

QPC Challenge: Quilters' Library
If you wrote your autobiography, what would
you put on the cover? What would the title be?
What would make your friends or family think of
you?

- a favorite quilt block - a favorite technique or style, i.e., appliqué, pieced, embroidered, other - a favorite color - do you tend to use the same colors? - a quilt block with a name that means something to/about you – i.e., Crazy Anne (just joking)


Use any technique — pieced, applique, embroidered, painted, embellished, etc.

Include your first name on either the cover or spine (stitched, written with permanent ink, painted)

A Title for your book is optional Back cover may have a design or be left blank

Background will be black and pages will be white. (You provide the fabrics for the cover and spine in whatever colors you want.)

(Sort of what the block looks like.)



The block is one by Georgia Bonesteel. It is an open book standing on end with the front and back covers facing. The kit will have the pattern, fabric for the border and book pages. Also we'll include some ways to change a square design to a diamond.

Deadline: turn in blocks by or at the February 2010 meeting. Voting will occur at the March 2010 meeting.

Cost: \$1.50 — to be used for prizes.

A Legacy of Quilts: The Briscoe Center's Joyce Gross Collection, on exhibit at The Bob Bullock Texas State History Museum will be the first public exhibition in Austin of the Gross Collection from the Dolph Briscoe Center for American History, The University of Texas at Austin. The exhibit spans more than 100 years of this enduring American art form and features 29 quilts made approximately between 1844 and 1950, as well as antique fabrics. Each of the guilts in this exhibit is an expression of one of America's most beloved artistic traditions; each is a story written with fabric, needle, thread and loving hands. Included in the exhibit are award-winning guilts from the 1930s, red and green appliqué quilts that were popular in the mid-19th century, a Hawaiian flag quilt and two remarkable album quilts.



San Antonio's Children's Center

Alyse Lilie, Volunteer Coordinator from The Children's Center, presented an overview of the programs sponsored by the Center. The Center has been in existence since 1901. Three areas that fall under the umbrella of the Center are placement, residential, and preventative. Residential is for children who fall into the high-risk category and are in need of immediate protection. Placement is for children who may be returned to their parent(s), placed with foster parents, and/or adopted out to caring families. Two of the preventive programs are:


- Nurse/Family Partnerships whereby a nurse is assigned to a first time mother who qualifies for Medicare. While monitoring the health of mother and infant the nurse also teaches child care and parenting skills.
- Project MAS (Mothers & Schools) whereby young mothers or soon to be mothers continue their education and learn child care and

parenting skills. Day care is provided while the young mothers are in school.

All of the programs focus on the protection of the child and providing education to the mother.

The quilts provided by the guild may go to any of the programs above. Each child leaving the Center is provided a kit which includes a quilt, two books, three sets of clothes and toiletries.

The center is in need of volunteers, children's clothing, books, etc. You may contact Ms. Lilie at 212-2508 or take donations to 2939 W Woodlawn Avenue, San Antonio, Texas 78228.

MISSION

The Greater San Antonio Quilt Guild has established a grant program in honor of a loved and esteemed founding member, Ethel Y. Howey, whose accomplishments and influence extended into the international quilt world. The grant is to encourage the pursuit of education in the study of quilt making and to recognize the importance of quilting in today's society as an art form, as an instrument of healing, as part of our legacy, and as a common thread which binds all in friendship.

PURPOSE

The purpose of the grant program is to fund projects that will have long term impact on preserving the heritage and further the art of quilt making. The grant may be used to cover expenses such as fees (including conferences, workshops, etc.), travel, lodging, meals, materials and books. The grant(s) will be awarded annually, not to exceed \$1000.

ELIGIBILITY

- · Applicant must be an active GSAQG member in good standing for the previous two
- · (2) years immediately preceding the grant deadline.
- An applicant must show evidence of an interest in continuing to improve and innovate in the field of quilt design, construction, history or technique.
- · Financial need will not be a criterion for selection.
- Recipients must be willing and able to share with GSAQG the new skills, techniques, or information gained. This may be in the form of a presentation, a workshop or other process that disseminates the information to the members.
- Recipient must submit in writing a final report of the project and expenses by March 1 of the following year.
- If recipient fails to fulfill requirements any advanced funds must be returned.
- Grant recipients are ineligible to reapply for grants for three years. Grant committee members are ineligible for grants while serving on the committee.

PROCEDURES AND DEADLINES

Applications must be submitted on or before November 1 (current year), and the grant will be awarded at the following January guild meeting. The grant recipient's final report is due by March 1 of the year **after** the grant is awarded.







The **Turkey Giblets** block first appeared in Nancy Cabot's syndicated newspaper column in 1938. The design works well when stitched in two contrasting colors. Let's do browns and oranges. It is simply 8 equilaterel triangles with 2 inch tips. The block is 12 inches finished. That's 12.5 inches unfinished. See Pattern on page 12.
