

What do Dorothy, 007, and Bridget Bardot have in common? They all wore memorable gingham. Dorothy had a blue gingham jumper/dress, 007 wore pink gingham on the beach in *Thunderball*, and Bridget donned a gingham wedding dress.

Gingham fabric was originally a stripe and made in Dutch occupied Indonesia. It was named after the Malay word *ging-gang* and French word *guingan* meaning stripes. Known to have been shipped to

Europe and the American colonies as early as 1621, several countries lay claim to the gingham design and have incorporated it into their culture. In India, the gamucha is a gingham towel used to dry the body. In Indonesia the contrasting colors represent the battle between good and evil. The Japanese place a spiritual value on gingham, using it to wrap around statues when a child dies. The African Masai have used the pattern for thousands of years and it is part of their national costume. Southern Germany takes credit for the origin of gingham, using the traditional blue and white even in their flag. Not to be undone, the Italians say gingham is from Northern Italy and the French call it Vichy from the province where they feel it originated. In the US gingham seems to be as American as apple pie.

Originally made of 100% cotton with indigo dye, gingham generally refers to a two color even-sized checked fabric which has no right or wrong side. In the mid 1800s new synthetic dyes were used in England and the fabric was manufactured there and in the US, using cotton imported from India.



Gingham was inexpensive, washed well and quickly made the scene as tablecloths, curtains, and children's clothing. In the 1970s it was even called 'the tablecloth pattern.' Gingham made the transition from school uniforms to Hollywood and to couture fashion. A polyester blend became cheaper to manufacture, and gingham has also be made using wool, silk, linen, and vinyl.



Gingham became popular as a foundation for smocking, especially in children's clothing. Chicken-scratch, Amish embroidery, depression lace, gingham lace,

gingham tracks, lace stitch and snowflake embroidery are all names used for patterned work done with floss or pearl cotton on gingham fabric. Relatively easy to do and inexpensive, it became popular during the Depression. It was

not unusual to see these lace patterns used on blocks for quilts.

Other checked fabrics include: chambray which has color woven over and under each white thread creating an almost solid color; shagbark which is woven a bit loose giving it texture; uneven colorful checks and stripes of non-colorfast madras plaids originally from India; tartan plaid with



different sized checks, and buffalo checks with even larger squares and usually more than two colors. There is also shepherd's check (even sized twill), houndstooth check (pointy-shaped), Glen plaid (broken checks), windowpane (lines thick & far apart), graph, tattersall (like graph but alternating colors), mini check, and pin check (looks almost like a solid.)
