

# Board Meeting Minutes November 6, 2006

Board members present: Ruth Felty, Dea Jae Shore, Larry Beauchamp, Lois Beauchamp, Judith Miller, Barbara Gilstad, Sandy Mehall and Teresa Tijerina. Mary Mc Carthy and Karen Nanos were absent. Lori Branson and Bobbie Ashley attended.

President: The meeting, held at the St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church, was called to order at 5:00 pm. The October Meeting Minutes were approved as published. Sandra Retzloff will receive a Calico Rose for her work with Storybook Quilts and other guild projects. A motion was made to donate \$25 to the United Methodist Church for the use of their quilting facilities for our guilt-in; the motion was seconded and the motion carried. There will be a meeting for all committee chairs after the Saturday meeting. A discussion followed on the storage of the magazine library. A motion was made to eliminate the magazine library by continuing the sale of magazines to members, the motion was seconded and the motion carried. The recommendation will be presented Saturday to membership for approval.

<u>Secretary</u>: Twenty calls were received in the last month and three thank-you letters were mailed for donations to the guild.

<u>Special Events</u>: Janet Miller and Holly Nelson will be invited to provide a verbal report on the Quilt Show at the December meeting.

<u>Newsletter</u>: The Work Calendar continues to be revised and updated.

<u>Programs</u>: The Jennie Rayment Program and Workshop are scheduled this week.

<u>Services:</u> Judith is still awaiting word from facility officials of St. Andrews on the contract renewal for regular meetings and possible use as location for the Guild Auction. She also gave a report on the plans for the Christmas Program.

Community Outreach: The librarian from the Great Northwest Public Library e-mailed the guild to ask if we can sponsor quilt classes once a month and display Storybook Quilts during the Summer. A motion was made to follow-up on this e-mail, the motion was seconded and the motion carried. A motion was made to donate the patriotic quilt initiated by Amy Cottrell to the Blue Star Mothers of America, the motion was seconded and the motion carried.

<u>Parliamentarian</u>: The election of incoming officers will be conducted at the Saturday meeting.

Unfinished Business: Board members were asked

to remind their committee chairs to complete work on updating their job descriptions.

New Business: The guild has been invited to participate in the San Antonio Museum of Art presentation of the "Art of the Needle" exhibit which will be held February 4 through March 25. A motion was made to participate in this function during the first and second weekend of February, the motion was seconded and the motion carried. This will be presented to the membership for approval at the next meeting.

<u>Special Events</u>: A chair is needed for Advertising for the 2007 Quilt Show, anyone interested is asked to contact Janet Miller.

<u>Newsletter</u>: Members were reminded to check the due date of their dues if not receiving the newsletter in the mail monthly.

<u>Programs</u>: Jennie Rayment is presenting her program today; forms are available for the first Ugly Quilt Contest in January today, there will be no entry fee, and entry forms are due in by January 1.

Services: Secret Sisters will have their breakfast 9

a.m. to 10:30 a.m. with the Christmas Program beginning at 11 a.m. All were encouraged to sign up for the potluck.

Community Outreach: The Patriotic Quilt initiated by Amy Cottrell has a home with the Blue Star Mothers of America, San Antonio Chapter, and will be displayed at all of their functions. Debra Pavelka's position as the Chair of Bright Hopes will be vacant as of January 1 and anyone interested is to call Debbie. The Community Response Committee received a thank you from the San Antonio Children's Museum for the quilt they received last month. They also were informed that Jefferson Outreach yielded \$250 for the quilt donated to them.

Renee Bradley was in attendance today and thanked everyone for their well wishes and all that was done for her.

Parliamentarian: The election of officers includes: President, Bobbie Ashley, 2nd V.P. Dea Jae Shore, 4th. V.P. Bernie Ferris, 5th V.P. Barbara Sumlin and Secretary Lori Branson. A motion was made to accept the new slate of officers, after a show of hands, the slate of officers was accepted by acclamation; and the motion carried.

Unfinished Business: The GSAQG was asked by the San Antonio Museum of Art to participate in their 2007 exhibit from the Shelburne Museum. A motion was made to participate in this event, it was seconded, and the motion carried. Lori Branson will coordinate our efforts with the SAMA. A meeting will follow today's meeting of all committee chairs to discuss the guild's contracted storage facility. The magazine library was discussed and a motion was made to delay action on this issue until February, it was seconded and the motion carried. 
# Tips & Hints by Holly Nelson

- 1. Aah, December, and the last of the Tips & Hints. Whew!
- 2. If you're combining flannel and regular cotton in a quilt and you pre-wash your fabrics before piecing, wash the flannel twice. It will shrink a little again, but should then behave more or less like your pre-washed cotton (shrinkage-wise).
- 3. Pick a quilt you want to make and cut a few pieces for it with every project you make. It'll be a good record of the quilts you've made.
  - 4. Machine quilting? If you want your design to stand out, try using one or more of these:
    - Contrasting color of thread
    - Thicker weight thread
    - 2 threads at the same time or
    - Go over the design again.

Alternatively, to have the design sink into the background:


- Match the color of thread to the b/g
- Use a finer thread.
- 5. If you're appliqueing a sharp curve or tiny circle and have trouble getting your stitches small enough, go back over the area a second time placing your stitches in between your first ones.




