
Raffle Quilt







"Snowflake Cutout"


New technique for this block!! Snowflake - white-on-white Background - Lt. Blue - 61/2" Prepare a 51/2" square white-on-white fabric by fusing paper-backed fusible to the wrong side. Then fold it in half. Note the center. Now fold this into 3 segments, then 6. Cut at an angle across the top. Now cut designs into each folded side to produce a six-sided lacey snowflake. (Remember when we did this as kids?) Remove the paper backing (if you haven't already,) then fuse it to the block piece -- It.blue - cut 6 1/2" No sewing. (The winner can stitch as she chooses)

Please use all cotton, pre-washed fabrics.

Pin your name on a small paper tag for each block Turn in at the **January** meeting.

Make lots. Increase your chances to win. Have fun!
