Have you ever heard of The100DayProject? I heard about this challenge last year for the first time and then forgot about it. Then it came up in my feeds again this year, so I took another look at what it is. It is committing to doing a project for 100 days. Note, it is NOT about making 100 finished projects in that time. It is about working on a project for 100 days. Why would I do that? On https://the100dayproject.com/about/ explains it the best:

"Creativity is a skill. The more we practice, the more skilled we become. Practice takes time. Practice takes commitment. Practice is a radical act in this speeded up world. Through practice, we develop a creative habit. Through habit, we reconnect with and know ourselves again as a creative being."

And more about the why of doing the challenge from https://www.robenmarie. com/blog/how-to-successfully-participate-in-the-100-day-project

It helps you develop a creative habit: Our lives are complicated, and before you know it, time goes by and you find that you haven't been in your studio in weeks. By participating in an art challenge, you will find yourself working on something each day, which will help you develop a creative habit. Consistency is key!

It helps boost your inspiration: When you are participating in a challenge, and you search the hashtag that has been assigned by the creator of the challenge, and you see that grid of all that color and all those different responses to a single prompt... inspiration begin. You get wildly inspired, and you want to try different things that you have not tried before!

It helps you gain new friends or a new community: The most popular art challenges usually take place on Instagram, making them easy to participate in and easily searchable. You'll quickly find yourself making new friends and building your community. You never know, your best friend might be just a like or a comment away.

It helps you stretch creatively depending on what the challenge is about: Committing to a challenge for a particular period helps you stretch your ability to commit and be disciplined. Art challenges vary in length from as many as 100 days to as few as seven days. When you join a challenge that is outside your comfort zone or focuses on a topic new to you, it will help you stretch your creative muscles.

So I hope you will join me in our own 100DayProject! Let's start with getting our project idea between now and the April meeting, then start our 100DayProject at the Guild meeting on April 12th.





Monthly Spotlight Q P F C: Quilt Projects Finishing Committee



QPFC was begun in 2014 to fill the need for more finished quilts from our guild, which is given lots of unfinished projects, sets of blocks, kits, and sometimes fabrics. Our QPC committee sometimes passes a set of blocks to us to finish. Challenge quilt tops are often given to be finished.

QPFC assesses each set, records it, then makes it into a kit. A member takes it to work on, doing maybe just one step, such as assembly; then another member might quilt it, another bind it. Sometimes several members have worked on it, sometimes only one. Finished quilts are used by the guild for our online quilt auction, and other requests from the community for charity fund raising.



QPFC plans projects for guild workday in May, where members bring their sewing machines ready to FINISH some quilts. (or almost!)

In the recent 2-3 years QPFC has been handling more projects than ever before, making them into kits ready-to-finish. We have a large number ready to quilt. They will be lovely quilts when completed.

QPFC is open to all guild members; it feels more like a bee, as we plan and share and work together. The projects keep coming. We meet monthly on the 4th Friday each month, 11am–1pm, at Jean Hardies' home. Yes, we need more members to help, and yes, it's fun. 4.2025 Pieces of the Past, 179: The Women of Etzatlan, by Ellen Hernandez

Veterinarian Lorena Ron and her mother, Concepcion Siordia known as Paloma, now 93, have changed the face of the small town of Etzatlan, Jalisco, Mexico and decorated other cities around the world. In 2015 these women, both recently widowed, wanted to turn their sadness into something beautiful. They decided to make a special display for their town's feast of their patron saint, The Lord of Mercy. Based on some photos of a town that had been decorated with umbrellas suspended in air, they resolved to make large crocheted circles for a similar display. They used raffia made from recycled plastic bottles, which would withstand the outdoor elements. The circles didn't hold together well, and they

changed the design to hexagons. Eventually a group of 200 women were working on the project and their



canopy was almost 3,000 square meters – more than 8,000 hexagons. In 2019 their crocheted canopy was declared the world's largest by Guinness World Records.

After the Guinness success, a Mexican artist asked the women to decorate the Mexican Pavilion for Expo 2020 Dubai. They decided on a crocheted "hug" – their crochet canopy completely wrapped the Mexican Pavilion.



The women have continued making artistic canopies at Ron's workshop called Cielo Tejido -

Woven Sky. Originally the women did not take payment for their community work, instead they considered it an offering to The Lord of Mercy. Now they receive an income for the pieces made for their many commissioned projects. In 2022, they made 24,000 hexagons for displays. The local officials have helped with supplies for the group, including poles, cables, and labor to install the canopies. The crochet projects help relieve stress and provide emotional satisfaction and a feeling of success as part of a group. Originally it was the grandmothers that were crocheting, but younger people and men have



joined in.

The beautiful displays have drawn large crowds and tourism is revitalizing the small town. Shops, restaurants, and hotels are all profiting. The women of Cielo Tejido are now making dolls and placemats and selling them to their many tourists. They have also made white/tan/beige canopies that can be rented for wedding canopies.





In October 2024 the women displayed a canopy at Atlanta's Celebration of Diverse Cultures. The design was 650 feet of colorful octagons covering the Peachtree Creek Greenway Bridge. There was also a canopy at Burning Man 2023 in Nevada as well as displays in Milwaukee and in Belgium.



Designer Benito Santos from Jalisco featured the crochet of Cielo Tejido workers in his Spring-Summer 2025 dress collection *Entretejidos*. Sixty-four hippie-chic designs include pale pink, ivory, green, and yellow crochet from minidresses to evening gowns.

GREATER SAN ANTONIO QUILT GUILD, INC ETHEL Y. HOWEY GRANT PROGRAM

MISSION

The Greater San Antonio Quilt Guild (GSAQG) has established a grant program in honor of a loved and esteemed founding member, Ethel Y. Howey, whose accomplishments and influence extended into the international quilt world. The grant is to encourage the pursuit of education in the study of quilt making and to recognize the importance of quilting in today's society as an art form, as an instrument of healing, as part of our legacy, and as a common thread which binds all in friendship.

PURPOSE

The purpose of the grant program is to fund projects that will have long term impact on preserving the heritage and further the art of quilt making. The grant may be used to cover expenses such as fees (including conferences, workshops, etc.), travel, lodging, meals, materials, and books. The grant(s) will be awarded in even numbered years, not to exceed \$2,000. The Grant Committee may divide the monies between more than one recipient. The GSAQG is not obligated to award the entire \$2,000 or any part thereof, if the quality of the proposals does not merit it.

ELIBILITY

- Applicant must be an active GSAQG member in good standing for the previous two (2) years immediately preceding the grant deadline.
- An applicant must show evidence of an interest in continuing to improve and innovate in the field of quilt design, construction, history, or technique.
- Financial need will NOT be a criterion for selection.
- Grant recipients are ineligible to reapply for grants for four years. Grant committee members are ineligible for grants while serving on the committee.

PROCEDURES AND DEADLINES

- Applications must be submitted on or before August 1 (current year), and the grant will be awarded at the following January Guild meeting.
- If the recipient fails to fulfill the requirements or is unable to attend the proposed project or program, the grant money must be returned within three (3) months of the cancellation, or on a timeline agreed to by the committee and the applicant. If an alternate applicant is available, the money may be transferred to the alternate with approval of the committee.
- Recipients must be willing and able to share with GSAQG the new skills, techniques, or information gained. This may be in the form of a presentation, a workshop, or other process that disseminates the information to the members in the year following receipt of the grant. Scheduling must be coordinated with the 1st Vice President for Programs.
- If a workshop or program is being presented, at a minimum of three (3) months before the scheduled Guild workshop or program, a lesson plan and class sample will be presented to the Ethel Y. Howey Chairperson, the 1st Vice President for Programs, and one Guild member-at-large.
- Recipient must submit, in writing, a final report of the project and expenses by March 1 of the year following receipt of the grant.

GSAQG ETHEL Y. HOWEY GRANT PROGRAM APPLICATION PROCESS

Following the stated timeline, submit a typed or handwritten application, not to exceed two (2) pages. Include the date, your name, address, phone numbers, email, number of years a GSAQG member, and explain:

- 1. Why you would like to receive this grant.
- 2. How you will use the grant funds, including a specific budget.
- 3. How you will share your new skills, techniques, and information with the membership.

This scholarship fund will enable guild members to apply for financial assistance to cover fees for workshops and retreats, further encouraging engagement and skill development within our community.

PURPOSE

- Enhance Guild Membership Experience: Foster greater enjoyment of guild membership by promoting skill development and friendships through active participation in guild activities.
- Encourage Participation: Motivate members to attend workshops and retreats, enhancing their skills and connections within the guild.
- Financial Support: Provide financial assistance to members who may be on a tight budget, helping to alleviate the costs associated with workshops and retreats.
- Establish a Donation Fund: Create a Scholarship Fund that can receive additional donations in the future. These donations can come from anyone for various reasons, further supporting the guild's activities and members.

ELIGIBILITY

- Applicant must be active member of GSAQG for the (1) year preceding the date of the event.
- Special consideration to "First-time attendee"
- Scholarships for guild workshops and retreats are available each year. Workshop required kit fee provided by instructor could be included in Scholarship amount.
- Guild Workshops offered as 2 sessions (Friday/Saturday) would qualify for two scholarships, to help two members.
- One scholarship per member in a calendar year.
- Scholarship recipients are ineligible to reapply for:
 - 3 years for Winter or Summer Retreat
 - 2 years for Mini-Retreats
 - 2 years for Guild Speakers' workshops

Paper copy of Applications available by chair at onset of enrollment.

Applications must be submitted to the individual retreat chair, or guild program chair, who will present to the guild board for final approval. Each chair should have committee of 2-3 to help evaluate applications.

Applications should be submitted at beginning of enrollment for each event. Awards can then be announced early enough to allow recipients and chair to plan accordingly.
