

## 10.2024 Pieces of the Past, 173: Suffrage Quilts, by Ellen Hernandez

My grandmother lived in TN and FL, anti-suffrage states. She was 30 years old before she was eligible to vote after passage of the 19<sup>th</sup> Amendment on 18 Aug 1920. But not all women were included in this monumental law, such as Native Americans, Asian Americans, Latinas, and Black Americans. Many states put up barriers for these disenfranchised women such as literacy tests, poll taxes, and denial of residency and citizenship. Women continued to fight for their right to

vote through the 1950s, '60s, and '70s until by 1975 all women, regardless of race or nationality or language, were able to vote in America. The struggle for women's voting began well over a hundred years ago, and was not solely an American issue. In 1893 New Zealand was the first self-governing country to allow women, including Maori, to vote.

> This Women's Social and Political Union (WSPU) Holloway Banner quilt was designed in 1910 by Anne Macbeth, head of the Embroidery Department at the Glasgow School of Art, Scotland. Each of the eighty pieces of white linen bears the embroidered name of one of the eighty suffragettes who were on hunger strike in Holloway Jail, London from 1909-1910. (Suffragette was used in England and embraced a more militant strategy; suffragist was often preferred in the US and supported a peaceful approach.) The quilt was auctioned to raise funds for the WSPU. It is now in the Museum of London. Women over the age of 30 were granted the right to vote in 1918 in the UK. It wasn't until 1928 that women 21 and over could vote.

Volunteers in MA and KS completed this Lemoyne Star quilt in 2014 as a replica of one made by women's rights activist Susan B. Anthony in 1835. Anthony often spoke to women at quilting bees and attended fairs and rallies where baked goods and sewing items were raffled for the suffrage

cause.

The Emma Civey Stahl Woman's Rights Quilt was made in Illinois in 1875. Three blocks feature activism for women's rights. In the collection of the Metropolitan Museum of Art.

This fundraising redwork signature quilt was made in KS in 1888 and clearly supports women activists.

Abigail Scott Duniway was an acccomplished seamstress who became a suffragist and a newspaper editor after her move from Illinois on the Oregon Trail. She wrote in 1880, "any fool can make a quilt," preferring to use her strengths as a writer to make changes for women. Abigail made this hexagon quilt in 1900 for a national suffrage bazaar. After years of fighting for women's rights, she was the first woman to register to vote in Oregon and cast a ballot in 1914 at the age of 80.

It's not known how many suffrage-themed quilts were made over the years. Women carried banners, flags, and posters during their marches. Alice Paul, a NJ Quaker, is shown here sewing stars on a suffrage flag – purple for loyalty, white for purity, gold for light and life. She formed the National Woman's Party in 1913 and added one star to the flag each time another state ratified the right for women

to vote. Tennessee was the last of 36, the number required for the amendment to pass.

This Hoosier Suffrage Quilt was made before 1920. It contains the embroidered names of over 290 people, supporters of women's suffrage. It is now in the Museum of Fine WOMEN Arts, Boston. \*\*\* Celebrate your power to vote.\*\*\* TERS

#### **GREATER SAN ANTONIO QUILT GUILD, INC** ETHEL Y. HOWEY GRANT PROGRAM

#### MISSION

The Greater San Antonio Quilt Guild (GSAQG) has established a grant program in honor of a loved and esteemed founding member, Ethel Y. Howey, whose accomplishments and influence extended into the international quilt world. The grant is to encourage the pursuit of education in the study of quilt making and to recognize the importance of quilting in today's society as an art form, as an instrument of healing, as part of our legacy, and as a common thread which binds all in friendship.

#### PURPOSE

The purpose of the grant program is to fund projects that will have long term impact on preserving the heritage and further the art of quilt making. The grant may be used to cover expenses such as fees (including conferences, workshops, etc.), travel, lodging, meals, materials, and books. The grant(s) will be awarded in even numbered years, not to exceed \$2,000. The Grant Committee may divide the monies between more than one recipient. The GSAQG is not obligated to award the entire \$2,000 or any part thereof, if the quality of the proposals does not merit it.

#### ELIBILITY

- Applicant must be an active GSAQG member in good standing for the previous two (2) years immediately preceding the grant deadline.
- An applicant must show evidence of an interest in continuing to improve and innovate in the field of quilt design, construction, history, or technique.
- Financial need will NOT be a criterion for selection.
- Grant recipients are ineligible to reapply for grants for four years. Grant committee members are ineligible for grants while serving on the committee.

#### PROCEDURES AND DEADLINES

- Applications must be submitted on or before August 1 (current year), and the grant will be awarded at the following January Guild meeting.
- If the recipient fails to fulfill the requirements or is unable to attend the proposed project or program, the grant money must be returned within three (3) months of the cancellation, or on a timeline agreed to by the committee and the applicant. If an alternate applicant is available, the money may be transferred to the alternate with approval of the committee.
- Recipients must be willing and able to share with GSAQG the new skills, techniques, or information gained. This may be in the form of a presentation, a workshop, or other process that disseminates the information to the members in the year following receipt of the grant. Scheduling must be coordinated with the 1<sup>st</sup> Vice President for Programs.
- If a workshop or program is being presented, at a minimum of three (3) months before the scheduled Guild workshop or program, a lesson plan and class sample will be presented to the Ethel Y. Howey Chairperson, the 1st Vice President for Programs, and one Guild member-at-large.
- Recipient must submit, in writing, a final report of the project and expenses by March 1 of the year following receipt of the grant.
