MISSION

The Greater San Antonio Quilt Guild has established a grant program in honor of esteemed founding member, Sherry Allred.

PURPOSE

The purpose of this grant program is to allow a current guild member to attend the current year's GSAQG Summer Retreat at no charge to the member for enrollment. The grant must be used for the cost of Summer Retreat only. The grant will be awarded annually, not to exceed the cost of Summer Retreat. If the grant recipient has made any payments toward the Retreat costs such payments shall be refunded to the recipient.

ELIGIBILITY

- 1. Applicant must be an active GSAQG member in good standing for the previous two (2) years immediately preceding the grant deadline.
- 2. Financial need will not be a criterion for selection.
- 3. Grant recipients are ineligible to reapply for grants for three years.
- 4. Board members are ineligible for grants while serving on a GSAQG board term.
- 5. Current board members will vote at the April Board meeting. The president will retain all personal information for each application; a blind vote will be based on the written paragraph only submitted by each applicant.

Pieces of the Past: Needles

"The pen, the plough, the sword to man we leave, But ours the needle from the days of Eve."

The oldest bone sewing needle, found in France, is estimated to be over 25,000 years old. In ancient Egypt needles were made from copper, silver and bronze. The oldest iron needle, found in Germany, dates to 300 BC. Many other items were used for needles - ivory, hog bristles, porcupine quills, and the pointed end of agave leaves.

Metal needle making was perfected by Muslims in Spain in the 11th century. When they were driven out in the 15th century, they took their needle making knowledge to Arab lands. Traders brought the Arab skills back to England in the 17th century, and the district of Redditch became the center of needle production for the world in the 19th century.

Today, needle making is a protected process, done mostly in China, India, Germany and England. The only hand sewing needle made in America was recently invented by Pam Turner. Featured on ABC Nightline, her easy side threading Spiral Eye needle won't damage thread. These can be purchased directly from Pam, or found in Hobby Lobby, Nancy's Notions, and Herrschners.

Odd but true: The British developed and tested sewing machine needles as poison darts to be dropped from planes during World War II. When the cluster bombs of 30,000 needles were dropped from high altitudes, they could penetrate two layers of clothing and six inches of flesh.

Memorial for Eleanor Astor Wright February 1, 2010

Eleanor Wright's love of quilts and quilting was a major part of her life. Her many years of activities with the San Antonio Quilt Guild brought her much joy and lasting friendships.

As a celebration of her life, her sister, Leath, would like to establish a memorial in Eleanor's name with a donation of \$15,000 to the Greater San Antonio Quilt Guild, Inc. Attached is a check for \$10,000 and an additional check for \$5,000 will be sent in 2011.

It is the family's desire that those funds be spent at the rate of \$1000 per year for the next 15 years. In order to benefit the largest number of quilters, they would like the funds to be spent to bring in a major presenter who will give a guild program and conduct related class/classes. There should be no charge to the members who participate in this particular activity.

I would also like to take this opportunity to extend special thanks Ruth Felty and Susan Bradley who spent many days sorting Eleanor's "Treasures" and getting them to groups who could use them. Additionally, I would like to thank all those who donated to the memorial. Eleanor would be so pleased!
