What happens on August 30th?

This is when the bidding begins! Bidding ends at midnight on September 8 so be sure to get your best bid in before bidding closes.

How do I bid on a quilt?

Just click the auction link above! You must register as a bidder and enter your credit card information to participate in the auction. Bidding opens on August 30, 2024 at 12:00am CDT and closes at midnight on September 8, 2024 CDT.

How can I help?

From the auction website, simply click the Facebook, X, or share icons located around the auction website. AND on the guild auction web page, you will find a flyer you can print and deliver to quilt shops, coffee shops, libraries, and other places in the community that you frequent. We ask everyone to spread the word and share with your family and friends!

Can anyone bid on a quilt, even if they are not a guild member?

YES!! Anyone can register to be a bidder in our quilt auction. Please share this auction details and forward the auction email to your family and friends.

Can I make a monetary donation?

YES! There is a DONATE option on the auction website to make monetary donations. Anyone can donate any monetary donation amount.

How do I pay if I won a quilt(s) in the auction?

At the time you register, the credit card you registered is what you will use to pay for your winning bid(s). Since this is an online only auction, a credit card is required to bid on a quilt(s). At the end of the auction, you will receive a statement with your winning bid information and can then "checkout" and pay for the quilt(s) you won. On September 10th, we will process payments for you for quilt(s) you won and complete your "checkout" for you using your registered credit card.

GREATER SAN ANTONIO QUILT GUILD, INC ETHEL Y. HOWEY GRANT PROGRAM

MISSION

The Greater San Antonio Quilt Guild (GSAQG) has established a grant program in honor of a loved and esteemed founding member, Ethel Y. Howey, whose accomplishments and influence extended into the international quilt world. The grant is to encourage the pursuit of education in the study of quilt making and to recognize the importance of quilting in today's society as an art form, as an instrument of healing, as part of our legacy, and as a common thread which binds all in friendship.

PURPOSE

The purpose of the grant program is to fund projects that will have long term impact on preserving the heritage and further the art of quilt making. The grant may be used to cover expenses such as fees (including conferences, workshops, etc.), travel, lodging, meals, materials, and books. The grant(s) will be awarded in even numbered years, not to exceed \$2,000. The Grant Committee may divide the monies between more than one recipient. The GSAQG is not obligated to award the entire \$2,000 or any part thereof, if the quality of the proposals does not merit it.

ELIBILITY

- Applicant must be an active GSAQG member in good standing for the previous two (2) years immediately preceding the grant deadline.
- An applicant must show evidence of an interest in continuing to improve and innovate in the field of quilt design, construction, history, or technique.
- · Financial need will NOT be a criterion for selection.
- Grant recipients are ineligible to reapply for grants for four years. Grant committee members are ineligible for grants while serving on the committee.

PROCEDURES AND DEADLINES

- Applications must be submitted on or before August 1 (current year), and the grant will be awarded at the following January Guild meeting.
- If the recipient fails to fulfill the requirements or is unable to attend the proposed project or program, the grant money must be returned within **three (3) months** of the cancellation, or on a timeline agreed to by the committee and the applicant. If an alternate applicant is available, the money may be transferred to the alternate with approval of the committee.
- Recipients must be willing and able to share with GSAQG the new skills, techniques, or information gained. This may be in
 the form of a presentation, a workshop, or other process that disseminates the information to the members in the year
 following receipt of the grant. Scheduling must be coordinated with the 1st Vice President for Programs.
- If a workshop or program is being presented, at a minimum of three (3) months before the scheduled Guild workshop or
 program, a lesson plan and class sample will be presented to the Ethel Y. Howey Chairperson, the 1st Vice President for
 Programs, and one Guild member-at-large.
- Recipient must submit, in writing, a final report of the project and expenses by March 1 of the year following receipt of the
 grant.

GSAQG ETHEL Y. HOWEY GRANT PROGRAM APPLICATION PROCESS

Following the stated timeline, submit a typed or handwritten application, not to exceed two (2) pages. Include the date, your name, address, phone numbers, email, number of years a GSAQG member, and explain:

- 1. Why you would like to receive this grant.
- 2. How you will use the grant funds, including a specific budget.
- 3. How you will share your new skills, techniques, and information with the membership.

9.2024 Pieces of the Past, 172: Joan Musick, by Ellen Hernandez



I have a small collection of kid's quilting related books that I have shared over the years with my oldest granddaughter. One of the most unusual books is *The Missing Flower Tops/The Midnight Snack* by Joan Musick from 2011. It's no longer in print and difficult to find, even in libraries. Two things make this book unique – it's a topsy turvy which flips over to be two books in one, and the illustrations are photos from Musick's own quilt.



Fiber artist and writer Joan Musick began sewing early on, making her own clothes as a teen and later her wedding dress. She began quilting in the 1980s based on Eleonor Burns' instructions. She tried many techniques and especially enjoyed turned edge hand applique.




One day Musick's neighbor relayed a dilemma about missing flower heads in her garden. They concluded a rabbit must have found a bountiful location for snacking. Musick thought about the account and wrote it as a child's mystery, from the viewpoints of both the gardener and the rabbit. She decided to make the story into a bed-sized quilt using online photos as inspiration for design. Figures were machine appliqued with invisible thread and embellished with a variety of yarns and threads. It was quilted by Musick on her stationary Bernina. After the publication of this book, Musick had more topsy turvy story ideas and started making more quilts. A Surprise for Turtle/The Happy Nappy Day is based on the tale of The Tortoise and the Hare. The third book is Marvin's Marvelous 'magination/Russel's Remarkable Reality

about a boy and his dog. These books are out of print as well.


Musick created patterns for smaller versions of her quilts to go with each book. They contained applique patterns for the main characters of the stories. They were once available on her website which no longer exists.


