

### Ida B.'s Quilting Guild Enrichment SCHOLARSHIP Fund

### One MISSION of GSAQG

To stimulate an interest in quilts and to advance the art of quiltmaking.

Recognizing the importance of active participation in quilt guild events and activities, Ida Blankenship Kujawski has provided funds to establish a Scholarship Account. This scholarship fund will enable guild members to apply for financial assistance to cover fees for workshops and retreats, further encouraging engagement and skill development within our community.

### **PURPOSE**

- Enhance Guild Membership Experience: Foster greater enjoyment of guild membership by promoting skill development and friendships through active participation in guild activities.
- Encourage Participation: Motivate members to attend workshops and retreats, enhancing their skills and connections within the guild.
- Financial Support: Provide financial assistance to members who may be on a tight budget, helping to alleviate the costs associated with workshops and retreats.
- Establish a Donation Fund: Create a Scholarship Fund that can receive additional donations in the future. These donations can come from anyone for various reasons, further supporting the guild's activities and members.

### **ELIGIBILITY**

- Applicant must be active member of GSAQG for the (1) year preceding the date of the event.
- Special consideration to "First-time attendee"
- Scholarships for guild workshops and retreats are available each year. Workshop required kit fee provided by instructor could be included in Scholarship amount.
- Guild Workshops offered as 2 sessions (Friday/Saturday) would qualify for two scholarships, to help two members.
- One scholarship per member in a calendar year.
- Scholarship recipients are ineligible to reapply for:
  - 3 years for Winter or Summer Retreat
  - 2 years for Mini-Retreats
  - 2 years for Guild Speakers' workshops

Paper copy of Applications available by chair at onset of enrollment.

Applications must be submitted to the individual retreat chair, or guild program chair, who will present to the guild board for final approval. Each chair should have committee of 2-3 to help evaluate applications.

Applications should be submitted at beginning of enrollment for each event. Awards can then be announced early enough to allow recipients and chair to plan accordingly.


The Quilt Projects Finishing Committee(QPFC) has several finished tops of different sizes that need to be quilted.

11.2024 Pieces of the Past, 174: **The Mayflower Quilt**, by Ellen Hernandez



Years ago, my cousin sent me details of her extended family research showing that we were descended on my mother's side from *Mayflower* passengers Edward Fuller, his wife, and son Samuel. When my mother was in her early 90s, I surprised her with a membership in the *Society of Mayflower Descendants*. They are a well-meaning historical group which estimates there are over 35 million descendants today. I have mixed emotions about celebrating our *Mayflower* great-grandfathers. It's moving to be related to historical, courageous, independent thinkers but those are the same people who ultimately exploited the native Wampanoag. Moving on, here is a tale of a "*Mayflower* quilt."

Textiles from the 1600s included wool, hemp, and linen. Rather than the romanticized black Pilgrim costume, natural dyes were used such as browns, dark yellows, rusty red, and some blues and greens. Black dye at that time was expensive and rare. Some items were not dyed at all. Cloth was so valuable that items were specifically passed down in wills. Probate records of Plymouth colonist, Mary Ring, who died in 1631 list "blue stockings, red petticoat, violet waistcoat, three blue



aprons, two violet waistcoats." Interestingly, she also lists "two white blankets, one red blanket with the best Coverlet, and a gray Coverlet." William Brewster, a Plymouth elder who died in 1644 had recorded possessions of "green waistcoat, violet coat, blue suit, a quilted cap, old white Irish blanket, white English blanket." Clothing and fabrics transported by the *Mayflower* passengers were limited and not replenished for months to years. Local wool and flax processing took years to establish in the New World.

If there were quilts on the *Mayflower*, they would have been whole cloth made prior to 1620 and their survival would be rare. *Whole cloth* is misleading since looms were not wide, so strips of fabric were sewn together. The word "quilt" for a bedcover was not commonly used, but rather coverlet, blanket, or rugg/bedrugg.

The minutes of the United Methodist Church Baltimore-Washington Conference in 2022 references an item they have in archival storage: "Mayflower Quilt, a quilt that was hand-stitched in 1615, traveled across the ocean to what is now New England, and finally made its way into Dr. John Goucher's collection before being donated to our museum." The museum is the Lovely Lane Museum, Baltimore, MD. Very interesting story, but can this quilt be verified?

Darcy Pattison wrote an article, "The *Mayflower* Quilt" in *Quilting Today* in 1990. She reported that the quilt was made by an English vicar's daughter, Elizabeth Thompson Cogswell. Elizabeth's descendant, Susanna Williams, sold the quilt for \$85 in 1897 to N.T. Whitaker who gave it to Dr. John Goucher, President of the Methodist Historical Society. Goucher's daughter, Janet, donated the quilt to Lovely Lane in 1955 where it was locked in a vault until 1976 at which time it was examined and described as a late 17<sup>th</sup> century work from the UK. The corded quilt top was fine linen, the back was coarse linen, and it was sewn with light blue linen thread, now faded.

Marylou McDonald, Baltimore Applique Society President in 2007 provided further information. The quilt was said to have been made by Elizabeth Cogswell in 1615. She and her husband, John, sailed on the ship *Angel Gabriel* in 1635, not the *Mayflower*. In 2005 quilt appraiser Hazel Carter concluded that the quilting was reminiscent of English

patterns, but no specific date was given.

### GREATER SAN ANTONIO QUILT GUILD, INC ETHEL Y. HOWEY GRANT PROGRAM

### MISSION

The Greater San Antonio Quilt Guild (GSAQG) has established a grant program in honor of a loved and esteemed founding member, Ethel Y. Howey, whose accomplishments and influence extended into the international quilt world. The grant is to encourage the pursuit of education in the study of quilt making and to recognize the importance of quilting in today's society as an art form, as an instrument of healing, as part of our legacy, and as a common thread which binds all in friendship.

### PURPOSE

The purpose of the grant program is to fund projects that will have long term impact on preserving the heritage and further the art of quilt making. The grant may be used to cover expenses such as fees (including conferences, workshops, etc.), travel, lodging, meals, materials, and books. The grant(s) will be awarded in even numbered years, not to exceed \$2,000. The Grant Committee may divide the monies between more than one recipient. The GSAQG is not obligated to award the entire \$2,000 or any part thereof, if the quality of the proposals does not merit it.

### **ELIBILITY**

- Applicant must be an active GSAQG member in good standing for the previous two (2) years immediately preceding the grant deadline.
- An applicant must show evidence of an interest in continuing to improve and innovate in the field of quilt design, construction, history, or technique.
- Financial need will NOT be a criterion for selection.
- Grant recipients are ineligible to reapply for grants for four years. Grant committee members are ineligible for grants while serving on the committee.

### PROCEDURES AND DEADLINES

- Applications must be submitted on or before August 1 (current year), and the grant will be awarded at the following January Guild meeting.
- If the recipient fails to fulfill the requirements or is unable to attend the proposed project or program, the grant money must be returned within **three (3) months** of the cancellation, or on a timeline agreed to by the committee and the applicant. If an alternate applicant is available, the money may be transferred to the alternate with approval of the committee.
- Recipients must be willing and able to share with GSAQG the new skills, techniques, or information gained. This may be in
  the form of a presentation, a workshop, or other process that disseminates the information to the members in the year
  following receipt of the grant. Scheduling must be coordinated with the 1st Vice President for Programs.
- If a workshop or program is being presented, at a minimum of three (3) months before the scheduled Guild workshop or
  program, a lesson plan and class sample will be presented to the Ethel Y. Howey Chairperson, the 1<sup>st</sup> Vice President for
  Programs, and one Guild member-at-large.
- Recipient must submit, in writing, a final report of the project and expenses by March 1 of the year following receipt of the
  grant.

### **GSAQG ETHEL Y. HOWEY GRANT PROGRAM APPLICATION PROCESS**

Following the stated timeline, submit a typed or handwritten application, not to exceed two (2) pages. Include the date, your name, address, phone numbers, email, number of years a GSAQG member, and explain:

- 1. Why you would like to receive this grant.
- 2. How you will use the grant funds, including a specific budget.
- 3. How you will share your new skills, techniques, and information with the membership.

Feel free to provide any additional information that will help the selection committee.
