previously judged in a GSAQG show will not be accepted for judging.
  - 13. The judged show committee reserves the right to re-categorize the entries, and reserves the right to limit the display of distasteful items.
  - 14. At the judges' discretion, first, second, third and honorable mention awards will be given in the various categories. All awards may not be given in each category, dependant on the quality of the entries. Best of Show, Viewers Choice, Judges Recognition and Founder's Award will also be awarded.






