Based on the response from the membership at the last business meeting, the auction is to be held in even-numbered years. <u>Community Outreach</u>: A copy of the 2006 third quarter activity and job description updates dated Spring 2006 were submitted.

<u>Parliamentarian</u>: The names of incoming officer nominees were presented. A ballot box will be used to vote at the business meeting.

<u>Unfinished Business</u>: Board members were asked to remind their committee chairs to complete work on updating their job descriptions. The Calendar of Work was discussed and revisions were made. Dea Jae will distribute 2006 Meeting Minutes and Treasurer's Report CD to all new officers. Judith Miller will organize a committee for the Christmas Program.

New Business: Dea Jae will provide CDs to all current officers.

# Tips & Hints by Holly Nelson

- If you use regular photocopy paper for paper piecing, very lightly mist the paper with water before tearing it off. This makes it easier to remove and less likely to rip out your stitches.
- To keep from having to match corners of your quilt blocks, stagger the blocks and use a half-block at opposite ends of each row.
- To keep your bobbin and thread spools together, use a twist tie up through the thread spool, through the bobbin hole and a quick twist and no more digging around for a match. The twist ties that come with garbage bags are long enough for most spools.

#### A letter from Renee Bradley

#### Greetings:

First, I want all of you to know that you are truly family to me. Thank you so much for all of your monetary donations, cards, quilted gifts, and phone calls. A special thanks to Charlotte Keener for her donation of the raffle quilt. Of course now I have a picture of the quilt that I will always cherish.

It has almost been a year since I left you all in San Antonio. Your generosity brought me to Shepherd Center, which is the best spinal cord rehabilitation facility in the United States. I have come a long way from my stay at the University Hospital in San Antonio. Many of you have received detailed information from Cassandra. I wanted to tell you that I am eating every thing I want, pushing in my wheel chair and dressing myself slowly. I learned how to become independent in the Boot Camp of the Shepherd military base. Tee Hee. I'm an official chair user. Although am not comfortable in the chair and maybe that is an indication that I will be out of this thing in a year!

As far as sewing, I have an adaptively made sewing pouch to insert my foot peddle underneath my arm in order to sew. A fellow chair user, Chris, made the pouch for me. Chris sews and heard that I was a quilter and later came to see me in the hospital. Afterwards I my Recreational Therapist, Raye, practiced with me using the pouch in one-on-one sessions. It really does work you can sew with a foot peddle under your arm so maybe they should call this a "Pit Peddle". I have not had much time to sew as Jessalyn and I hang out at the gym exercising, taking care of bills, and doctor's visits. The Atlanta traffic is so heavy that this takes precise planning to get anywhere. My compute from the house to Shepherd is about 30 minutes IF we leave at the right time of day. If we leave during rush hour it may take 1 ½ and that is only if there are no accidents. Whew!

Living here with Cassandra and Mr. Rickie dog (now in doggie heaven), has been a blessing and a joy! I have created total hell and chaos in this house although. I have nicked the walls, knocked over things in my wheelchair, and put black marks on the walls, run into cabinets, broke the china tea pot, and scratched the

furniture. All and all Cassandra still loves me and never complains about this. This does not mean that you will get out of inviting me to your house! No, you can not invite me over and leave me outside, just get ready. You can pad and move your furniture but I am coming in anyway.

I have been able to go to cultural events like viewing the Quilts of Gee's Bend, an historical black quilt museum in Underground Atlanta, and the Atlanta Symphony. I have attended the Piedmont Park Jazz Festival and the Acworth Pioneer Days picnic and park events. Even attend the local Spinal Cord Injury Summit in downtown Atlanta for 2 ½ and stayed in the Omni hotel. All of the chair users were accommodated with very plush and adaptive rooms.

I am homeward bound on October, the 22nd, and now have so much titanium in my body that will definitely set off the airport security alarms. The titanium in my body makes me almost the "Bionic Women".

Again, thank you for all that you have done and hope to see you soon.




# January 2007 BLOCK PARTY
