



Monthly Spotlight The Guild Library: Back in Business
















Do you longarm?

How do you manage your projects?

I have read several quilting blogs discussing their UFOs. Two created a single page to document the status of each UFO. I'm conflicted about whether I should use one. I can see the benefit; I wouldn't lose track or forget a project. There are a couple of projects that I know I started but don't know where I have stored them.. On the other hand, I'm not the most organized. I consider not having stuff on the floor good, but organized chaos on the table is ok. I still have a basket of unsorted scraps on the floor in my sewing room. I do have a few tubs stored by fabric, but I have been known to throw the rest of the uncut fabric at the shelves and miss, and the fabric lands on the floor in front of the shelf. I'm mostly okay with it.

2.2025 Pieces of the Past, 177: Bryony Rose Jennings, by Ellen Hernandez



I recall hearing a fellow quilter describe her relationship with fabric. She had a stressful job and whenever needed, she opened her desk drawer to touch and admire a small collection of beautiful pieces of fabric kept there for that purpose. In those moments, she was able to feel calm, at peace, and hopeful. How can fabric color, design, and texture transform our minds and hearts? Bryony Rose Jennings may have some insight.



Jeweler turned textile sculptor Bryony Rose Jennings grew up in a cottage in rural Hampshire, England. With artist parents, Bryony was exposed at an early age to all sorts of creative processes from clay making to drawing and embroidery. She was a jeweler after college but always dabbled with fabrics, even incorporating them into her silver pieces. Her first textile animal was life-sized Flossie the Donkey, a commissioned item, made with pieces of bedding, clothing, and patches of favorite vintage fabrics.



Bryony's fabric menagerie starts with wire and stuffed shapes. There are no patterns. Fabric ultimately guides her work, using what she feels is the right piece for the right project. She

draws from her large collection of vintage upholstery fabric, lace, velvet, barkcloth, silk, wool blankets, embroidered linens, and a variety of found objects for eyes, appendages, and accents. "I want to do justice to these (vintage/used) fabrics...and give them new life. Cloth and fabric is the perfect vehicle of communicating something of the human experience." She finds that the pattern, design, texture, and even the way a fabric frays all add to the emotion of her pieces. Her version of applique is self-taught, using upholstery needles and threads, ending with embroidery floss accents.



Bryony feels the fabrics speak to her and evoke wonderful thoughts and memories. Often when the eyes are inserted, the scruffy animal seems to become real and communicates something to Bryony. Her goal is for her menagerie to trigger a response and for people to be able to relate to them in some way.

Some animals may take years to complete until all the right fabrics come together to create the perfect personality. Then she gives each creation a name. On her website, **prettyscruffy.com**, Bryony summarizes, "Creatures stitched into existence. Forgotten fabrics and treasures brought together to find a soul with a story to tell." Not all her items are sold immediately. Bryony may live with her creation awhile until the *right* owner gets in touch.

Workshops are scheduled several times a year. An owl or a mouse may be the subject starting with creating the basic shape to adding fabrics to wrap, layer, stuff, and sculpt with stitching. Bryony states that the creation is a fiddly business, involving a lot of hand sewing, patience, and perseverance.

• To stimulate an interest in quilts and to advance the art of quiltmaking.



Recognizing the importance of active participation in quilt guild events and activities, Ida Blankenship Kujawski has provided funds to establish a Scholarship Account. This scholarship fund will enable guild members to apply for financial assistance to cover fees for workshops and retreats, further encouraging engagement and skill development within our community.

PURPOSE

- Enhance Guild Membership Experience: Foster greater enjoyment of guild membership by promoting skill development and friendships through active participation in guild activities.
- Encourage Participation: Motivate members to attend workshops and retreats, enhancing their skills and connections within the guild.
- Financial Support: Provide financial assistance to members who may be on a tight budget, helping to alleviate the costs associated with workshops and retreats.
- Establish a Donation Fund: Create a Scholarship Fund that can receive additional donations in the future. These donations can come from anyone for various reasons, further supporting the guild's activities and members.

ELIGIBILITY

- Applicant must be active member of GSAQG for the (1) year preceding the date of the event.
- Special consideration to "First-time attendee"
- Scholarships for guild workshops and retreats are available each year. Workshop required kit fee provided by instructor could be included in Scholarship amount.
- Guild Workshops offered as 2 sessions (Friday/Saturday) would qualify for two scholarships, to help two members.
- One scholarship per member in a calendar year.
- Scholarship recipients are ineligible to reapply for:
 - 3 years for Winter or Summer Retreat
 - 2 years for Mini-Retreats
 - 2 years for Guild Speakers' workshops

Paper copy of Applications available by chair at onset of enrollment.

Applications must be submitted to the individual retreat chair, or guild program chair, who will present to the guild board for final approval. Each chair should have committee of 2-3 to help evaluate applications.

Applications should be submitted at beginning of enrollment for each event. Awards can then be announced early enough to allow recipients and chair to plan accordingly.

GREATER SAN ANTONIO QUILT GUILD, INC ETHEL Y. HOWEY GRANT PROGRAM

MISSION

The Greater San Antonio Quilt Guild (GSAQG) has established a grant program in honor of a loved and esteemed founding member, Ethel Y. Howey, whose accomplishments and influence extended into the international quilt world. The grant is to encourage the pursuit of education in the study of quilt making and to recognize the importance of quilting in today's society as an art form, as an instrument of healing, as part of our legacy, and as a common thread which binds all in friendship.

PURPOSE

The purpose of the grant program is to fund projects that will have long term impact on preserving the heritage and further the art of quilt making. The grant may be used to cover expenses such as fees (including conferences, workshops, etc.), travel, lodging, meals, materials, and books. The grant(s) will be awarded in even numbered years, not to exceed \$2,000. The Grant Committee may divide the monies between more than one recipient. The GSAQG is not obligated to award the entire \$2,000 or any part thereof, if the quality of the proposals does not merit it.

ELIBILITY

- Applicant must be an active GSAQG member in good standing for the previous two (2) years immediately preceding the grant deadline.
- An applicant must show evidence of an interest in continuing to improve and innovate in the field of quilt design, construction, history, or technique.
- Financial need will NOT be a criterion for selection.
- Grant recipients are ineligible to reapply for grants for four years. Grant committee members are ineligible for grants while serving on the committee.

PROCEDURES AND DEADLINES

- Applications must be submitted on or before August 1 (current year), and the grant will be awarded at the following January Guild meeting.
- If the recipient fails to fulfill the requirements or is unable to attend the proposed project or program, the grant money must be returned within **three (3) months** of the cancellation, or on a timeline agreed to by the committee and the applicant. If an alternate applicant is available, the money may be transferred to the alternate with approval of the committee.
- Recipients must be willing and able to share with GSAQG the new skills, techniques, or information gained. This may be in
 the form of a presentation, a workshop, or other process that disseminates the information to the members in the year
 following receipt of the grant. Scheduling must be coordinated with the 1st Vice President for Programs.
- If a workshop or program is being presented, at a minimum of three (3) months before the scheduled Guild workshop or
 program, a lesson plan and class sample will be presented to the Ethel Y. Howey Chairperson, the 1st Vice President for
 Programs, and one Guild member-at-large.
- Recipient must submit, in writing, a final report of the project and expenses by March 1 of the year following receipt of the
 grant.

GSAQG ETHEL Y. HOWEY GRANT PROGRAM APPLICATION PROCESS

Following the stated timeline, submit a typed or handwritten application, not to exceed two (2) pages. Include the date, your name, address, phone numbers, email, number of years a GSAQG member, and explain:

- 1. Why you would like to receive this grant.
- 2. How you will use the grant funds, including a specific budget.
- 3. How you will share your new skills, techniques, and information with the membership.




