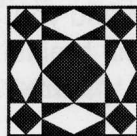

March Program & WORKSHOPS

Mini lessons and 99cents workshop !

Each of these experienced members will have about 15-20 minutes to update you on techniques, then you will move to another table.

What do mini workshops mean.?? Each of the four quilters have a station set up. Each person spends 20 minutes at one station, and then moves to another when time is called. There will be four time periods so each person can go to all the workshops, or repeat one if desired.

Following a lunch break, there will be two longer workshops. For 99 cents a person can make either a beaded scissor fob or a crazy quilt eyeglass case or needle case. Plus, you get to visit and exchange ideas.

You will have a chance to make a case for glasses or a phone OR use bead to make a scissor fob. Plus you get to work with all your friends (old and new) and have FUN. I have a roll of pennies to give change!!!!!!

April Special - Brown Bag exchange

There will be an exchange of 3 fat quarters and "in secret" someone will design something nice for you and you will design something nice for someone else.

You will need to bring your fat quarters to the April meeting.

April Program - Susan Johnson -

"Don't Toss it Yet." 99 cent workshop to follow

Susan will give a trunk show of quilts and items she has designed and give some hints as to how and why designs work. Susan's work has been featured in several quilt magazines and she usually has a ribbon or so at the quilt show.

During the afternoon, there will be another 99 cent workshop. Susan will work with people who stay to work on an "OTF" — off the floor — project. So everyone will not have to bring a lot of equipment, there will have a sign up sheet at the March meeting. Each person will be asked to bring a sewing machine (one that anyone can use) or rotary cutting equipment and a small bag (plastic grocery) of scraps. There will be three work stations — sewing, pressing and cutting and participants will spend some time in each. Each person should go home with a handful of squares to admire.
