

Common Threads Pieces of the Past: Quilt Kits (or, Everything Old is New Again!)

Imagine being a young housewife in the early 20th century receiving a project in the mail that cost \$5.00 (about \$55 today.) There would be pieces of solid pastel cottons, a paper diagram, and depending on the pattern, a large muslin rectangle marked with



blue lines, or pre-cut shapes or shape patterns. Put it all together and you would have...a beautiful pieced, appliquéd, cross-stitched or embroidered quilt.

The first quilt kits were not pre-stamped. They had a perforated paper pattern and stamping powder which were used on a sheet of cotton background fabric. Kits developed over time, with the more common kit consisting of stamped fabric with appliqué marks and quilting lines. The appliqué shapes were stamped to be cut out, and later die-cut pieces were included. Two other types of kits were the cross- stitch and the trapunto whole cloth.

Some viewed quilt kits as cookie-cutter, uncreative and unimaginative, "suitable for a convalescent, needing no thought." Everything was pre-determined: size, color, placement, and finishing. In today's market, vintage quilts from kits are valued from \$300 to \$2000.



Kit designers, including Ladies Art Company, Wilkinson Quilt Company, Marie Webster and her Practical Patchwork Company, Mary McElwain, Anne Orr, and Ruby Short McKim were early female entrepreneurs. Marketing was via pamphlets, newspapers, and magazines such as *Ladies Home Journal, House Beautiful, Needlecraft,* and *Good Housekeeping* and stores such as Marshall Fields, Sears, and Montgomery Wards. The small companies led to the success of larger kit producers, such as Herrschner's, Bucilla, Paragon, and Lee Wards.



No quilt guild or class was required with a kit. Because the kits were low cost, many could enjoy them. In fact, during the Depression, the John Michael Company offered a pay-as-you-go for Trip Around the World, offering all 5,285 pieces for \$5.00 or 25 cents to \$1.25 for each remaining set of colors over time. Quilts for children were especially popular with nursery themes and Sunbonnet Sue. Marion Newton sold her children's designs through her company called Story Book Quilts.

Current quilt historians now view quilt kits as the impetus for quilting creativity through the 20th Century, providing a starting point, experience, confidence and inspiration. Vendors make a bundle selling modern kits often consisting of pre-cuts from a line of 20 or more coordinating fabrics. With Accu-Cut it's even possible to make your own kit of uniform pieces at home. What's old IS new again.

Needs List - Sandra Bloom - A Bag for all Occasions

The bag we will be making in November is a large - 20 inch - carryall, lined, lightly quilted, and reversible, is from Kwik Sew Pattern #3612. It is made from eight squares, has elastic in casings on two sides and casings for fabric-covered cording handles, set on opposite sides.

Materials Required: Eight fat quarters or eight pieces of fabric 18" x 18" each a different color or cut two pieces of four different fabrics. One piece of fabric for handle, 4" x 32".

Notions: Fabric and thread; 1 36" square of batting, preferably a light batting. I will furnish the elastic and cording.

Needs List - Sylvia Jolet - Sticklee Table Runner

Finished Size Approx. 18" wide and up to 52" long

Add a little "zing" to your table with this fast and fun table runner. The inner strips add a nice dimension to the project and they are set on an angle which really spices things up! If you prefer binding, you will need extra fabric.

Yardage Requirements:

Runner front- 1 yard each of 2 fabrics

Runner back- 1 yard


Inner lining- 1 yard

** This method for assembling this runner is not a stitch-and-flip, therefore please make sure that your inner lining fabric is preshrunk. Best results are with 2 layers of pre-shrunk muslin (so you would need 2 yards).





Marlene Syzciolo worked on this crib size sampler with the help of her 3 year old granddaughter, Madison!




This California King size Asian print is Rozella Szabo's first BIG quilt! Her daughter is the lucky recipient! She enlisted help of Marlene Azzalo.





Rozella Szabo made this Aqua Kaleidoscope 12" wall hanging in her first class with a piecing bee.











Kit Kucinkas also made this Graham Cracker quilt for the Nepali Sewing group to donate to the kids of the Bastrop wild fires. The back is below.




Sandra Lowell created this 24" scrapy table topper! How cute is that?

Sandra Lowell finished a UFO! This 48" square deer panel with nine patche is DONE!









