IT'S A SMALL (QUILTER'S) WORLD! by Mary McCarthy

On Tuesday, October 5^h, 2004, despite dire warnings of rain and a flood watch, GSAQG members Barbara Wofford, Barbara Gilstad, and Mary McCarthy met at Saint Gregory the Great School for a special presentation. The school librarian, Mrs. Davis, had received a set of quilts and books from the Storybook Quilts Committee. Among these items was a small jacket made to accompany the book <u>Coat of Many Colors</u> which is based on a Dolly Parton song. When Mrs. Watts, the pre-K-4 teacher, saw the name Barbara Wofford on the maker's label, she remarked to Mrs. Davis that her Home Economics teacher in high school had been a Mrs. Wofford. Could this be the same woman? Mrs. Davis determined to find out. She talked with Storybook Quilts Committee

member Barbara Gilstad and learned that yes, Barbara Wofford had indeed been a high school Home Economics teacher. Mrs. Davis arranged a surprise reunion.On the morning of October 5^h, Barbara Wofford waited to see if she would be recognized by her former student. And what had been Mrs. Watts' maiden name? As the 13 students filed into the library and took their places on the floor, a surprised Mrs. Watts (formerly Jo Hughes) warmly hugged her one time Home Economics teacher. It was a memorable moment.

Barbara Wofford gladly modeled her colorful vests for the children. First she wore

a bright vest made of patches cut from over 20 fabrics with cats on them. The children were especially intrigued by the folded stars Barbara had incorporated on the vest front. A Christmas vest featuring a large star and an embellished evergreen tree also fascinated the young students. Even the zippered garment bag made to carry the vests was well received. The children learned the difference between a vest and a jacket, recognized simple geometric shapes and identified colors. Barbara informed the students that a vest takes her about 20 hours to design and sew and that the materials cost about \$75.



As the children left, Mrs. Watts took the quilters on a tour of her classroom. Imagine their delight when they saw two quilts hanging on the back wall. The older quilt was made with fabric drawings by members of the class of 1995-1996. The newer quilt was made last year- tiny handprints stamped on fabric and framed in blue. When Barbara Wofford retired from teaching, friends encouraged her to join the quilt guild. She took classes with Judy Murrah and fell in love with patchwork jackets. She couldn't resist making the coat of many colors and so by serendipty was reunited with a former pupil. Isn't life wonderful?
