President's Letter

First an example of my fingers typing faster than my brain working. Last month I noted that the Awards Ceremony for the quilt show would be at 5 pm on Thursday, October 2.

THAT IS INCORRECT! The date is right, but the time will be 7 pm.

The primary duty of the president of an organization is to act as a traffic cop and direct the activities of that organization while keeping his/her mouth shut. However, I am now going to violate that premise by making some comments regarding upcoming business of your guild.

At our January meeting you approved the formation of a "Long Range Planning Committee" to poll the membership for an answer to the question: "Where would you like to see the guild in five years?" The nine members of that group contacted 170 guild members. There were 79 "no contact" attempts. Now the report of that committee is published in this newsletter and they have asked for the opportunity to present their report to you at the August meeting. It will be presented during the announcement section of the meeting rather than the business section in order to forestall discussion and possible action on the report. The committee will be available following our program and free workshop to answer questions. Proposals based on the report will be presented for discussion and action at the September meeting.

As you read their report and listen to their presentation ask yourself how many of the suggestions fall within the duties of existing committees. If members feel that these committees are not fulfilling these duties should this not be brought to the attention of the board and should not those who believe more should be done be volunteering?

There are many "should do" suggestions in this report. Many of them quite valid, but it does no good to talk about what we should do without answering how ?and who?

I am concerned that many of these suggestions have not been made to the board and that this procedure is pre-empting the duties of the board. There are existing committees with the responsibility for many of the things in the report. Making a request to the board member responsible for these committees is the appropriate way to institute action.

Do the suggestions in the report really answer the question: "Where would you like to see the guild in five years?"

A process AND product workshop. All levels. ** \$10 materials fee, and Jackie provides ALL the cut strips for this workshop. [\$25, 1:00pm – 4:00pm]

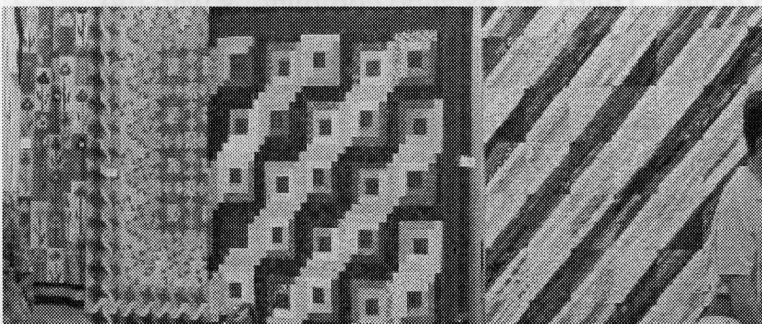

The meeting was called to order by Janet Miller. The minutes were approved as printed.

Treasurer's Report: Karen Nanos

Operating Fund: \$23,660.29, Reserve Fund: \$45,651.74 Total: \$69,312.03

Presentation of a Calico Rose was discussed.

Special Events: Mary Ruth Flores gave a report on the results of the auction. There were 55 items which sold for a total of \$7,502.50. Holly Nelson made a motion, the second by Candace Tull, to accept Renee Bradley as chairman for next year's auction. After discussion, a vote was taken and the motion passed. It was further stated that next year we will be required to pay for security at the auction.

Programs: Candace will handle the sign-up list Saturday for the KLRN Pledge Drive volunteers.

Parliamentarian: Candace is forming a nominating committee and will be looking for people to fill positions which will be vacated at the end of this year.

Old Business: Janet introduced Ruth Felty and Barbara Gilstad from the Long Range Planning Committee. Ruth handed out reports to board members of slides which will be presented to the Guild in August. The presentation will be a Power Point briefing using an overhead projector. The report will also be published in the August newsletter. There was discussion with questions and answers after the presentation.

New Business: As presented by Mary Ruth Flores, a motion was made by Holly Nelson, the second by Ida Blankenship, to approve an ad hoc committee for a Guild Auction Action Squad (GAAS). After discussion, a vote was taken and the motion passed.

Holly presented the challenge blocks from the Blue Bonnet Shop Hop, Las Colchas Shop, to Mary Ruth to be turned into a completed project for charity.

PLACES TO HIDE FABRIC

- 1) Fold it larger and put it evenly under the mattress - you can get an hundred yards under there! There's no chance the hubby will find it - how often does he make the bed?
- 2) You can also fold some and put it under each chair and sofa cushion.
- 3) Hang the yardage on a coat hanger, then cover it with a piece of clothing - hence, 100 coat hangers/100 yds of fabric! (3 closets = 300 Yards!)
- 4) Get a large trash can, remove the cover and have someone cut a round piece of plywood out for you. Put stash in trash can, put on wooden cover, place a pretty, 70 round tablecloth (or sew two 2-yard pieces together lengthwise and pretend its a tablecloth) on it - a beautiful lamp on top - And who's to know it's full of fabric? (A good way to hide the ironing, too!)
- 5) If you have a space under the bed, buy some of the flatter Rubbermaid tubs and fill them.

Larry announced the death of one of our members, **Lavonne Frizzell**. There will be a memorial service August 10th.

We have pins and raffle tickets for the quilt show available. August 9th is the deadline for entry forms to be submitted if you **plan to enter something in the show**.

President Pro Tem: **Janet asked members to please sign up to help at the quilt show**. There are sign up lists available today and many volunteers are needed.

Special Events: Mary Ruth said thanks to everyone involved with the auction and it turned out very well. Terri Ryan stated that there were 55 items at the **auction** and we cleared **\$6,207.00**. She also thanked everyone that worked as well as everyone that purchased quilts and gave support in other ways. The next auction date is June 26, 2004.

Mary Ruth talked about a new committee which is being established. It will be named the "**Guild Auction Action Squad**", (**GAAS**), and the purpose is to help with future auctions. They will do much of the busy work, such as collecting, organizing and finishing projects. This should free up the auction chairman to concentrate on the overall needs for the auction.

Barbara Wofford is setting up a **bus trip to the Houston Quilt Show**. If you are interested in going, please sign up. For more information, contact Barbara.

Newsletter: If you did not receive your newsletter, please check with Ida and we will try to find out why. It could be an incorrect name, address or unpaid dues. Tuesday, July 22, will be the next vest bee.

Meeting was adjourned.

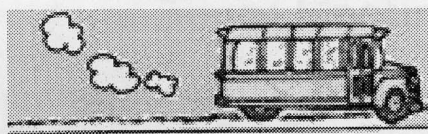

MIGRATE TO QUILT IS OVER! By Amy Cottrell, Chair

Our retreat at Camp Lone Star in La Grange, Texas was over on Friday, July 11. On Thursday night, one of the attendees said, "I wish it were starting tomorrow". I believe almost everyone felt the same way. The weather was wonderful - for Duckies. I believe we had about 2 inches of rain during the daily thunderstorms. It is a good thing our theme was birds. If it had been sunny weather, it might not have worked. For once, everyone was fresh to sew - we had teen-aged unloaders for two hours on Sunday and loaders for one hour on Friday morning. Our backs didn't hurt as much because Sherry Allred and Joanne Rich provided the means to have 3 raised cutting tables of different heights. Very popular!

On Tuesday, Quilter's Cottage from La Grange set up a ministore for our browsing and purchasing. Jackie Asbill joined us for lunch and some redwork stitching in the afternoon. Tuesday evening we had a five fat-quarter Chinese Gift Exchange. The theme was nature fabrics. The bubblegum contest on Wednesday afternoon was won by Joanne Rich (time bubble lasted) and Lani Nunley (size of bubble). The group project for Wednesday night was using crayons and the new permanent colored Ultra-fine Sharpies to produce quilt squares. It resulted in twenty-one 10 1/2" squares with birds on them. Creativity and quantity were won jointly by Jo Chittenden and Susan Johnson. Classes included pillowcases, making the base for cathedral windows on the sewing machine and a paper pieced bird and birdhouse wall hanging. Thursday after lunch an impromptu "gadget and hint" pot luck was held with almost everyone contributing. The show and tell on Thursday night was overwhelming in its scope and vastness. These short activities are designed to have aching bodies given a rest from constant stress while sewing.

We had a very major milestone. This was our 11th retreat at Camp Lone Star and the first time we did not have a power outage due to too many irons. Who said we didn't have a fast learning curve? I will send the retreaters a roster of attendees by email or snail mail (US Postal Service) next week.

Thank you to all who were at the retreat. I am now the proud owner of an autographed bird print pillowcase and a teddy bear with a Camp Lone Star shirt. The next retreat chair is Joanne Rich. See her article in the newsletter for more details of next year's retreat.

Fabric Swap - 5 inch squares

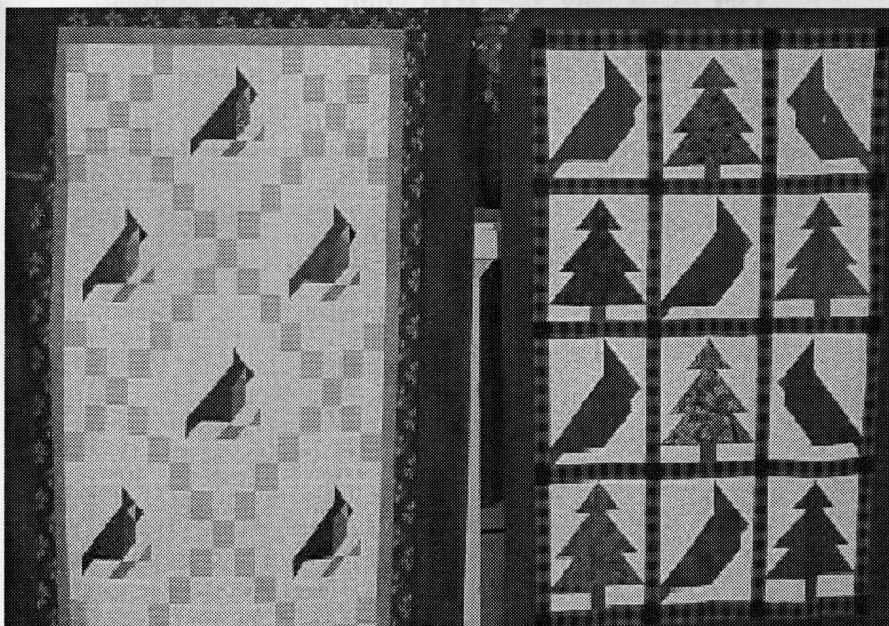

Susan and I are fascinated by the pattern book Nickel Quilts and propose a swap of 5 inch fabric squares. Our goal is to increase the variety of 5 inch squares for as many people as possible.

If you are interested in participating in the swap, follow these simple rules:

1. Fabric must be 100% cotton, medium to dark value, prewashed.
2. Cut the fabric into exact 5 inch squares.
3. Place 10 DIFFERENT fabric squares in a plastic bag.
4. You may turn in as many bags as you wish, just make sure that each bag contains 10 different squares.
5. You may duplicate fabric squares, as long as duplicates are in different bags.
6. Put your name in each bag.

You will receive the same number of bags as you turn in. Turn in the bags at the August meeting. Susan and I will sort them and return new fabric squares to the participants at the September meeting.

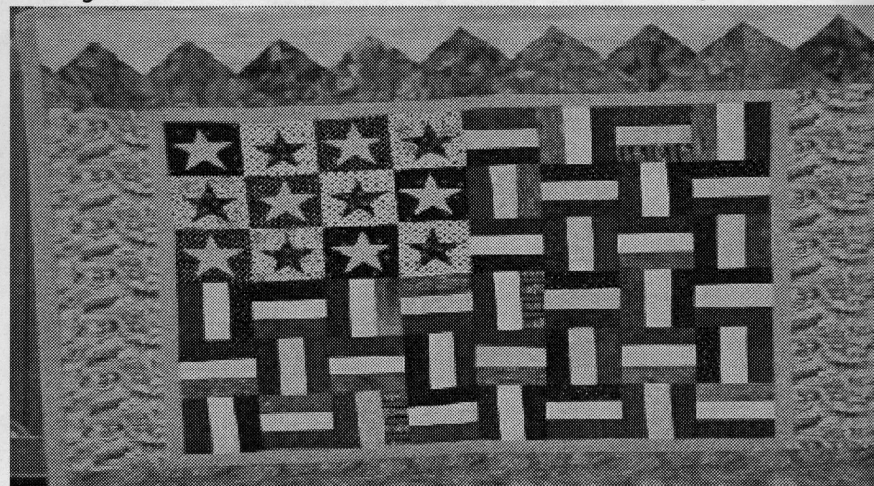

Final Report of the Long Rang Planning Committee

July 2003

Since the February 2003 meeting of the Greater San Antonio Quilt Guild, the Long Range Planning Committee has tallied, analyzed, and synthesized responses to the question, where would you like to see the guild in five years, gathered from 170¹ guild members. In the process of our work, the committee unearthed three major themes:

- Visibility of the guild in the larger community
- Structure, content and tone of monthly meetings
- Services to members and the public

Therefore, this committee offers four theme-related recommendations to members for their consideration and evaluation.

Recommendation #1

To provide greater visibility of the guild's primary purposes to stimulate an interest in quilting and to advance the art of quilting in the community at large. How? By: a) coordinating with other fiber art groups in the area, b) displaying quilts in public places, c) developing working relationships with local museums in conjunction with providing financial and volunteer support, d) using a variety of media to publicize guild events, and e) providing appropriate technical support for newsletter and website development.

Recommendation #2

To provide educational experiences for members and the general public. How? By: a) delivering more programs to schools, libraries, and organizations, b) providing demonstrations at monthly meetings, c) reducing the cost of classes taught by out of town guests for guild members, and d) paying local teachers to present classes and workshops on a sliding scale basis.

Recommendation #3

To provide monthly meetings in fun, friendly ways which support the guild's stated objectives. How? By: a) restructuring and streamlining the organization and flow of monthly meetings to provide more time for socializing and opportunities for members to participate in educational endeavors, and b) inspiring members to volunteer to demonstrate quilting techniques, tools and projects; to present mini classes; and to plan icebreaking activities for monthly meetings.

Recommendation #4

To increase services to members and the public for the purpose of encouraging greater overall participation in the guild. How? By a) concentrating on public service to the needy, b) expanding services facilitating attendance of members with special needs; c) developing a mentor system to encourage new members to become active in the guild, d) sponsoring more outside events, such as bus trips to quilt shows and quilt shops; e) researching potential solutions to the strongly expressed need for a home base; f) providing easier and greater access to guild resources, such as the library and equipment; and g) re-evaluating guild holdings.

This report was submitted to the GSAQG Board on July 7, 2003 by Ruth Felty, Chairperson.

¹ A concerted effort was made to contact each member of the guild listed in the GSAQG 2002 Directory, however, committee members were unable to reach 79 members.
