THE SPECIAL QUILT

Do you have a special quilt? Most of us do. A grandmother or an aunt may have made it, or maybe it was purchased. Sources vary but the sentiment makes it special. You go to great lengths to take special care of this unique quilt by protecting it from light, pests and soil while it is on the bed but what about during storage?

- Oil from wood may cause brown spots so before placing the quilt on a shelf or in a chest, wrap it in muslin or a washed sheet.
- The safest way to store quilts is on a bed, in a temperature controlled environment and covered with a bedspread or muslin to protect it from light and dust.
- Quilts that must be folded should be fold in thirds, never in the center. Pad the folds with acid free paper that has been crumpled or formed into a roll. When possible, roll the quilt rather than folding and store in a dark place.
- Stored quilts should be aired on a regular basis, at least every six months. When possible allow the quilt to lay flat for a few days then refold along different lines.
- Wash only when necessary, using special procedures outline in one of many books on quilt care.
- The most common cause of damage to quilts is pets or mice.

Our guild has many special quilts. They are stored in acid free boxes, in a temperature controlled setting. However, they are seldom aired or refolded. We are looking for quilt angels to provide this service. Janet Miller has volunteered to serve a chair of a "Tender Loving Care" committee (TLC) would you like to help give our special quilts some tender loving care? If so contact me at 688-2288.

FEBRUARY

Our meeting on Saturday, Februay 12 is "Looking Ahead with Margaret Miller'. "A refreshing lecture (all quilts, no slides!) which is an inspiring view of what it means to be a quiltmaker in the 21st century. More than just how to store Fabric and find time to quilts, this is a chance to take a look at 'the big picture' of how quiltmaking fits into – and fuels—our lives. Many old and new quilts made by Margaret illustrate the lecture".

Workshop is "Angle Play" on Friday, February at Cavander Buick from 9:30AM – 4:00PM and then continued on Saturday from 1:00PM to 4:00PM at Horizon Church. In this workshop students explore the creative possibilities for a classic shape: the half-rectangle triangle. This shape is versatile because of the "change in the angle" it brings to the pieced surface: no more are quilters restricted to 90 and 45 degree angles only! Day one is design, based on blocks as well as modules; day two is creating with fabric. Students come away with hundreds of design ideas and a quilt top under way. They will never look at patchwork design in quite the same way again!

One of our newest quilt shops "Memories by the Yard" will have Doug talk to us about "Solving the Problems of Stain Glass". They will have kits available as well as other items. They will also do a 'make and take' project following the meeting. This will have a small fee attached. More data on this next month.

New board members were introduced. She announced Carla Schladoer will receive a Calico Rose for her work and dedication to GSAQG in 2004. Special Events: The VP vacancy still exists and attendees were asked to consider the position and volunteer. In addition, anyone interested in coordinating the Houston International Quilt Show trip was asked to contact Ruth. De Leclair stated the Raffle Quilt would be traveling to the Dallas Quilt Show, and asked for volunteers for upcoming shows. Categories, rules and entry form copy are printed in the January 2005 Newsletter.

The opening for Auction Chair has been filled by Holly Nelson and she was presented the first quilt for the auction.

Kris Thomson reported plans are complete, everyone has paid and they are looking forward to beginning the Winter Retreat January 14.

New Business: Amy Cotrell moved to donate \$1000 to the Tsunami Disaster Relief Fund through the Salvation Army. Motion seconded by Cathy Baisley and passed. Ruth announced Lorraine Jensen and Ethel Howey had passed away in December. A moment of silence was observed for these former members.

Please Note: No bills or reimbursements can be made without original bill or receipts.


Payment of Bills received by Guild members other than Treasurer

- 1. Appropriate Board Member will verify that bill is valid.
- 2. The Board Member will sign their name and date on the bill that it is ready for payment.
- 3. The Board Member will submit the bill to Treasurer for payment within 14 days of receipt of the bill.

Reimbursement for expenditures made for the Guild

- 1. The member making the reimbursement request will attach the original receipts for the expenditures to the Reimbursement Request form.
- 2. The member will submit the reimbursement request to the Board Member who is in charge of their committee/activity/ program.
- 3. The Board Member will sign that the reimbursement request is valid and all required receipts are attached.
- 4. The Board Member will submit the reimbursement request to the Treasurer for payment within 14 days of the incurring of the expense.

The eighty quilters who stayed for the games at the Guild Christmas Party each received 4 fat quarters with a theme (red, yellow, blue, stripe, etc.). All were cotton and many were adult print flannels as opposed to cartoony flannels.

With the "OK" of De Leclair, 2005 Quilt Show Chair, I issued a challenge to the game players, the results of which will hang in our 2005 show whose theme is, "A GARDEN OF QUILTS".

CHALLENGE:

MAKE A FINISHED QUILT OUT OF YOUR FAT QUARTERS. YOU MAY ADD ONE (1) ADDITIONAL FABRIC AND ONE (1) NEUTRAL OF WHITE, BEIGE, CREAM, GREY, BROWN OR BLACK. THE MAXIMUM SIZE IS 36" ON A SIDE. ALL TECHNIQUES ARE OK AND. THE QUILT MAY BE QUILTED OR TIED.

OBJECT OF CHALLENGE:

- 1. Have fun
- 2. Be Creative
- Demonstrate to the show attendees the difference that pattern can make using the same fabrics. There were 10 different sets of fabrics at the party. The display will highlight pattern and neutrals as influencing the appearance of a quilt as much as fabric selection.

RESULTS OF CHALLENGE:

- 1. Ribbons: Maybe
- 2. Prizes: Maybe
- 3. The undying gratitude of the Quilt Show Committee: Definitely

A quilt guild in Virginia initiated a program to make and present a quilt to each military person as they returned to US soil. The need for quilts soon outgrew their capability; therefore, a call went out to others for help. Kalico & Keepsakes Quilt Shop in Lytle, TX (just south of San Antonio) responded to the call. Since midsummer the Wednesday Quilting group, named the Lytle Stitchers, has been making and sending lap quilts and walker bags.


