### What is this Block of the Month Drawing?

Beginning in May, 2023 as a fun way to use up scraps, share some quilt block ideas, and offer members a head start of getting a quilt top going – monthly Guild meetings have featured a Block of the Month Drawing.

#### 6.2024 Pieces of the Past, 169: Martha Pullen, by Ellen Hernandez



Recently a friend gave me a large bag of hand crocheted trims, laces, and cutwork that had belonged to her mother-in-law. She had no idea what to do with them and thought that I could use them in my sewing projects. While sorting through the items I could identify trim of a particular size that fit perfectly on the edge of vintage pillowcases, a project my own grandmother often crocheted. The laces brought to mind a PBS show from the

1990s, *Martha's Sewing Room*. I can still hear Martha saying '*entredeux*' in her Southern drawl as she described her heirloom pieces and projects. At the end of the shows, she took you up to her 'attic' and displayed and described items from her vintage clothing collection. Most of her projects in the beginning were delicate white children's dresses which I thought were impractical. She was popular, though, and her show aired for 17 years. Whatever happened to Martha?






Little Martha Campbell loved sales and ventures from an early age. She won an award for selling the most magazine subscriptions in elementary school and opened a dance school at age 14,

saving her money for college. Martha earned a PhD and was a college professor but really wanted to be her own boss. She was introduced to imported French fabrics and laces by some of her husband's friends and in 1981 opened a unique fabric shop in Huntsville, AL. The first of her **70** books was *French Hand Sewing by Machine* in 1983. Her magazine, *Sew* 



*Beautiful,* was successful for 27 years. The PBS Sewing Room show helped make Martha internationally famous, teaching heirloom sewing around the world. She had many guest crafters and featured their works, such as fabric designers, quilters, and embroiderers. Martha made a wide assortment of items from pillows and other home dec to



doll dresses and baby bonnets. She demonstrated silk ribbon embroidery, pleating, smocking, and her favorite, lace insertion. She started the School of Art Fashion in Alabama, a four-day series of classes taught by a team of seamstresses that were always a sell-out. Martha described her passions as God, family, and business. Wishing to share her success as a business woman, she wrote two books, *You Can Make Money from Your Hobby: Building a Business Doing What You Love* in 1999 and *G.R.A.C.E Keys to Entrepreneurship* in 2014.



Martha wanted to care for her ailing husband full time and sold her Company for millions in 2005. Since then, Martha has resurfaced at age 81, offering online classes at RockStarSewing.com. She has partnered with Bernina and teaches online from her home studio and plans to design her own line of fabric and lace. Her Heirloom Licensing course prepares one to teach heirloom sewing.




The tradition of a lace christening gown continues in Martha's family with the most recent recipient, her first great-grandson. Wylder's mom, Morgan, collaborated with her grandmother, Martha, and the magnificent embroidered fifty-

inch lace gown was completed by seamstress Connie Palmer.

An interesting blast from Martha's past was an exciting meeting with JFK in 1963 when she was a cheerleader with U of AL at the Orange Bowl in Miami. Martha was so overwhelmed with excitement she still can't remember anything she said at the time.

# Black Pioneers: Legacy in the American West



This exhibition, the first of its kind, explores the path of Black history in the West with a timeline of original pictorial quilts. The timeline begins in 1528, with Esteban's dramatic story, which marks the arrival of Africans in the American West and continues through the Civil Rights Movement.

Dispelling the myth that Black people in the old West were mostly cowboys, Black Pioneers: Legacy in the American West, shows rich diversity in their occupations and achievements in society, religion, education, and the arts.

Choosing quilts as the visual medium for this exhibition accentuates the intersections of African Americans in the Western Frontier while informing others about the art form and its important role in African American history.

This exhibition is organized by The James Museum of Western & Wildlife Art and Dr. Carolyn Mazloomi, curator, historian and artist. The quilts have been created by the Women of Color Quilters Network especially for this exhibition.

Admission is free to the Stark Museum of Art located at 712 Green Avenue in Orange, TX.

Beginning in April, Shangri La Gardens will feature a Quilt Garden. These gardens will showcase a fusion of traditional quilting patterns using plants as the medium. Among the myriad of quilting designs featured will include the North Star, Shoo y, Log Cabin, Bow Tie, Flying Geese, Pinwheel and 9 Block patterns. Each garden promises to be a kaleidoscope of color, intertwining the narrative of Black Pioneers, while fostering a deeper appreciation of both art forms.
